A Declaration of Brotherhood


Belief in the dignity and mutual obligations of men is a fundamental belief of our democracy. We have confirmed that belief in united effort and great sacrifice which have brought victory against forces seeking to exploit racial and religious prejudices and thus destroy the essential freedoms of mankind.

Today, as we stand on the threshold of a new world of peace, we are determined that the teamwork which the dangers of war necessitated shall become the motivating force of our common effort to build strong our nation and to seek for all our people equality of opportunity, protection of civil rights, and respect for the individual without distinctions of race, creed, national origin, or economic status.

And we are resolved to join with men of goodwill everywhere in recognition of our profound duties and responsibilities in the family of nations.

Moreover, in proclaiming the week of February 17 to 24, 1946, as Brotherhood Week in Minnesota, I urge all the people of the state to join with the National Conference of Christians and Jews in observance of this week, and to dedicate themselves earnestly and sincerely to the task of implementing the ideals of tolerance and understanding among all the people.
