# Northwest Regional Development Commission 2006 Evaluation Report

#### I. Background of the Evaluation

The Regional Development Act of 1969 requires that a self evaluation of each Regional Development Commission be completed every five years. The section of the Act which deals with the evaluation reads as follows:

"In 2001 and every five years thereafter the commission shall review its activities and issue a report assessing its performance in fulfilling the purposes of the regional development act. The report shall address whether the existence of the commission is in the public welfare and interest."

The Regional Development Act states the purpose of Regional Development Commissions is to: "... work with and on behalf of local units of government to develop plans or implement programs to address economic, social, physical, and governmental concerns of each region of the state."

The Northwest Regional Development Commission (NWRDC) has undertaken this evaluation to determine if the Commission is meeting the expectations of the public and if improvements can be made for the future.

#### II. Methodology

The following steps were completed during the evaluation process:

- A review of past evaluations was completed.
- The NWRDC Board of Directors instructed staff to complete a survey of local units of government and those receiving services from the Commission.
- Staff drafted a survey instrument, solicited input on understandability and completed modifications based on input.
   See page 4 for a copy of the survey and associated documents.
- The survey was mailed to county commissioners, county auditors/administrators, mayors, city clerks, township association chairs, NWRDC advisory committee members, and a sample of persons receiving services from each of the programs. A total of 620 surveys were mailed. Each mailing included a stamped return envelope.
- Survey results were tabulated and presented to the NWRDC Board and Commission.
- A final report was drafted and accepted by the NWRDC on December 2, 2006.

#### III. Survey Results

The survey results are tabulated on page 4. The total number of persons responding to each question and quality of service rating is found in or near the box for each response option.

#### Response Rate

- The overall response rate of 41.5% is high enough to assume the results are representative of those surveyed.
- The response rate from local units of government was high enough to reflect a representative sample. 155 Surveys were returned from the 289 units of government(7 counties, 54 cities, 228 townships) in the region. Each type of local government also appears well represented in the returns.
- The response rate for NWRDC/Committee members was high enough to indicate a representative sample. 116 surveys were returned from board members. Each Committees was also well represented. The lowest Committee return rate was 62%.
- All the programs and service types are well enough represented in the responses to assume the survey can be applied to all components of the NWRDC.

#### Quality of Services

- The ranking of 8.7 on a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 being the highest ranking, reflects a very positive assessment by those responding to the survey.
- There were only 3 rankings below 5. The comments related to those rankings were mainly about the need for more information or assistance.
- Cross tabulations of quality of service according to categories of elected officials, committee members, program areas, and types of services showed very little variation.

#### Fulfillment of Purpose

- 90% of those responding agreed with the statement that the NWRDC is working on behalf of local units of government to address concerns of the region.
- Only .4% of those responding felt the NWRDC is not working on behalf of local units of government. 8% were not sure. Comments related to these responses were almost all about a lack of information.

#### Information

- 85% of those responding felt the NWRDC is providing adequate information about it's programs and services.
- 5% (12) felt information was not adequate and 9.6% were not sure. This was associated with low quality and fulfillment ratings. 6 or the 12 not adequate were township responses.

#### Priorities and Comments

- There were a variety of suggestions and comments on the operation of the NWRDC and future priorities. The responses are summarized on page 5. The great majority of the comments were positive or constructive in nature with a small number of negative comments and concerns. There were scattered comments about increased contact with communities and business; and some comments about getting more information out to the public.
- There were no major trends in the comments that appeared to reflect a need for the NWRDC to make large scale shifts in direction. There were a number of helpful suggestions and reaffirmations of the work directions set by the NWRDC and program Committees. A number of comments appeared to be directed toward the importance of maintaining efforts go support growth and development.

#### IV. Conclusions and Recommendations

#### Conclusion

Based on the results of the evaluation process, the Commission can state that:

- 1. The existence of the commission is in the public welfare and interest. This statement is made in consideration of the costs and benefits of the services provided by the NWRDC.
- 2. The NWRDC is fulfilling it's purpose of working on behalf of local units of government to address economic, social, physical, and governmental concerns of each region of the state.
- 3. Local units of government and others receiving services feel the programs and services of the NWRDC are high quality in nature.
- 4. No major shifts in direction or corrective measures are needed to respond to public concerns.

#### Recommendations

The following recommendations are made to address concerns expressed during the evaluation process and to insure the continuation of quality services to the area:

- 1. Staff, Commission, and Committee members should make an extra effort to provide information about the Commission when the opportunity is presented. Providing understandable information to the public and units of government should be an on-going priority, especially to township representatives.
- 2. Individual programs should review the results of the evaluation to incorporate public perceptions and priorities.
- 3. Appreciation should be expressed to commission members, committee members, staff, and our many partners for their efforts providing service to the public.
