
A Proclamation of Temperance Sunday

Encouragement of temperance and sobriety is recognized by all our citizens as a civic obligation. Problems and conditions in the postwar period, both for the individual and the community at large, have become so complex and searching that the need of temperate living has increased in importance.

Churches, schools, and civic agencies concerned with the social welfare of our people have a special duty to encourage a sober and balanced life for all and to help the younger generations establish and strengthen their attitudes toward clean living.

In designating Sunday, May 19, as Minnesota Temperance Sunday I urge a public recognition of temperance as a constructive factor in public well-being and invite the appropriate agencies of the state and community to take leadership in focusing the interest and thought of our citizens upon this desirable objective.
