Laws of 2007, 1st Regular Session, Chapter 148, Article 1, Section 4 requires the Commissioner of Finance to report to the chairs of the State Government Finance Divisions any personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office that were supported by appropriations to other agencies. The information for FY 07 is outlined below for your review and submission to the chairs.

The Department of Administration provided the grounds maintenance service at the Governor's Residence by funding one full-time groundskeeper position at a cost of \$51,660. The Department of Administration also provided IT and LAN support services and maintenance of an integrated data base system for the Governor's Office.

An interagency agreement was in place between the Governor's Office and the Department of Transportation to fund a portion of the personnel costs of the Lieutenant Governor amounting to \$66,113.

Interagency agreements within the Department of Administration for a portion of the personnel costs of a position providing strategic planning advice totaled \$34,132.

Interagency agreements for the personnel costs of the State Sex Offender Policy Director position totaled \$19,297. Funding was provided by the three agencies listed below:
