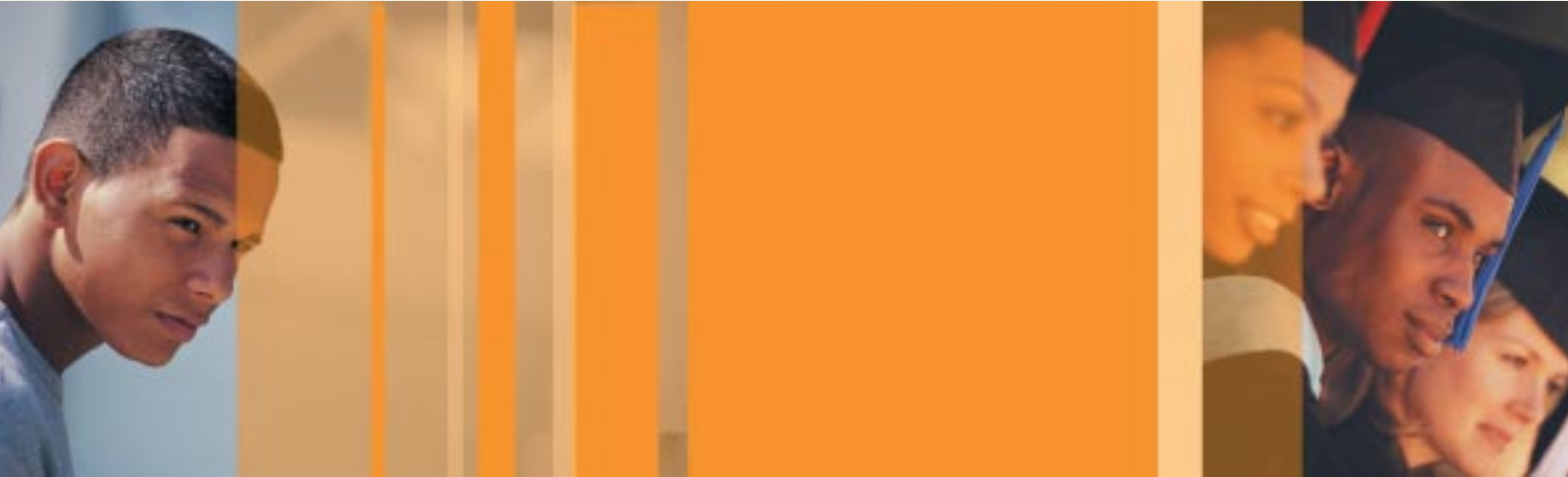

Your Guide to Choosing a College

Eighty-one schools including one that's just right for you.

Minnesota is home to some of the finest post-secondary institutions in the country. From the shores of Lake Bemidji to the rolling hills of southeastern Minnesota to the kinetic streets of downtown Minneapolis, the state’s public and private colleges and universities collectively offer a broad spectrum of educational opportunities and experiences that might surprise you.

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What's in the Guide?

The *Minnesota College Guide* is intended to help you find a college or program that interests you. It includes public and private colleges and universities located in Minnesota that offer two-year associate and four-year bachelor's degrees. For each degree-granting institution, there is a short profile that describes the institution. There is also a program grid to help you locate the institutions that offer the programs that interest you.

What is Not in the Guide?

This guide does not include information about institutions offering only short-term certificates and diplomas or only graduate and professional degrees. Post-secondary institutions serving fewer than 150 students are not included. Two Years or Four?

Two-year colleges

Two-year colleges offer students two distinct options. All community colleges and many other two-year colleges provide students with the first two years of a four-year bachelor's degree in any major. Students choose to start their four-year degree at a two-year college for a variety of reasons including location, cost, atmosphere and uncertainty about their major. These students then transfer their credits to a four-year college or university to complete a bachelor's degree.

Two-year colleges also offer career-specific programs leading directly to employment. Technical and career programs prepare students for careers in fields such as health care, manufacturing technology, law enforcement, computer networking, accounting,

e-commerce and many others. Some technical and career programs are transferable to a four-year degree program.

If you plan to enroll in a two-year career training program and hope to have your education count toward a four-year degree later, it is important to explore your credit transfer options before enrolling. Check with the admissions office at the institution to which you hope to transfer. While many two-year college courses and programs can be applied to a four-year degree, some cannot.

Four-year colleges and universities

Minnesota's four-year colleges and universities generally provide students with a solid foundation for a lifetime of learning, citizenship and work. Hundreds of different majors are offered, leading to careers in teaching, business, health care, engineering, the arts, social services, computer science, communications and many others. Once students earn their four-year bachelor's degrees, many continue on in professional or graduate-level programs to become doctors, lawyers, librarians, therapists, college professors, pharmacists, researchers, orthodontists and other professionals.

Preparing for College

The best way to prepare for college is to challenge yourself while in high school by taking rigorous courses in core subjects. Even if you have completed the high school graduation requirements and the recommended courses for college admission, remember that you will increase your prospects for success if you continue to learn through your senior year. Most four-year colleges and universities require these courses, at a minimum, for admission:

- Four years of English (including composition and literature)
- Three years of mathematics (two years of algebra and one year of geometry or the equivalent)
- Three years of science (including one year each of a biological and a physical science)
- Three years of social studies (including one year of U.S. history and geography)
- Two years of a single world language
- One year of either world culture or fine arts

Some students earn college credit while in high school by participating in special programs such as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, College in the Schools and Post Secondary Enrollment Options. Ask your high school counselor or teachers about opportunities for enrichment.

While many two-year colleges accept all high school graduates and GED holders, individual programs at those schools may be more selective. Today some specific career and technical programs have high expectations and long waiting lists for new students. You will save money and time if you master core subjects in high school.

How to Use This Guide

Choosing a college is a big decision. Use this guide only as a quick reference to identify programs, colleges and universities that may interest you. Then contact the schools directly to request more complete information. Visit the college's Web site, tour the campus, talk to the admissions and financial aid representatives, visit with current students and recent graduates and ask questions.

Buyer Beware

There are several ways to evaluate the quality and value of different programs and institutions. Most private and out-of-state institutions operating in Minnesota are required to be either registered or licensed by the Office of Higher Education. Public colleges and universities need not be licensed or registered. Some occupational training providers must be licensed by other state agencies and organizations as well. (For example, cosmetology and real estate programs must be licensed by the Department of Commerce.)

One way an institution can show that it meets quality standards is to become accredited. Accreditation means that the institution has been approved by a non-government agency that reviews institutions in a region or an occupational area. An institution should tell you whether it is accredited and identify which agency has accredited it. The federal government reviews and recognizes accrediting agencies.

Associate Degrees

Associate degree programs are designed to either prepare individuals for an occupation, or to provide a foundation for the completion of a bachelor's degree. They require the equivalent of two years of full-time study. Some general education courses are included in associate degree programs such as English and mathematics. Programs of study lead to an Associate in Arts (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), or Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.).

Bachelor's Degrees

All baccalaureate or bachelor's degrees require the equivalent of at least four years of full-time study. The degree includes both general courses and advanced course work in a defined area of study, typically called a major. There are hundreds of programs of study that lead to either a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.S.), or discipline-specific bachelor's degrees such as the Bachelor of Music or the Bachelor of Fine Arts.
