This letter is in response to your request for copies of an inventory of technology owned or leased by state agencies, as required in statute.

Unfortunately, a reasonably comprehensive and credible report cannot be produced at this time. There is no central database of purchases of technology and, under current accounting practices, many technological devices are no longer listed on the state's central property inventory systems because, as commoditized personal computers have replaced typewriters, calculators and dedicated terminals, their costs have decreased and they are now standard equipment for most offices.

In the past, the Department of Administration used various combinations of agency survey data, procurement data and network scans to attempt to satisfy the requirement. The expense of collecting and maintaining such information is disproportionate to the usefulness of the data. As a result, the accuracy and completeness of the information was so poor that it had no real value and was not used either by the legislature or by our offices to measure effective IT investment. Data collection efforts were discontinued when the responsible staff position was eliminated for budgetary reasons in FY 2005.

The report issued in 2005 was dependent on a one-time survey of agency assets done as part of the Drive to Excellence Transformation Roadmap.

We have recommended in the past and will continue to recommend that this requirement be removed from statute. In its place, a far more valuable inventory of major applications and systems was presented to the legislature in January 2007 as one component of our Information Technology portfolio report. We will continue to make this information available.
