Re: 2006 Child Maltreatment Review Panel Report

Dear Mr. Flahaven:

As required by the *Laws of Minnesota* Special Session 2001, Chapter 9, Article 11, section 3, I am respectfully submitting this report on the Child Maltreatment Review Panel activities for calendar year 2006. In accordance with requirements of Minnesota Statutes, I am also forwarding six copies of the report to the Legislative Reference Library.

Legislation creating the Child Maltreatment Review Panel was enacted during a special session of the 2001 Minnesota Legislature. The panel reviews an investigating agency's determinations regarding maltreatment of a child in state licensed facilities such as child care centers, correctional institutions, or schools in response to requests received under section 626.556, subdivision 10i, paragraph (b). An adult, acting on behalf of a child, can make a request, in writing for a review of an investigating agency's determinations regarding a report of child maltreatment.

The Child Maltreatment Review Panel meets quarterly if there are cases to be reviewed. The panel requests and encourages written statements and documentation from all parties involved in an investigation being reviewed. The Minnesota Department of Human Services provides a coordinator who facilitates all communication with the panel.

Two Review Panel meetings were held in 2006. The first meeting in January was for a request received in late 2005; the second meeting in November for a request received in September of 2006.

The Child Maltreatment Review Panel recommends that the legislature consider allowing for a determination of maltreatment in a licensed facility irrespective of a determination of no determined perpetrator.
