Dear Senator Betzold,

The Minnesota Department of Human Rights (MDHR) submits its semi-annual report to the Legislature summarizing the results of its investigation and resolution of human rights complaints. Documents detailing the Department's activities during the period of January 1, 2003 to June 30, 2003 are attached. Highlights of complaint activity are as follows:

- The number of new charges filed decreased 17% from the previous six-month period. This resulted in a net 6% increase from the previous fiscal year.
- MDHR closed 829 cases.
- On June 30th only 8 (less than 1%) of the 829 cases were older than 12 months.
- The average caseload per enforcement officer remained at 25.
- The average time from filing a charge to issuing a determination of no probable cause was 343 days; the average time from filing a charge to issuing a determination of probable cause was 369 days.
- 87% of dismissals were accomplished within six months of the charge-filed date.

Highlights of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) are as follows:

- 98 cases pending determination were referred to ADR.
- Mediations were conducted for 21 cases, resulting in 14 settlements.
- 28 undecided cases were resolved through negotiated predetermination settlements or withdrawal by the charging party.
- MDHR recovered over \$1.6 Million for aggrieved charging parties.

Please note that MDHR continued a high level of performance despite the loss of enforcement personnel due to mandatory budget reductions.

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DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RIGHTS ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR) PROGRAM

Report Period: January 1, 2003—June 30, 2003

ADR Program case activity during the report period:

Cases **referred** to ADR Program: 98 (This is 14% of the *number* of charges filed during period.)

Cases are typically sent directly to ADR after the answer and rebuttal are received and the case has been screened for merit, which generally occurs between 3 and 6 months from the filing date; however, if the parties are interested, cases under investigation also may be referred to mediation.

Cases **returned** (process completed) by ADR Program: 73 (avg. time at ADR: 34.5 days)

Outcomes:

Mediation opportunity **declined**: 52 cases (avg. **time at ADR**: 28 days)
Mediation held; **settlement/withdrawal**: 14 cases (avg. **time at ADR**: 69 days)
Mediation held; **no agreement**: 7 cases (avg. **time at ADR**: 86 days)

Mediated; awaiting withdrawal: 1 cases
Mediation in progress: 2 cases
