
A Proclamation of Minnesota Aviation Week

Resuscitation of our great aviation resources, military and civilian, to insure the full utilization and development of the knowledge and skills gained during the war and to channel these facilities and this knowledge into beneficial and useful purposes is of major importance in our postwar economy, in both state and nation.


Recognizing that Minnesota is strategically located in a pivotal geographic position on national and international air routes, and foreseeing the large place that aviation is certain to have in the postwar period, the State Legislature has provided the machinery and tools for continuing and progressive development within the state. The Twin Cities of Minnesota are destined to become one of the great air centers of the aviation empire, and they, together with other municipalities of the state, have taken progressive steps to fit themselves into the pattern of a great statewide program.

Therefore, it seems particularly fitting at this time to proclaim the week of March 12 through March 18, 1946, as Minnesota Aviation Week, to mark the Second Annual Northwest Air Show and to direct and stimulate the attention of Minnesota citizens and our enduring Army and Navy Air Forces veterans to the importance of and the opportunity in the full development of aviation's products and services for the State of Minnesota.


