P R O C L A M A T I O N

W H E R E A S , there still exists in our country today an extreme shortage of pulpwood from which pulp, paper and other vital war materials are being manufactured, and

W H E R E A S , the Pulpwood Consuming Industries and the daily newspapers are now behind a program endorsed by the War Production Board, the Office of Price Administrator, the Department of Agriculture, the War Manpower Commission, Office of Defense Transportation, and the Federal Government, to have the newspapers of the nation handle this drive, and

W H E R E A S , the forest products industry is one of the largest in our State and the pulpwood shortage again threatens production curtailment of these industries,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, appeal to all woodlot farmers and producers of Minnesota to lend all support to this drive to continue to cut pulpwood, as they did last season, and to keep the vital war materials moving and to continue the prosperity of our State.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this 29th day of August, 1944.
