

Appropriation Language 1: \$1,000,000 the first year and \$1,000,000 the second year are from the trust fund to the metropolitan council for subgrants for the acquisition, development, and rehabilitation in the metropolitan regional park system, consistent with the Metropolitan Council regional recreation open space capital improvement plan. This appropriation may not be used for the purchase of residential structures, may be used to reimburse implementing agencies for acquisition as expressly approved in the work program, and must be matched by at least 40 percent nonstate money. Subdivision 16 of this section applies to grants awarded in the approved work program. This appropriation is available until June 30, 2008 at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless an earlier date is specified in the work program. If a project financed under this program receives a federal grant award, the availability of the financing from this paragraph for that project is extended to equal the period of the federal grant.

Appropriation Language 2: (b) The availability of the appropriations for the following projects are extended to June 30, 2010:

(1) Laws 2005, First Special Session, chapter 1, article 2, section 11, subdivision 6, paragraph (e), metropolitan parks acquisition, rehabilitation and development;

Overall Project Outcome and Results

This appropriation leveraged \$1,333,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds and \$701,000 of 2005 State bonds in grants from the Metropolitan Council to regional park agencies to accomplish the following:

- Acquire 567 acres in 4 parks (0.8 acre for Long Lake Regional Park in Ramsey County, 543 acres for Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Park Reserve in Anoka County, 18.6 acres for Lake Waconia Regional Park in Carver County, and 5 acres for Big Marine Park Reserve in Washington County).
- > Acquire a permanent trail easement from Burlington Northern Railroad for a 0.8 mile of right-ofway for the Bruce Vento Regional Trail in Ramsey County.
- > Partially finance trail and shoreline rehabilitation at Lake of the Isles in Minneapolis
- > Replace 4 pit toilets with sewer-served restrooms for picnic areas at Keller Regional Park in Ramsey County
- > Rehabilitate 0.7 miles of separated bike/pedestrian trails, lighting and landscaping along East Lakeshore Drive at Como Regional Park in St. Paul
- > Build 2 classrooms, storage and reception areas for a visitor center at Gale Woods Special Recreation Feature in Three Rivers Park District
- Design/engineering for 1.5 miles of North Urban Regional Trail in Dakota County

Build a picnic shelter at the Sucker Lake portion of Grass-Vadnais Regional Park in Ramsey County

A partial extension to the appropriation timeline will allow Anoka County to use \$524,000 remaining from a land acquisition grant to match \$1,050,000 of Federal Transportation Enhancement grant funds to construct two linked sections of the Rice Creek North Regional Trail within Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Park Reserve that totals 4 miles.

Project Results Use and Dissemination

The parks and trails where these projects are located had 9,233,000 visits in 2007, which was 28% of all visits to the Metropolitan Regional Park System in 2007.

Each regional park agency that received a grant or grants from this appropriation informs the public about the land acquisition, or new or rehabilitated park facilities with its own website and news releases. The Metropolitan Council also publishes a "Regional Parks Directory and Map" that informs the public about the recreation activities available at each regional park and trail and includes website addresses and phone numbers for each park agency for more information. Finally, the Metropolitan Council's website includes an interactive parks map that contains the same information as the paper version of the "Regional Parks Directory and Map" at www.metrocouncil.org/parks/r-pk-map.htm

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Title: 6(e) Metropolitan Regional Parks Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Development

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS AS OF April 12, 2006: As of this date, acquisition has been completed at one park (05A8), rehabilitation at two parks (05R10 and 05R12), and development at one trail (04D10). Work has started and about \$7,000 has been disbursed on completed work on a park development project (05D11). Work has begun on four other projects but no funds have been disbursed yet for completed work (05A5, 05A6, 05A7, and 05R11). The scope of project 04D9 was approved by the Metropolitan Council on March 8, 2006. In order to spend the appropriation on park capital improvements that protect, preserve and enhance the environment \$413,000 of 2005 State bonds will be used in place of \$413,000 of Environmental Trust Funds for projects 04D9 and 04D11 and \$413,000 of Environmental Trust Funds will be used in place of \$413,000 of 2005 State bonds for new project 05A5 and project 05A6 as shown in Section IV of this amended workprogram. With the addition of project 05A5 and the depiction of 2005 State bonds that hadn't been shown in previous reports, the total amount of State bonds reported in the workprogram is \$701,000.

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS AS OF May 9, 2007: The recording fees for a trail easement for the Bruce Vento Trail in suburban Ramsey County have been paid (05A5), 543 acres have been acquired for Rice Creek Chain of Lakes Park Reserve (05A6), construction has begun on picnic area restrooms at Keller Regional Park utilizing State bonds also appropriated for this project (05R11), construction began on classroom space and receptionist area at Gale Woods Special Recreation Feature (04D9). Plus engineering has been completed and some construction has occurred for a picnic shelter and related site improvements at the Sucker Lake portion of Vadnais-Shail Lake Regional Park (04D11).

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS AS OF August 13, 2007: About 64% of the construction work on the educational facility at Gale Woods Farm Special Recreation Feature has been completed (O4D9). However, funds for that project were from matching Metropolitan Council bonds--not from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund. There was no disbursement of Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund money for projects since the May 9, 2007 update.

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS AS OF May 12, 2008: An amendment to the workprogram is proposed that would allow \$524,000 of the 2005 Environmental Trust Fund appropriation to match a \$1,050,000 Federal Transportation Enhancement grant for constructing 2.75 miles of Rice Creek North Regional Trail and to extend the duration of this portion of the Trust Fund appropriation to June 30, 2010 (Project 05A6). About 95% of the construction work to replace pit toilet restrooms with flush toilet restrooms for the picnic area at Keller Regional Park is completed. The project should be completed by the June 30 deadline (Project 05R11).

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INTERIM FINAL REPORT PROGRESS AS OF October 6, 2008. An amendment to the workprogram that would allow \$524,000 of the 2005 Environmental Trust Fund appropriation to match a \$1,050,000 Federal Transportation Enhancement grant for constructing 2.75 miles of Rice Creek North Regional Trail and to extend the duration of this portion of the Trust Fund appropriation to June 30, 2010 (Project 05A6) was approved by the LCCMR on June 11, 2008. On September 2, 2008 the Transportation Advisory Board approved a change in the project in which about 4 miles of combined offroad and on-road trail would be constructed that completely fills a gap in the Rice Creek North Regional Trail using the \$524,000 Environmental Trust Fund 2005 appropriation to match the Federal Transportation Enhancement grant. With regard to other projects, construction work to replace pit toilet restrooms with flush toilet restrooms for the picnic area at Keller Regional Park was completed on June 27 (Project 05R11). Finally the acquisition of Parcel 6 at Long Lake Regional Park Regional Park occurred on June 30, 2008 (Project 05A5).

OUTLINE OF PROJECT RESULTS: This appropriation would leverage \$1,333,000 of Metropolitan Council bonds and \$701,000 of 2005 State bonds to acquire land in 3 parks, rehabilitate facilities in 3 parks and develop new facilities in 3 parks. \$524,000 of the appropriation was carried forward to June 30, 2010 which will be used to match Federal Transportation Enhancement Funds to fill a 4 mile gap in Rice Creek North Regional Trail.
