# Section 2. Short-term Offender Profile as of 07-01-2009

**Definition**: Short-term offenders are those offenders who, after receiving a felony sentence to imprisonment, have a remaining term of imprisonment of 180 days or less. These offenders are then designated to serve the remaining term of imprisonment at a workhouse, work farm, county jail or other place authorized by law (Minnesota Statutes § 609.105, Subdivision 1).

This law became effective July 1, 2003; however, the 2009 legislature made changes to this requirement. As a result, short-term offenders sentenced after July 1, 2009, will be housed in DOC facilities.

Note: The short-term offender population number (324) indicated below is excluded from all statistics reported in Section 1 of the Adult Inmate Profile.
