Use of 2005 Legislative Appropriation for Specialty Courts

Prepared Pursuant to Minn. Laws 2005, Chapter 136, Article 1, Section 4

Introduction

The 2005 Legislature appropriated \$250,000 each year of the FY06-07 biennium for the development and expansion of specialty courts such as drug courts and mental health courts. The enabling legislation, Minn. Laws 2005, Chapter 136, Article 1, Section 4, mandated that the State Court Administrator report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the Senate and House criminal justice funding and policy committees on how the monies appropriated were spent. This report is in response to that mandate.

Distribution of Appropriation

The State Court Administrator's Office issued a memo on the availability of funds for specialty courts to all ten Judicial Districts, inviting existing and proposed specialty courts to apply. Applications were submitted to the Chief Judge of the district, then forwarded to the State Court Administrator's Office. All applications were then reviewed by an ad hoc committee to determine the awards. The following proposals were funded.
