Dear Representative Jeff Johnson:

The Minnesota Department of Human Rights (MDHR) submits its semi-annual report to the Legislature summarizing the results of its investigation and resolution of human rights complaints. Documents detailing the Department's activities during the period of January 1, 2006 to June 30, 2006 are attached.

Highlights of complaint activity are as follows:

- The number of new charges filed decreased 28% from the previous sixmonth period.
- MDHR closed 431 cases.
- The average time from filing a charge to issuing a determination of no probable cause was 321 days; the average time from filing a charge to issuing a determination of probable cause was 282 days.
- The Department continues to expedite the review of new charges at a very high rate. Eighty-eight (88%) of dismissals were accomplished within six months of the charge-filed date.
- The average caseload per enforcement officer remains steady at 28.
- On June 30 there were 2 cases in inventory older than 1 year.
- No cases were heard by the Office of Administrative Hearings under M.S. 363A.29, subdivision 2. Hearings 180 days after charge.

Highlights of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) are as follows:

- 204 cases pending determination were referred to ADR.
- Mediations were conducted for 33 cases, resulting in 11 resolutions finalized before July 1 and 6 resolutions pending withdrawal status.
- MDHR recovered approximately \$656,532 for charging parties during this reporting period.

ADR and conciliation settlements during this reporting period resulted in approximately \$656,000 recovered for charging parties, as well as, other nonmonetary remedies to eliminate discrimination by respondents

Report Period: January 1, 2006-June 30, 2006

ADR Program activity:

Number of cases referred to ADR from Enforcement Inventory: 204 (This is 57% of the *number* of charges filed during period.)

Seventy-nine of the cases referred to ADR were *filed* during the January 1, through June 30, 2006 report period. (This is 22% of all charges filed during the period.*)
