NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim

April 6, 1945

as

ARMY DAY

in Minnesota, and call upon all citizens of the State to honor the Army on this day with a display of the flag and by participating in any civilian tributes or ceremonies which may be held.
