PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, never before in the history of our nation has the business of farming been of such vital importance as it is today, and

WHEREAS, the men and women in our fighting forces, civilians on the home front, and the people of many foreign countries are dependent upon the food produced on our farms for the very sustenance of life, and

WHEREAS, the conservation of man power on our farms is absolutely necessary as a war measure, and

WHEREAS, fatal and disabling accidents annually take a large toll of farm workers, and,

WHEREAS, it is desirable and essential that all possible safety measures and precautions be taken to prevent the occurrence of accidents on farms,

NOW THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of

July 22 - July 26, 1946

as

MINNESOTA FARM SAFETY WEEK

and I strongly urge that all farmers of the state observe this period in every suitable and practicable way that will assist in emphasising the imperative need for keeping accidents on Minnesota farms at a minimum.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul, this 10th day of July, 1946.
