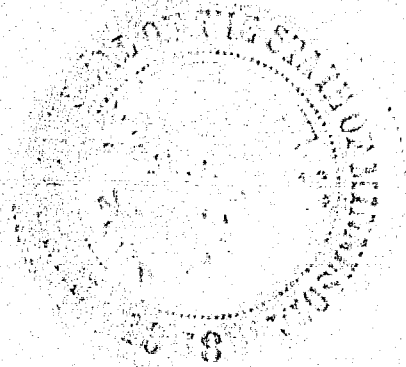
To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

Whereas, C. A. Wickstrom, of Route 3, Anoka, Minnesota, and Carroll Broadbent, of Wyoming, Minnesota, the duly appointed supervisors of the Anoka County Soil Conservation District, acting pursuant to the Minnesota Soil Conservation Districts Law, Laws of Minnesota for 1937, Chapter 441, approved April 26, 1937, and Laws of Minnesota 1943, Chapter 274, approved April 2, 1943, have filed in this office an application subscribed and sworn to by each of them before an officer authorized by law to take and certify oaths, setting forth: (1) That a petition for the creation of the district was filed with the State Soil Conservation Committee, pursuant to the provisions of the State Soil Conservation Districts Law, and the proceedings specified in said Act were taken pursuant to such petition, that said application was filed in order to complete the organization of the district as a governmental subdivision and public body, corporate and politic and that the State Committee has appointed them as supervisors; (2) The name and official residence of the district supervisors, together with a certified copy of the appointments evidencing their right to office; (3) Their term of office; (4) The name which is proposed for the district; and (5) The location and principal office of the supervisors of the District; and

Whereas, a statement by the State Conservation Committee accompanying the above-mentioned application, has been filed in this office, setting forth that a petition for the creation of the Anoka County Soil Conservation District was filed with the State Soil Conservation Committee; that, after due notice, a hearing was held, and the committee duly determined that there is need, in the interest of public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory, and that the Committee defined the boundaries thereof; that then, after due notice, a referendum was held on the question of the creation of said district, and the results of said referendum showed a majority of the votes cast to be in favor of the creation of said district; and that thereafter the Committee duly determined that the operation of the proposed district is administratively practicable and feasible. Said referendum also set forth the boundaries of the district as defined by the State Committee.

Now, Therefore, I, Mike Holm, Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, do hereby find, after examination of the application and statement referred to above, that the name proposed for said district is not identical with that of any other soil conservation district of the state or so nearly similar as to lead to confusion or uncertainty; and

I, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, do therefore, hereby certify that the Anoka County Soil Conservation District has been duly organized and constitutes a governmental subdivision of this State and a public body, corporate and politic, vested with all of the powers conferred upon such districts by law.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

Be it known that on the 17th day of December, 1945, a petition for the organization of the Anoka County Soil Conservation District, signed by more than 25 land occupiers was duly filed in the Office of the State Soil Conservation Committee:

That on the 10th day of January at Anoka and on the 11th day of January at Centerville, public hearings were held after due notice of the said hearings had been given as required by law;

That on the 15th day of April, 1946, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of the creation of the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the said defined boundaries on the 7th day of May, 1946;

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district;

That thereafter on the 17th day of May, 1946, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that the operation of the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said district were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

All of the County of Anoka.

There shall be exempted from the area bounded by the above described boundaries all lands used exclusively for religious, school and burial purposes; all parts and parcels of lands in cities, towns and villages, which lands are used principally for residential purposes or business purposes other than farming; and all lands in rural or urban areas of six acres or less.



ORDINANCE NO. 176

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX CERTAIN CONTIGUOUS TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON DO ORDAIN:

NOW WHEREAS, the territory hereinafter described is now owned by the City of Worthington; and whereas, said territory is situated outside of, but contiguous to, and abutting on the corporate limits of said City:

AND WHEREAS, it is desired that said territory become a part of said City of Worthington, the same as if it had been originally a part thereof:

NOW THEREFORE, the following described territory is hereby declared to be a part of the City of Worthington, to-wit:

That part of the Southwest Quarter ($SW\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 27, Township 102, Range 40 described as commencing 1243 feet North of the Southwest corner of said Section 27, as the place of beginning, the same being a point at the water's edge of Lake Okabena; thence South 476.7 feet to a point 766.3 feet from said Southwest corner of said Section 27; thence East 1590.2 feet; thence North to the water's edge of Lake Okabena; thence in a southerly, westerly and northerly direction along said water's edge to the place of beginning, containing 11.83 acres, more or less, and

That part of the East Half ($E\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southeast Quarter ($SE\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 28, Township 102, Range 40 described as commencing 1243 feet North of the Southeast corner of said Section 28 as the place of beginning, the same being a point at the water's edge of Lake Okabena; thence South 300 feet to the Northeast corner of a 28.72 acre tract deeded to Caroline E. Peters and Arthur Peters; thence West 835.4 feet to the Southeast corner of a 6.4 acre tract deeded to Caroline E. Peters and Arthur Peters; thence North 1656.5 feet to the Northeast corner of a 12 acre tract deeded to Millard Joul; thence East 609.7 feet to the westerly edge of the road, as now constructed; thence in a southerly direction along the westerly side of said road to the water's edge; thence along the water's edge in a southerly and easterly direction to the place of beginning, containing 30.88 acres, more or less, and

That part of the Northeast Quarter ($NE\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 28, Township 102, Range 40 described as follows: Commencing at a point on the quarter section line 1093.7 feet East of the Southwest corner of the East Half ($E\frac{1}{2}$) of the said Northeast Quarter of said Section 28 as the place of beginning; thence running West 609.7 feet; thence North at right angles a distance of 900 feet; thence East and parallel with the said quarter section line a distance of 704 feet to the Westerly line of the public road as now constructed; thence in a Southwesterly direction along the Westerly line of said public road a distance of 971 feet to the place of beginning, containing 12.4 acres, more or less, and
