Greetings East Central Minnesota!

It is my pleasure to present the 2009 Annual Report of the East Central Regional Development Commission. Fiscal Year 2009 has been an exciting year for the organization. The year started with the completion of a new Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). This planning effort allows our

region to continue its designation as a federally recognized Economic Development District. A special thanks to those who participated especially the East Central Workforce Partnership who serves as the CEDS advisory committee. The CEDS identified a number of regionally significant economic development projects – some of which are already being considered for federal funding from the Economic Development Administration.

In March, the ECRDC hosted a highly successful transportation forum where Congressman Oberstar, state legislators, local elected officials and others heard about transit, highway, trail, and rail initiatives that are underway in East Central Minnesota. In addition to showcasing planning initiatives in our region, it also emphasized how the various transportation modes might eventually work together as a system.

This past year the ECRDC began working closely with communities in the region that were identified as potential stops for the Northern Lights Express (NLX) passenger rail project between Minneapolis and Duluth. As part of this, the ECRDC was authorized by the Passenger Rail Alliance to form a Station Development Advisory Committee for the purpose of providing needed input to the project on local issues involving the development of train depots.

The East Central Arts Council (ECAC) celebrated its 30th anniversary with the ECRDC and completed its biennial planning process. This planning process was a bit different in that it will be the final plan the ECAC will conduct as a program of the ECRDC. The ECAC will reestablish as a non-profit organization to be eligible for the new arts funding available from the State's new Clean Water, Land, and Legacy Amend-

ment adopted by the electorate last fall. While the ECAC will be missed as a program of the ECRDC, we are very excited about the new funding opportunities for the arts programs in our region.

Programs operated under the ECRDC's aging program, the East Central Senior Resource Center, also performed exceptionally well during the past fiscal year. The Senior LinkAge® program assisted over 3600 senior clients and their families with a wide range of inquires including medical insurance, transportation, home health care, and nutrition. Our newest program for seniors, Caregiver Coach, connected over 720 caregivers of older adults with resources in their community that support and enhance their role as caregiver. Our Program Development & Coordination (PD&C) program secured over \$307,000 in State community service grants for senior programs and projects in the region as well.

On behalf of the Commission, I want to take this opportunity to thank outgoing Commission Members Rick Smisson (City of Harris), Jerry Nelson (Kanabec County), and Al Olson (Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe) for their service to the ECRDC over the years. Also, a warm welcome to our newly appointed Commission Members - Mary Sams (Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe), Roger Crawford (Kanabec County), and Jill Behnke (City of Center City) as newly appointed Commission Members.

Finally, a special thanks to the ECRDC Board, the various advisory committees, and the staff for a truly rewarding and productive year. The success of the organization would not have been possible without your support, hard work, and dedication. I am very much looking forward to another productive year of moving the ECRDC mission ahead.

EAST CENTRAL SENIOR RESOURCE CENTER

The East Central Senior Resource Center serves older adults, their families, the communities where they reside, and the providers of the services and programs they access. The mission "Fostering development of and access to resources for older adults in East Central Minnesota", sums up the work of the East Central Senior Resource Center (ECSRC).

The paid staff of the ECSRC includes director Penny Simonsen, and outreach coordinator Lynn Anderson, and caregiver coach Anita Sparks. Volunteer staff are vital to the work of the agency. Volunteer staff assist with every aspect of the day-in-day-out work of the ECSRC. They are: Elva Anderson, Linda Berg, Donna Bergin, , Diann Boser, Kayette Calander, Frances Caron, Brenda Hattenberger, Lynda Hayek, Wally Hed, Harriet Johnson, Ella Martens, Frank Miller, Joyce Rebischke, Sharon Toenies, and Rose-Marie Westmoreland.

In 1965 the U.S. Congress enacted legislation known as the Older American's Act. The Act authorizes Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to fund local public and non-profit organizations to develop/expand services for persons over 60. Through a contract with the Central Minnesota Council on Aging, the ECSRC provides services through three broad program areas: development of senior programs; caregiver services; and information, referral and assistance services.

Development of Senior Programs

Senior service provider networks in each county offer an opportunity for providers of aging services from government, non-profit and for-profit sectors to come together. The networking events, while informal in nature, offer opportunities for new partnerships and more communication between service providers and development of new services. Over 250 persons participated in the monthly events.

The State of Minnesota through the Minnesota Department of Human Services has funding available to agencies, businesses and organizations through the Community Services/Service Development (CS/SD) funds—with the intent of the resources to be put toward assisting older adults to remain independently in their communities longer and thus reducing the rate of nursing home admissions by increasing the availability of community-based services. The ECSRC worked closely with agencies, businesses and organizations to submit applications for CS/SD and other appropriate funding to develop new senior communitybased services in the five county region. Eight applications were submitted from the region and two were funded for a total dollar amount of approximately \$90,000 awarded to the Kanabec County Public Health and the Isanti County Commission on Aging for senior transit services, and a rural delivery service, respectively.

Resource Guide-

A Listing of Services for Older Adults

Each year the ECSRC publishes a resource guide chocked full of information about services available to seniors in the region. Copies of the

resource guide are available through the Center and many locations throughout the region.

The guide, supported by paid advertisement offer local service providers an opportunity to financially support the well-recognized publication. Service provider listings remain free of charge as a public service of the Center.

Caregiver Services

The ECSRC expanded the scope of services available to caregivers to include caregiver education sessions, support groups and one-to-one extensive counseling, referred to as "coaching" throughout the region. Caregiver coaches offer help to caregivers to manage and live their life while caring for another person, offers caregivers expert advice, assists caregivers to develop their unique personal action plan, connects caregivers to community resources, helping them see all available options and helps caregivers identify strategies and solutions to remain as a caregiver longer. Over 120 caregivers were served.

Information, Referral and Assistance Services

The ECSRC is part of a statewide network known as the Senior LinkAge Line®--a telephone based information and assistance service. Trained staff assist clients in locating a variety of services. Staff provides one -on-one assistance with accessing prescription drug programs (including Medicare Part D), understanding medical bills, insurance claims and Medicare coverage. The individualized help is objective and confidential. The information, referral and assistance services at the ECSRC responded to over 3,600 callers. Over forty presentations were offered teaching seniors the basics of computer use and navigating the internet to access information about Medicare, among other things. Published yearly the ECSRC resource guide contains information about many of the services available in the region.

Senior Surf... Catch the Wave

During these half day events, older adults learn to "surf the web"...navigating the world wide web, specifically Social Security's internet website among others. Computer basics, e-mailing and opportunities for learners to explore areas of interest during the class times.

Soup and Pie events are held monthly at the Isle Recreation & Education Center (IREC). During this activity older adults and caregivers get a chance to meet and discuss any concerns/issues they may be facing.



EAST CENTRAL ARTS COUNCIL

The mission of the East Central Arts Council is to improve the quantity and quality of arts experiences in Region 7E by facilitating the production, presentation, and dissemination of art development for arts organizations and by promoting the growth of individual artists. The East Central Arts Council (ECAC) accomplishes its mission through programs and special initiatives for artists and arts organizations.

The FY 2009 work program of the Regional Arts Council included the following: grant programs for organizations such as the Art Projects Assistance, Art in Our Schools, and the Small Grants Program; individual artist programs such as the McKnight/ECAC Individual Artist and Fellowship Grant Programs, Image-the annual regional art show, the Scholarship Program for K - 12 kids; an Arts Needs Assessment; in addition assistance is provided and includes continuing to host various grant workshops, providing technical assistance and arts resource information. ECAC's mission, vision and values are at the heart of the programs and grantees funded. ECAC's grantee partners are at the forefront of our work to enhance the arts environment in Region 7E. It is the artist's and arts organization's daily work and commitment that expands arts opportunities, increases the quality of life, and enhances the community/economic development in the region. In fall of 2008 the annual IMAGE Art Show was held at the Audubon Center of the North Woods in Sandstone. In FY 2009 ECAC sponsored a series of skillbuilding workshops led by Dr. Kate Maurer entitled "Professional Writing in the Arts." In conjunction with the Minnesota State Arts Board ECAC hosted three art grant information sessions. ECAC also had six art grant information sessions throughout the region. Many potential applicants were in attendance at these sessions and they learned more about potential arts funding sources. Additionally, staff of the East Central Arts Council also provided staffing services for the Forum of Regional Arts Councils of Minnesota (FRACM,) the statewide organization of Regional Arts Council Directors. Staffing was provided for 10 FRACM business meetings and 2 best practices sessions. Also during this fiscal year, ECAC partnered with the Minnesota State Arts Board on a comprehensive Statewide Arts Needs Assessment and on Listening Forums in the Region. The information gathered is be utilized in planning for the Constitutional Amendment funding - the Art and Culture Fund.

Individual Artists Grants & Artist Fellowships -

The Individual Artist grants are for artists in the region wanting to expand their artistry with a specific arts project. The Fellowship Program is designed to recognize, reward, and encourage outstanding professional artists. Funding for these programs are provided by The McKnight Foundation. This year ECAC awarded \$12,000 in artist grants/fellowships to artists in Region 7E.

Art Scholarships for K-12 Students - Region 7E has many young, talented, and energetic artists deserving recognition. As a result, the ECAC, with funding through The McKnight Foundation, offers students in grades K - 12 a scholarship opportunity to further their artistic skills. This year the Council recognized three students with a total amount of \$1,500. The kids are experiencing a wide range of activities: a graphic art mentorship with artist/teacher instructor; a mentorship with a music instructor for voice lessons; and attendance at the Shell Lake Arts Center Jazz Ensemble Camp.

Art in Our Schools Grants - Schools may apply to the East Central Arts Council to help fund special art projects related to the curriculum. The funds can support artist residencies, art related field trips, or any special school arts-focused project. This year seven grants were funded in schools throughout Region 7E. The total amount of grants was almost \$6,400 for school projects. Thousands of local children benefited from this funding.



EAST CENTRAL ARTS COUNCIL

Art Organization Project & Small Grants - These ECAC programs award grants for local or regional arts and cultural projects sponsored/coordinated by organizations, schools, units of government, or nonprofits. Funds are available for a variety of arts projects that develop or enhance local arts organizations, artists, or art audiences. Small Grants of up to \$500 and Art Organization Project Grants up to \$5,000 are considered. The grants are awarded only with a one-to-one financial match. The grants this year amounted to over \$47,000. The total project costs were over \$123,000. A wide variety of arts events were made possible throughout Region 7E with these grant funds: the Friends of the North Branch Area hosted Summer Youth Art Classes; the Kanabec History Center presented Summer Lemonade Concerts; Princeton Community Education presented the Tuesdays in the Park Concerts; Chisago Lakes Community Education Family Center is producing a Mosaic Project; the Pine Center for the Arts will host the 2009 IMAGE Art Show at the North West Company Fur Post in Pine City; Pine Center for the Arts was grant funds for a residency and concert with the performing group Ball in the House; the Audubon Center of the North Woods produced a public art project with artist Natalene Cummings; the First Tuesday Performance Series was produced in Princeton; the Mora CAPP's Tonic Sol Fa was funded for a residency and concert; the City of Isanti produced a public art project, a downtown mural by artist Walter Hoercher; the Kanabec County Artist Tour and the Kanabec History Center is producing the Sticks and Stones Art and Cultural Festival; Cambridge Friends of the Library presented the One Book One Community Dance Performance Project; Pine Center for the Arts is sponsoring a Tom Green Residency and Performance; the Fiddle Workshop and Contest was funded at the Mille Lacs County Fair; the City of Lindstrom's Harmony in the Parks summer concert series was supported; North Branch Community Education produced the Main Street Music and Art Festival; and Franconia Sculpture Park produced the Community Hot Metal Pour.





IMAGE Art Show – In December of 2008 the East Central Arts Council sponsored the 22nd annual IMAGE Art Show. The show was hosted by the Audubon Center of the North Woods in Sandstone. Over 100 artists entered the show. Each year the IMAGE Art Show honors some of the finest art and artists in the region. ECAC provides a \$5,000 grant to an art organization (or arts interested organization) to host the show-the grant deadline is June 1. Here are two photos of the IMAGE Art Show 2008. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY/ EDA PLANNING GRANT: The ECRDC has begun implementing the Federal EDA's new Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) governance system.

A nine-member CEDS Governance Board composed of elected officials and representatives of post secondary education, workforce and private industry oversee the structuring and crafting of the ECRDC's CEDS program. At the same time a CEDS Advisory Committee was also created. This committee of "boots on the ground" representatives of industry, workforce and education, provides suggestions and feedback to the Governance Board.

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) process is designed to guide the economic growth of the region. The CEDS is required in order to qualify for Economic Development Administration (EDA) Planning Grant Assistance under its public works, economic adjustment, and most planning programs; and is a prerequisite for designation by EDA as an economic development district (EDD). Multiple surveys were conducted of local government and community leaders for completion on projects in process, and future infrastructure, housing, and economic development needs that may require EDA assistance.

The ECRDC has assisted the cities of Isle, Mora, Cambridge, North Branch and Pine Technical College in Pine City in preparing applications to the EDA for a variety of projects. Of these, and grant was awarded to Mora & Cambridge for marketing their industrial parks, and a grant was declined by the City of Isle after a planned industrial park tenant decided not to move to the park. Work continues on additional projects.

VALUE ADDED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES: The ECRDC provided local assistance to various economic development groups and local government (township, city, and county).

Economic Development Partnerships: The ECRDC partners regularly with the following organizations: Cambridge Development Alliance, North Branch EDA Advisory Board, East Central Minnesota Workforce Partnership, ECMN Business Services Board, Northern Technology Initiative, Manufacturers Alliance, and City / County Administrators & Economic Development Professionals. Example of positive results gleaned from these meetings include: developing a regional brand, marketing initiatives, and a regional website.

Community Planning: Comprehensive land use planning and zoning ordinance were developed for Windemere Township in northern Pine County. The ECRDC also assisted the City of Sandstone in conducting a feasibility study on the future of the municipally owned Sandstone Area Golf Course. Onsite assessment meetings with local governments are ongoing. Informational materials are sent out annually on planning and zoning services

Small Business Development Center (SBDC): Through the Central Lakes College of Brainerd branch of the MN SBDC, the ECRDC provides assistance in business planning, marketing, loan analysis and eligibility to those considering starting a new business or improve an existing one. The planning grant will work with providing the expense in being in the communities in Region 7E. With this new SBDC office, the ECRDC is becoming a one stop shop for business / recruitment expansion; loan assessment and packaging; small business planning; and community strategic planning.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Northern Technology Initiative/GPS 45:39 Collaboration: The ECRDC continues its economic development partnership with the Northern Technology Initiative (NTI), recently renamed "GPS 45:93" on attracting high technology firms to Region 7E. Projects this past year include the implementation of a \$50,000 matching Framework for Integrated Regional Strategies (FIRST) grant from the MN Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) and work on ENSA: implementing a cluster development and supply chain marketing strategy using the NAICS (North American Industrial Coding) System database.

Job Opportunity Building Zones (JOBZ) Awards: The ECRDC is the JOBZ Administrator for Region 7E. To date, JOBZ awards have been completed for thirteen projects in Region 7E; Advanced Design & Systems of Pine City, Adventure Publications in Cambridge, Andersen Windows of North Branch, DAKA Corporation of Pine City, Kendall Howard, LLC of Chisago City, Lake Superior Laundry of Pine City, MAPE USA of Cambridge, NorthStor of Pine City, Polaris Inc. of Wyoming, Top Line Automotive of North Branch, Utility Chemical of Cambridge, Water Works Manufacturing of Cambridge, and Xccent in Wyoming, MN.

Approximately half of the 1,486 acres zoned JOBZ has been awarded. According to State records, JOBZ will have created 420 jobs and retained 241 more in Region 7E. These thirteen businesses will have invested over \$53 million in these facilities, and have an annual payroll of over \$23.07 million dollars. For more information, see our website: www.ecrdc.org.

City / County Administrator & Economic Development Professionals Meetings: The ECRDC organizes a City Administrator meeting quarterly to discuss mutual key issues occurring in the Region 7E communities. Past topics include the JOBZ award program, grants and financing for infrastructure improvement, and regional marketing initiatives. The City Administrator meetings have evolved into a best practices approach to city economic development. Issues and speakers are selected that will provide insight that will assist local governments with solving key issues in zoning, planning, economic development, and housing.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND (RLF):

The ECRDC RLF continues to provide gap financing for businesses looking to open, expand or relocate to Mille Lacs, Pine, Isanti, Chisago & Kanabec Counties. The RLF currently has 6 loans and commitments outstanding, as well as fund on reserve to make new loans.



Toward Zero Death (TZD)

The ECRDC completed is 6th year of a traffic safety initiative in Isanti County. This initiative, funded through the Dept of Public Safety's Safe Communities Program, is aimed at reducing fatal and serious motor vehicle crashes through a community effort. One of the successes is the development and continued positive impact of the Safe Cab program which provides a safe ride home to persons who may be too impaired to drive. A number of other communities have made inquiries about starting a similar program in their areas. Last year. A national award from NADO (National Association of Development Organizations) was received recognizing the Safe Cab program. Safe Cab also received a state MADD award for addressing drunk driving.



Stimulus Funding


(American Recovery & Reinvestment Act)

Area Transportation Partnerships

The ATP process is the mechanism whereby federal transportation dollars are identified for projects around the state. In Region 7E, the ECRDC solicits and prioritizes projects for inclusion in the STIP for the counties of Kanabec, Isanti, and Mille Lacs. ECRDC participates in the county team meeting for projects in Pine County and the ATP process in the Metro area. For the three counties in Mn/DOT District 3, the RDC identifies a target amount of approx. \$1.3 Million in transportation projects.
