PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the sustaining love, devotion, and sacrifice of "Mother" shines as a brilliant beacon through the haze of battle, and strengthens our faith in those rights and liberties which have been ours from birth and for which we fight in order that they may be preserved for our children and the children of the future, and

WHEREAS, by Act of Congress, the display of the American Flag is directed on all government buildings on the second Sunday of May in observance of Mother's Day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim

Sunday, May 15, 1945

MOTHER'S DAY

in Minnesota, and memorialize this day for appropriate ceremonies and expressions of affection to our Mothers who are living, and thoughts of reverence for those who have departed this life, and I further urge all the people of Minnesota to assist the American War Mothers in the sale of their "Mother's Day Carnations".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul, this 15th day of April, 1945.
