2006 Report on Grant Management:

Amount of grants:

Governor Pawlenty's Executive Order 05-03 Regarding Grant Management requires an annual report to the Governor to summarize and report the results of this initiative. This report is to include the "number, total amount, and nature of grants managed by the state".

This year's report is the second time this information has been collected and reported.

Data was pulled from MAPS information by Department of Finance staff to capture all grant payments made during the period of July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006 using the MAPS Acceptance date. The MAPS Acceptance date is the date that MAPS considers the document completely processed. This information is a twelve month "slice" of the grants business and not only includes payments made from state fiscal year 2006 funding but also payments made from certified encumbrances from previous state fiscal years. The 5 group object codes in MAPS are categorized as Local Assistance and all 5 group payments were included in the data. Interagency grants (5F) may increase the total amount of grant dollars when funds are granted between agencies and then granted out by the receiving agency.

Grant payments were made by forty-eight state entities. Seventeen entities are granting agencies that were requested to provide information for this report because their granting activities represent the focus of the Drive To Excellence Project. Thirty-one agencies whose data is not included in the analysis are comprised of entities that may have other legal authority such as the University, Historical Society and small boards and commissions not within the focus of the Drive To Excellence Project. See Appendix 1.

In addition, twelve of the seventeen granting agencies also had 5 group object code payments for programs that are not within the scope of the Drive To Excellence Grants Project. Examples include school district aid payments, entitlement programs, reimbursement programs, subsidies and loans. The seventeen granting agencies were asked to identify programs not within the scope of the Drive To Excellence Grants Project and these programs were excluded from further analysis. See Appendix 2.

The excluded programs were subtracted from an agency's 5 group object code payments so that the value of the grants included in the Drive To Excellence Grants Project could be determined. The 2006 total of \$1,002,967,899.54 is less than the 2005 total that was \$1,125,952,512.64. See Appendix 3.

The object code data was used to identify the breakdown of assistance by recipient category (object code). See Appendix 4.

Number and nature of grants:

The annual totals from the seventeen granting agencies are 11,613 grants and 685 grant programs. See Appendix 5.

The number of grants can not be obtained from MAPS information or any other statewide system. Identifying the number of grants is complicated because of the variation in the timing of when funding is made available to state agencies and the length of time for which the funding is available. For example, state funds availability is limited by statute (M.S. 16A.28) but federal funds may be awarded at any time and for various lengths of time. Like funding available for grant programs, outgoing grant programs may vary in length and may be awarded at any time during the year. Agencies were asked to determine the number of grants in their programs, by grant program, so that the number would be a fair representation of the annual number of grants that they manage. Agencies used various methods to make this determination.

The grant program name identifies the nature of the grant programs and no other criteria was been required for all agencies to use.

Enterprise-wide management of grants:

The grants category in MAPS not only includes grant programs managed by state agencies, and the focus of Executive Order 05-03, but also intergovernmental transactions such as legislative transfers, Local Government Assistance, loans, subsidies and shared revenue. The Grants group working on the MAPS replacement project has recommended the separation of grant programs from other intergovernmental transactions in the accounting system so that enterprise-wide financial management and reporting could be accomplished.

Current law requires the use of grant contracts when State programs sub-grant to service providers. If the contracting process is done post-award this adds to the length of time before the sub-grantee may begin to deliver services and consumes substantial work effort by state agency staff. The federal application process requires that the applicant agree to all requirements and terms as part of the application process and when awarded, the “award” document is signed by both parties. If the state used this model, it would streamline the process by eliminating the post-award contract with an “award” that would incorporate the application and trigger the grant. MAPS does not have an “award” transaction but it has been recommended for inclusion in the MAPS replacement system.

Currently, no one state agency provides oversight and direction of the state’s grant programs and this has resulted in a diversity of processes. Should grant contracts be replaced by grant “awards” enterprise-wide, the process change would require establishment of enterprise-wide standards, policies and procedures.
