REPORT TO LEGISLATURE PURSUANT TO MINN. STAT. SECTION 473.757, SUBD. 2

Background

Minn. Stat. § 474.757, subd. 2 authorizes Hennepin County, by resolution, to make certain expenditures for increased library hours and youth activities and youth and amateur sports from excess revenues, if any, from the sales tax enacted for the new Twins ballpark. The same legislation also requires Hennepin County to make a report by January 15, 2009 describing any such uses of the money. The report must be made to the chairs of the committees and budget divisions in the Senate and the House of Representatives that have jurisdiction over education policy and funding.

Report

The Hennepin County Board took action on March 28, 2008 (Resolution #08-0118) to open 13 libraries throughout the county on Sundays from 12 PM to 5 PM, for a total of 65 additional hours per week. Under the resolution, the following 13 libraries were opened as of June 1, 2008 for the additional hours:

Augsburg Park Brooklyn Park Champlin East Lake Golden Valley Hopkins Hosmer Minneapolis Central North Regional Oxboro Rockford Road St Louis Park Westonka

The plan was designed to be financially sustainable in order to ensure the stability and longevity of the additional hours. Since the 1.5 percent growth factor provided for in the legislation is not sufficient to cover reasonably anticipated increases in annual operating costs, the plan adopted by the Board uses some of the funds for a reserve to assure that the action is financially sustainable for at least nine years.

The County is still evaluating options to fund youth activities and amateur sports. As part of the evaluation process the County has enlisted input from a variety of concerned parties and experts. It is expected that policy decisions will be made in 2009.
