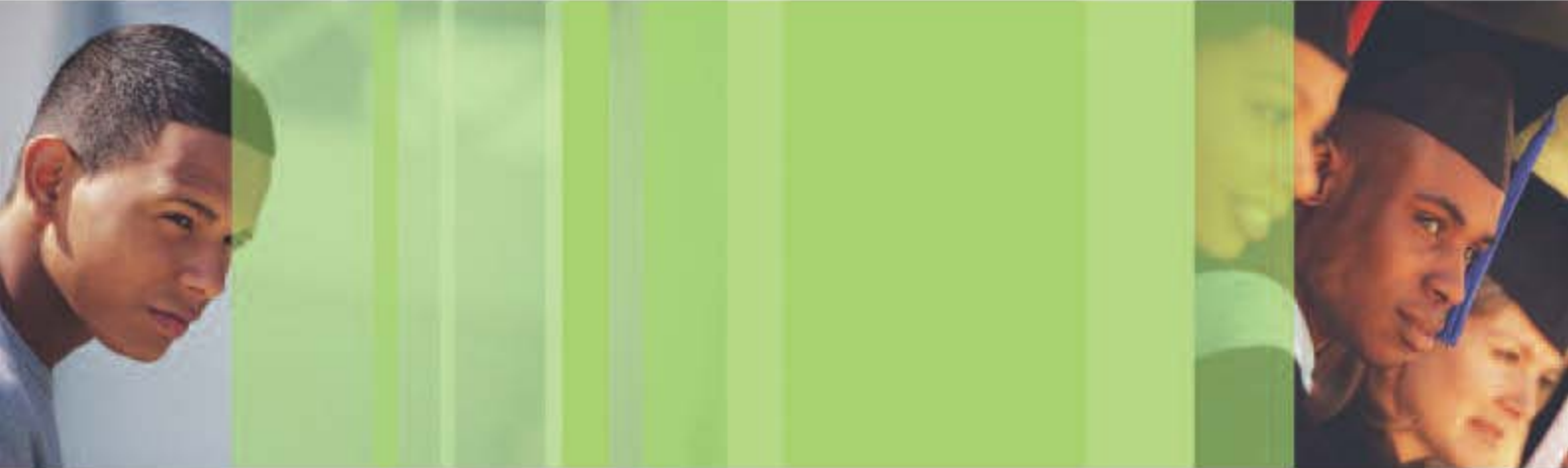

Your Guide to Choosing a College

Find a college that's just right for you.

Minnesota is home to some of the finest post-secondary institutions in the country. From the north woods to the rolling hills of southeastern Minnesota to the excitement of the city, the state's public and private colleges and universities collectively offer a broad spectrum of educational opportunities and experiences that might surprise you.

The *Minnesota College Guide* is published by the Minnesota Office of Higher Education to help you learn more about the many college opportunities in Minnesota. Here you can find out more about the college in your community or explore campuses that are away from home, but still in Minnesota.

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What's in the Guide?

The *Minnesota College Guide* is intended to help you explore your Minnesota college options. The guide includes public and private colleges and universities located in Minnesota that offer two-year associate and four-year bachelor's degrees. In addition to the profiles for each degree-granting institution, there are program grids at the back to help you identify programs that interest you.

How to Use This Guide

Choosing a college is a big decision. It is difficult to know where to begin. Use this guide as a quick reference to learn about your Minnesota options. Be sure to contact the colleges that interest you directly to request more complete information. If you are interested in a particular college, be sure to visit the Web site, tour the campus, talk to the admissions and financial aid representatives, visit with current students and recent graduates and ask questions.

Two Years or Four?

Two-year colleges

Two-year colleges offer students two distinct options.

- Many public two-year colleges and some private career colleges offer students the first two years of a four-year bachelor's degree in any major. Students choose to start at a two-year college and then transfer their credits to a four-year college for a variety of reasons including location, cost, atmosphere or because they are uncertain of their program of study.

- Two-year colleges also offer career-specific programs leading directly to employment. Technical and career programs prepare students for careers in fields such as health care, manufacturing technology, law enforcement, computer networking, accounting, e-commerce and many other fields.

Four-year colleges and universities

Minnesota's four-year colleges and universities provide students with a solid foundation for a lifetime of learning, citizenship and work. Hundreds of different majors are offered, leading to careers in teaching, business, science, health care, engineering, the arts, social services, computer science, communications and many other fields. After students earn their four-year bachelor's degrees, many continue on in professional or graduate-level programs to become doctors, business professionals, lawyers, librarians, therapists, college professors, pharmacists, researchers, orthodontists and other professionals.

Preparing for College

The best way to prepare for college is to challenge yourself while in high school by taking rigorous courses in core subjects. Even if you have completed the high school graduation requirements, you will increase your chances for success in college by taking more advanced mathematics, science, English and social studies courses. Most four-year colleges and universities require the following, at a minimum, for admission:

- Four years of English (including composition and literature)
- Three and one-half years of social studies (including one year each of U.S. history and geography)
- Three years of mathematics (including two years of algebra and one year of geometry)
- Three years of science (including one year each of a biological and a physical science)
- Two years of a single world language
- One year of either world culture or fine arts

Public two-year colleges accept all high school graduates and GED holders. However, some individual programs at those schools are more selective and have high preparation standards and waiting lists to get in. Some students find they must spend a semester or even two just getting ready to enter a two-year career program. That is why your high school preparation is so important. Students who master core subjects while in high school save money and time in college.

Associate Degrees

Associate degree programs are designed to either prepare individuals for an occupation, or to provide a foundation for the completion of a bachelor's degree. They require the equivalent of two years of full-time study. Some general education courses are included in associate degree programs such as English and mathematics. Programs of study lead to an Associate in Arts (A.A.), Associate in Science (A.S.), or Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.).

Bachelor's Degrees

All baccalaureate or bachelor's degrees require the equivalent of at least four years of full-time study. The degree includes both general courses and advanced course work in a defined area of study, typically called a major. There are hundreds of programs of study that lead to either a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.S.), or discipline-specific bachelor's degrees such as the Bachelor of Music or the Bachelor of Fine Arts.



What is Not in the Guide?

This guide does not include information about institutions offering only short-term certificates and diplomas or only graduate and professional degrees. Evaluating Private Institutions

There are several ways to evaluate the quality and value of different programs and institutions. Most private and out-of-state institutions operating in Minnesota are required to be either registered or licensed by the Office of Higher Education. Public colleges and universities need not be licensed or registered. Some occupational training providers must be licensed by other state agencies and organizations as well. (For example, cosmetology programs are licensed by the Minnesota Board of Barber and Cosmetology Examiners.)

One way an institution can demonstrate that it meets basic standards is to become accredited. Accreditation means that the institution has been

approved by a non-government agency that reviews institutions in a region or an occupational area. An institution should tell you whether it is accredited and identify which agency has granted accreditation. The federal government reviews and recognizes about 50 accrediting agencies across the country.

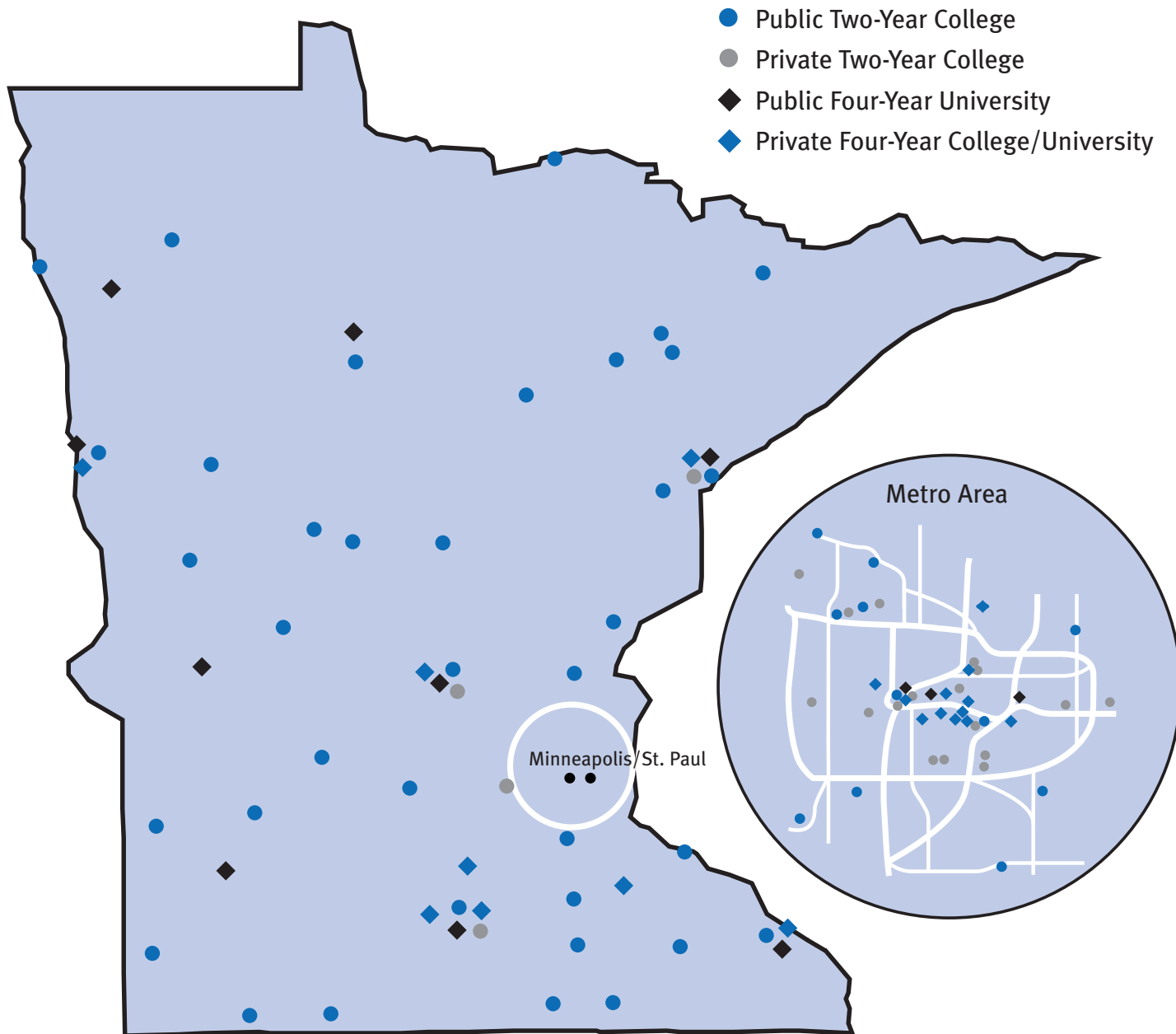

Understand Your Transfer Options

If you are considering enrolling in a two-year college with the possibility of transferring your credits later to a four-year institution, it's essential that you understand in advance how your credits will be received by the four-year institution. While many technical and career programs are transferable to a four-year degree program, some are not. Contact the four-year institution you would like to attend to find out how your credits will be applied to a four-year degree.
