



ORDINANCE NO. 172

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN ABUTTING TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON DO ORDAIN:

NOW WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1843 et seq of Mason's Minnesota Statutes for 1927, being Section 413.14 of the Minnesota Statutes for 1941, all the owners of the property hereinafter described, have petitioned the City Council of the City of Worthington to have such property annexed to said City;

AND WHEREAS, it is desired that said territory become a part of said City of Worthington, the same as if it had been originally a part thereof;

NOW THEREFORE, The following described territory is hereby declared to be a part of the City of Worthington, to-wit:

The East sixty (60) acres of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) and of Government Lot Four (4), all in Section twenty seven (27), Township One hundred two (102) North, Range Forty (40) West of the 5th P.M., County of Nobles and State of Minnesota.
