

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, many of our women in the nursing profession have gone to battle zones all over the world and their absence has added to the nursing burden of those left at home, and

WHEREAS, to meet this critical need, Congress has enacted the Bolton Act, providing for the recruitment, free training and maintenance, with a nominal salary, of qualified women to fill the depleted ranks of nurses, and

WHEREAS, a nation-wide campaign to recruit women for the U. S. Cadet Nurse Corps will be held from July 17 to August 17 and the drug stores will serve as clearing houses for information concerning the Cadet Nurse Corps,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the month of

July 17 - August 17, 1944,

as

U. S. CADET NURSE MONTH

and urge the people of the state, and more particularly the young women, to give their fullest cooperation in the campaign to meet this most critical war need.
