PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, State health regulations require the local health officer in each city and village to make a thorough sanitary inspection of municipalities during the month of May, and

WHEREAS, the removal and disposal of all accumulations of refuse, rubbish, and waste paper and materials is most desirable in order that we may have cleaner, healthier, and more sanitary conditions in which to live, work, and play, and

WHEREAS, it is apparent that a concentrated state-wide "clean-up" campaign will result in the collection of a large amount of salvage which is adaptable for use in the successful prosecution of the war,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period from

May 7, 1945

thru

May 13, 1945

as

CLEAN-UP WEEK

in Minnesota, and I strongly urge local officials, the press, civic organizations, and the citizens of this State to observe this week by aiding in the conducting of a "clean-up" program which will help to eliminate unsanitary conditions and to accumulate needed salvage materials that can be utilized in the war effort.
