

Dear Chairman Fink, and Fellow Commissioners:

The Annual Report of the Inspector of Mines for the year 2002 is herewith submitted.

While this has been a difficult year in the mining industry in Northern Minnesota, with the continuing uncertainties in the mining industry and the potential for further reductions in operating mines. It has also been a year which shows what can be accomplished if people work together in making the industry safer.

The total employment for the year was 4,036 and these people worked a total of 7,970,455.7 manhours.

There were 345,649 tons of ore shipped and 38,742,859 tons of taconite pellets shipped from these mines. There were 61,422,099 tons of stripping and waste removed from these mines.

Inspections and visits for 2002 were as follows: Approximately 501 inspections*, visits and investigations were made to the operating and non-operating mines. There were no fatalities and 60 lost time or serious accidents reported.

Acknowledgement and appreciation is extended to both Labor and Management for their continued interest, efforts and cooperation in the field of safety and health throughout the mines and plants in St. Louis County.

Excerpts from the Law On

INSPECTOR OF MINES

CHAPTER 180

MINNESOTA STATUTES SECTION 180.10

REMOVAL OF FENCE: GUARD

Any worker, employee, or other person who shall open, remove, or disturb any fence, guard, barrier, sign, or rail and not close or replace or have the same closed or replaced again around or in front of any shaft, pit, chute, excavation, cave, or land liable to cave, injure, or destroy, whereby accident, injury, or damage results, either to the mine or those at work therein, or to any other person, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. A worker, employee, or other person who, in regard to any fence, guard, barrier, sign, or rail, does any of the acts prohibited by section 609.52, commits theft of the fence, guard, barrier, sign, or rail may be sentenced as provided in section 609.52.

AUBURN MINERALS - No Accidents Reported for 2002

ISPAT- INLAND MINING COMPANY

Roger Shoen, Mechanic, Date of Accident-January 29, 2002. Injured strained his upper back while pulling a pin out from a loader bucket. Days Lost-4.

Jim Kottke, Janitor, Date of Accident-March 14, 2002. Injured suffered a hernia while dumping a mop hucket. The hernia was repaired surgically. Days Lost-26.

Dan Arnberg, Primary Crusher Attendant, Date of Accident-May 23, 2002. Injured suffered a low back strain when a large rock fell out of the backhoe causing the machine tracks, which were slightly elevated, to drop suddenly to the ground. Days Lost- 61.

Leonard Baynton, Production Truck Driver, Date of Accident-June 27, 2002. Injured strained his lower back while pulling on a tow cable. Days Lost- 10.

EVTAC MINING COMPANY

MINE

Drills, Date of Accident-February 5, 2002. Injured was moving 39 drill to a new pattern. Employee slipped and fell to the ground causing two fractures in the left ankle and leg. Days Lost-90.

Electrical Technician, Date of Accident-October 10, 2002. Injured moved a pipe, approximately 20' long by 4" in diameter out of a roadway. This resulted in a hernia. Days Lost- 18.

Area Leader, Date of Accident-November 16, 2002. While boarding the step on the #9024 shovel, injured felt a pain in his groin. This resulted in a hernia. Days Lost- 18.

PLANT

Electrical Technician, Date of Accident- February 11, 2002. Injured was walking up a stairway when he stepped off the inside landing to the outside roof onto a broken wood pallet (approximately a 1 foot drop to the roof level). Resulted in a severely sprained right ankle. Days Lost- 2.

OMT Relief, Date of Accident-February 25, 2002. While unplugging a dust collector, injured opened the rear door of the collector. The employee felt pain in the lower right back and suffered a strained back. Days Lost-2.

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident-February 27, 2002. Injured was installing belt rollers, while lifting and pulling rollers into place he felt a tearing sensation and a pop on the left side of his rib cage. His footing was uneven due to spillage from the belt. The employee was diagnosed as having a torn muscle and fractured rib. Days Lost 23.

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident-February 25, 2002. Injured stepped on a sheet of plywood placed over grating for access to troughing roller tube fittings. He stepped on the front edge of the plywood, his foot rolled outward, stressing knee. Resulted in a medial meniscus tear. Days Lost-70.

Maintenance Mechanic, Kevin Miller, Date of Accident-April 12, 2002. Injured was operating a forklift. While backing up he grabbed the rear post with his hand and then backed the forklift into an object. Finger amputation was the result. Days Lost- 26.

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident- April 19, 2002. Injured was kneeling on floor grating to remove magnets covering holes in a slurry distribution box. While reaching under box for magnets felt sharp pain in knee from edge of cross bars on the grating. Diagnosed as bursitis of the knee. Days Lost- 30.

Sr. OMT, Plant Ops, Date of Accident- August 4, 2002. Injured was changing into work clothes for the shift. Injured put on his work boots, then he put his right foot on bench to tie the laces. He then felt a pain in his back. This resulted in a back strain. Days Lost-2.

Laborer, Plant Operations, Date of Accident-May 2, 2002. Injured was shoveling rock onto conveyor when he felt something pop in back. Resulted in disc protrusion and tear, Days Lost-26.

OMT, Plant Operations, Date of Accident-July 31, 2002. Injured was cleaning waste rod scrap in front of #4 rod mill. Employee picked up 2 pieces of rod when he felt pain in upper thigh area, later diagnosed as a hernia. Days Lost- 21.

Maintenance Mechanic, Plant, Date of Accident-February 20, 2002. Injured was replacing bolts inside the #1 rod mill. While crawling through trommel screen and walking over uneven surface, felt strain in right knee and Achilles tendon. Later diagnosed as a cyst requiring surgery. Days Lost-31.

OMT, Plant Operation, Date of Accident-September 21, 2002. Injured was going to plug a hydraulic pump into a welding outlet located between Bypass pumps A and B. He stepped over a water line hanging about a foot above the floor. The trailing foot caught on a hose causing the employee to lose balance and fall to floor. Resulted in fractured right thumb and bruised right knee. Days Lost-72.

Electric Technician, Plant, Date of Accident-September 27, 2002. Injured was walking to jobsite. As employee was going to pass through a doorway, a splash of water and mud came through the doorway. Employee turned around, stepped over a hose and at that time someone yanked the hose and raised it off the noor. Employee tripped over that hose and fell to the floor. This resulted in a contusion, sprain, abrasion of the left knee and a contusion and sprain of the left shoulder. Days Lost-28.

HIBBING TACONITE COMPANY

Steve McNamara, Mechanic, Date of Accident - January 29, 2002. Injured was in the process of leaving the plant site after a 4 hour overtime shift. While walking to the guard gate, injured stepped up on the edge of the sidewalk alongside the guard shack. When he put his weight on the foot on the edge of the walkway, his foot slipped off the edge and he fell, striking his knee on the concrete walk. This resulted in bruised knee. Days Lost - 59

Todd Mortenson, Date of Accident - March 7, 2002, Injured was walking on the roof of the men's hourly dry to access a heater. In order to get to the heater injured had to squat to pass under a beam above the walkway. While moving under the beam injured fell and caught the little and middle finger of his right hand in the grating on the walkway. This resulted in a fracture to his right hand. Days Lost - 28

Steve Tervo, Maintenance Mechnnic Plant, Date of Accident - May 13, 2002, Injured and his partner were in the process of changing return rollers on the P4 conveyor. In order to change return idlers on this conveyor it is necessary for one person to use a man lift to access the side without a walkway. In this case injured was in the man lift properly tied off and his partner was on the interior walkway. While injured was assisting in passing the L.O. roller to his partner, the roller slipped and pinched his finger between the roller and the man lift handrail. This resulted in crushing injuries to his finger. Days Lost - 4

Tim Kuznia, Date of Accident - May 21, 2002, Injured was walking up a set of steps over the dribble belt while carrying a full sample pail of pellets. While climbing the two steps injured felt his knee give out. This resulted in a meniscal tear in the knee. Days Lost - 24

Antoinette Vicari, Date of Accident-May 21, 2002, Injured was walking down a stairway from the mill feed deck to the mill operating floor at line #1. She turned to walk toward line #6 and got her left foot caught in or on the end of a flexible 3" diameter metal hose. She fell hard, striking her left elbow on the concrete noor. This resulted in a fractured elbow. Days Lost-36

Don Frider, Maintenance Mechanic. Date of Accident-July 23, 2002. Injured was changing a flexible expansion joint cover on duct work for the #3 Pelletizing furnace. A large chunk of concentrate dust buildup, hidden behind the joint, fell and struck his right knee, hyper extending his right ankle. Days Lost-3

Tom McLaughlin, Service truck driver, Date of Accident- August 11, 2002. Injured was loading 34 pound shovel adapter wear caps by hand onto the back of a flatbed truck. Low back pain/strain. Days Lost-5.

Jim Bunn, Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident-July 31, 2002. Injured was setting up an expansion joint replacement project for the Line 3 furnace in the pellet plant. He struck his head on a low beam, injuring his neck. Days Lost-86 to date.

Allen Bluemke, Welder, Date of Accident-October 1, 2002. Injured attempted to manually move a portable stairway on the launder floor. The stair jammed between the sloped floor and an overhead pipe. As he pulled to free it, he lost his grip and fell backwards, striking his back on a valve hand wheel. Rib contusion. Days Lost- 3.

Jim Kubat, Welder, Date of Accident-June 12, 2002. Injured was lying on a floor creeper in the shop welding a lug on a 240 ton truck box. When finished, he put his left hand on the floor to push himself up. His left hand was on top of a "Huck" bolt, which caused his hand to slip, and his left elbow struck the floor. Later, he was diagnosed with a rotator cuff tear of the left shoulder requiring surgical repair. Days Lost- 29 to date.

Charlotte Nelson, Electrician, Date of Accident - January 9, 2002, Injured was calibrating a transmitter on the 33 secondary cyclone header. Her right foot was on the mill addition water pipe and she was preparing to step up to the top of the pipe with her left foot. While pushing off, her leg gave way and twisted to the left. This resulted in a twisted left knee. Days Lost - 105

John Martire, Maintenance Mechanic, Plant, Date of Accident - January 14, 2002, Injured was removing the wear plate from a pump in the component repair area. When injured lifted the old plate he felt a sharp pain in his back. This resulted in a lower back strain. Days Lost - 105

Wayne Impila, Auto Mechanic, Date of Accident - February 21, 2002, Injured was driving the fuel truck in the tailings pond to fuel remote equipment. While driving the truck he struck a washout in the surface and injured was jarred in the cab and struck his head on the cab roof. This resulted in a Cervical neck strain. Days Lost - 3

Jeremy Wilson, Tractor Operator, Date of Accident - February 26, 2002, Injured was climbing up on the steel tracks of a crawler cat. While grabbing the handle to assist in climbing, his hand slipped off and injured fell to the ground landing on his right side, arm and shoulder. This resulted in a shoulder strain. Days Lost - 52

Steve Miller, Maintenance Mechanic Plant, Date of Accident - March 15, 2002, Injured was lifling a steel pipe section into a dumpster for disposal. The pipe section weighed approximately 70 pounds. This resulted in a back strain. Days Lost - 9

John Gangl, Electrician, Date of Accident - March 28, 2002, Injured was using a pry bar to move some old DC drive units. While pulling on the pry bar he felt pain in his right arm. This resulted in a right bicep strain. Days Lost - 101

Patrick H. Leustek, Shovel Operator, Date of Accident - April 2, 2002, Injured was traveling in the shovel from one location to another due to digging requirements. While moving, the cab, cab base and cab guard broke loose as a unit from the superstructure of the shovel and fell. The cab unit ended with the base supported on the left track and the cab guard on the ground. The injured was secured by the seat belt. He exited the cab and went to a nearby shovel that was not in operation during this time, and reported the accident. This resulted in 4 broken ribs, bruised lung, facial lacerations and sore right elbow. Days Lost - 214

William Stukey, Auto Mechanic, Date of Accident - April 16, 2002, Injured was working on a production truck. When he pushed hard on a wrench to turn a bolt, he felt a twinge in his shoulder. This resulted in a left shoulder strain. Days Lost - 4

Glen Milani, Tire Man, Date of Accident - April 25, 2002, Injured was walking through the steam bay in the truck shop when he stepped on a small rock. This caused his foot to slip out from under him which caused him to fall against a concrete wall. This resulted in a right shoulder strain. Days Lost - 3

Joe Ferris, Maintenance Mechanic Plant, Date of Accident - May 7, 2002, Injured was holding a scraper in place for a welder to attach it. While the welder was welding, a hot piece of slag dropped into his coveralls. This resulted in a burn to the groin area. Days Lost - 2

Joe Jerulle, Furnace Attendant, Date of Accident - May 28, 2002, Injured was lifting the shotgun off of a hoist to carry it back to the burner floor from the location it was used in to knock slag off the interior of the furnace. When he lifted the shotgun he felt a pain in his left shoulder. This resulted in a left shoulder strain. Days Lost - 25

Arnie Makela, Tractor Operator, Date of Accident - August 29, 2002, Injured was moving garbage with a two wheel cart in the truck shop. While pushing the cart over some welding cables on the floor, the cable looped around his foot and he tripped, falling to the cement floor. This resulted in a left knee fracture. Days Lost - 139

Doug Whitney, Maintenance Mechanic General, Date of Accident - November 13, 2002, Injured was walking outside of the truck shop when he slipped on some ice and fell. This resulted in a back strain. Days Lost - 33 in 2002 remains off in 2003

Tom Lomsak, Maintenance Mechanic General, Date of Accident - December 12, 2002, Injured was pulling on a swing motor which weighed 75 pounds when he felt a pain in his back. This resulted in a back strain. Days Lost - 32 total in 2002 and 2003.

Bill Rabold, Quality Control Lab Tech, Date of Accident - February 14, 2002, Injured was performing tumble tests to check on pellet quality. After completing one test he was pulling the catch pan out of the tumble drum in preparation for emptying the pan. While turning he felt a pop in his knee. This resulted in damage to the right knee. Days Lost - 20

Gary Shoen, Pelletizer Operations, Date of Accident - February 22, 2002, Injured was in the process of setting up scaffolding when he felt a pain in his back, which continued to worsen. This resulted in a strained back. Days Lost 213

Jeff Dehart, Pelletizer Operations, Date of Accident - August 2, 2002, Injured was pounding on a feed gate with a sledge hammer to free a blockage, when he felt a pain in his back. This resulted in a strained back. Days Lost - 3

Richard Moen, Plant Maintenance, Date of Accident - August 28, 2002, Injured was in the process of unloading a bearing from a truck in the storage yard, by sliding it from the truck bed, when he felt a pain in his lower back. This resulted in a strained back. Days Lost - 8

USX CORPORATION, MINNTAC MINE

Paul Grahek, Plant Laborer, Date of Accident - January 21, 2002, Injured and the vacuum truck operator were starting the clean up of a classifier area in preparation for maintenance, using the Vacuum Max Truck to suction the material up. Injured was moving the end of the vacuum hose using a cloth sling. The sling was initially attached 2 to 3 feet from the end of the open end of the hose. While moving the hose the sling slipped across the open end of the hose, blocking the end. Injured reached to re-position the sling and the suction pulled his arm into the suction hose. This resulted in trauma to the left arm from the elbow to the finger tips. Days Lost - 38.

Michael Berg, Crusher Attendant, Date of Accident - March 1, 2002 Injured had cleared an obstruction from the "Op-con" on the #006-01 tripper car, using a 10 foot long "J" hook from the top platform of the tripper car. After clearing the blockage injured pulled the "J" hook as far out of the access hatch as possible and pivoted to finish the removal of the hook. While pivoting injured's right foot slipped off of the work platform and injured started to fall. Injured reached out with his right hand and grabbed either the handrail or the ladder to prevent his falling off of the tripper car. The sudden strain on injured's shoulder resulted in a fracture to the right shoulder. Days Lost - 68.

Raymond Hamling, Jr., Millwright, Date of Accident - March 13, 2002, Injured was operating a 3 ton forklift. He positioned the forklift facing east across the west rail of the Gantry crane to lift a crusher wear ring. The Gantry crane, which travels north-south, was 36" north of the forklift, as determined by post accident field investigation. Another employee was standing 25 feet ENE of the forklift, operating the gantry crane. The crane operator, facing away from the forklift, hoisted a head nut and started moving the crane south. He heard a yell and turned to see the forklift operator signaling that he was in distress. The crane operator ran to the forklift and found that the forklift operator's left foot was pinched between the SW crane bumper and the north side of the forklift, just below the top footrest. This resulted in a fractured left heel and other injuries to the ankle and left foot area. Days Lost - 191.

Keith Colcleugh, Team Leader, Drills, Date of Accident - March 15, 2002, Injured was returning to the dry after starting the loaders that were parked outside. While injured was climbing over a snowbank with his right foot at the bottom of the bank, his left foot slipped on snow covered ice. This resulted in a broken left tibia, just above the ankle. Days Lost - 34.

Kevin Andrick, Ironworker, Date of Accident - April 2, 2002, Injured was reaching to catch a partially filled gallon container of oil being dropped 1-3 feet by a co-worker from a shovel catwalk. The container weighed 3-4 pounds. Injured caught the container, crouched and then felt pain in his lower back. This resulted in a lower back strain. Days Lost - 20.

Ronald Carpenter, Plant Millwright, Date of Accident - May 24, 2002, Injured had lifted an impact wrench from a storage cabinet to the "Plant Cat" and then again from a fork lift basket to the "Plant Cat". The wrench weighs approximately 60 to 70 pounds. When injured placed the wrench over the side of the "Plant Cat" he felt a small "tingle" in his back, but thought nothing was out of the ordinary. Later that day severe pain set in. This resulted in a twisted back. Days Lost - 129.

Gail Haugen, Mine Laborer, Date of Accident - June 12, 2002, Injured and her partners were in the process of pulling shovel cable for the #28 shovel, in preparation to place the cable in the shovel boat. While pulling the cable injured experienced pain between her shoulders. This resulted in upper back pain between the shoulders. Days Lost - 3.

Bronco Herian, Millwright, Date of Accident - August 6, 2002, Injured and his partner were installing a hood on a bucket elevator. While attempting to raise part of the hood to install additional parts, the lifting chain that was attached to the hood came in contact with a water pipe that was in the vicinity. The pipe broke free due to the contact and fell, striking injured and knocking him off of the work platform he was standing on. This action resulted in fractures to the right orbit, lefl and right cheeks, bone chips and a strain/sprain to the right wrist and a sore right shoulder. Days Lost - 3.

R. Dilla, System Repairman, Date of Accident-May 22, 2002. Injured was assigned to service the 020-01-1A Conveyor west tripper brake. He climbed up on the motor disconnect platform and ascended to the motor deck and checked the brake. As he was stepping down, 40" to the motor disconnect platform, he overstepped it, twisted his right knee and striking his leg on the decking. This resulted in a Medial meniscal tear to the right knee. He began losing time on August 13, 2002. Days Lost- 33.

H. Soland Painter, Team Leader, Date of Accident-July 25, 2002. During the process of housekeeping, the injured combined the contents of three garbage bags into one, weighing roughly 35 pounds. Once outside, the injured elevated the garbage bag to the lip of the dumpster using two hands. He then shifted the weight of the garbage to one arm while he opened the lid with the other. While swinging the garbage bag over the lip, the injured heard something pop and felt pain in the shoulder. The injured had surgery to repair a torn rotator cuff on November 4, 2002. Days Lost- 39.

Randall Clasen, Millwright, Date of Accident - August 26, 2002. Injured was assigned to change a bearing on the 110-16 Rod Mill. He was removing the Flinger Ring Guard by hand and experienced a pain in the small of his back and down his right leg. The guard is 6 feet by 8 inches and weighs 56 pounds and is somewhat difficult to remove because of the height, weight and mounting. The injury was pain to lower back and right leg. Days Lost- 11

Richard Jenkins, Mobile Equipment Operator, Date of Accident-August 11, 2002. Injured stated that he was in the process of boarding a dozer and was at the last step when he felt a pain in his right knee. This resulted in a twisted right knee and torn meniscus. Days Lost-23

C. Warner, Auto Mechanic, Date of Accident- July 15, 2002. Injured was in the end stages of a final drive rebuild for a Model 793 240 Ton Caterpillar truck. After lowering the bull gear into position with the overhead crane, the mechanic removed the 4-legged dog chain hooks from the lifting clip D-rings. While holding the chains with one hand, the mechanic shifted his attention to operating the crane remote control. As he positioned to operate the crane remote, the mechanic stood upright, and unknowingly pulled the chains from the center toward his body and the D-ring. As the mechanic began lifting the chains from the bull gear with the crane, one of the hooks caught the D-ring closest to him. The resulting force of the crane caused the lifting clip bolt head to shear. Upon shearing of the bolt, the lifting clip and D-ring were propelled across the shop floor and the chain released, striking the mechanic, breaking his right arm, and coming to rest on top of the crane block. Days Lost-16.
