SUBJECT: Report on Special Revenue Fund Agreements for FY 2005

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 174.02 as modified by the 1993 Legislature, the following report is being submitted to the Governor and the Committee on Finance of the Senate and the Committee on Ways and Means of the House of Representatives for their information.
