



It is my pleasure to present to you the 2010 Annual Report of the East Central Regional Development Commission (ECRDC). This report lists the programs, services, and accomplishments of the Commission in fulfilling the ECRDC's mission. This report includes the programs, projects, and related financial information of the ECRDC for the period July 1,

2009 through June 30, 2010. Since the Commission's formation in 1973, its main priority has been to provide technical assistance and support to its many local units of government, businesses, and citizens.

Highlights of the Commission's activities during the past year include the development of a Station Area Planning Study for the Region 7E communities which were identified as potential stops for the proposed Northern Lights Express (NLX) passenger train between Minneapolis and Duluth. The ECRDC also worked with a number of cities on federal EDA infrastructure grants for economic development projects including a successful application for \$1.44 million to construct a technology incubator at Pine Technical College. Significant progress was also made to position the Regional Arts Council for a bright future as a non-profit organization with expanded funding through the State's new Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

Our East Central Senior Resource Center (ECSRC) program accomplished a great deal this year as well with more and more older adults and their families accessing our Senior LinkAge® and Caregiver Consulting programs for information and referral services. The ECSRC also assisted various organizations and businesses in applying for funding for services in an effort meet the needs of the ever growing older population.

The ECRDC advocated for a number high profile transportation projects with funding made possible through the America Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). Examples of these projects include a freeway interchange/bridge structure at the junction of I-35 and State Hwy 95 in North Branch as well as a 17 mile reconstruction of State Hwy 65 north of Mora. Finally, the Commission continued efforts to fill gaps in the region where public transit is limited or non-existent.

I think you'll agree that the Commission continues to make a remarkable difference in East Central Minnesota. This of course would not be possible without the hard work and dedication of the ECRDC Commission, the various advisory committees, our program partners, volunteers, and, of course, our dedicated staff.

The ECRDC is funded through a local tax levy and planning/program grants and contracts from state agencies, federal agencies and foundations.

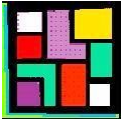
MISSION OF THE EAST CENTRAL REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

EAST CENTRAL ARTS COUNCIL



FY 2010: A Momentous Year for the East Central Arts Council!

This year, FY 2010, was not just the 30th anniversary of the East Central Arts Council advisory committee. The Arts Council also successfully undertook 2 major accomplishments in addition to providing existing services! ECAC initiated the Region 7E Arts and Cultural Heritage Legacy Fund, and the Arts Council, and the East Central Regional Development Commission, decided that the Council will become an independent non-profit organization.



In January of 2010 the ECAC Advisory Committee celebrated the completion of the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund planning in Region 7E with Sheila Smith of Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, and Sue Gens of the Minnesota State Arts Board.

Arts and Cultural Heritage Legacy Fund -

The East Central Arts Council (ECAC), currently a program of the East Central Regional Development Commission, in FY 2010 as one of Minnesota's designated Regional Arts Councils, was entrusted with stewardship of new funding through the State of Minnesota's Arts and Cultural Heritage (ACH) Legacy Fund. Proceeds from the fund may be spent only on arts and arts access, arts education and arts and cultural heritage. The Legacy Fund is intended to create a strong arts legacy in Minnesota and will exist for a period of twenty-five years.

ECAC members felt it was incredibly encouraging to be able to offer support for worthwhile arts projects that were found by the grant review panels to all be of a very high artistic caliber and which also support the regional economy in these hard economic times. The awarding of the FY 2010 ECAC ACH grants, the first Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund grants, represented the culmination of a year and a half long process of gathering input from the public about the best use of the funds in our region, revising the Biennial Plan and developing the new grant programs. It also included extensive work with grant applicants during both the ECAC program planning and their grant submission processes. Non-profit organizations, community groups, units of government, public schools and individual artists were all eligible to apply.

Of the 39 applications received 20 ACH projects were funded. A total of almost \$300,000 dollars were requested from ECAC in this grant program which exemplified a huge demand for arts programming. Funds granted were about \$130,000. In addition, as part of the ECAC ACH program, the Arts Council initiated a public art program with Forecast Public Art. This partnership included public art grants in Region 7E, public art workshops here, and work on a public art toolkit. Literally thousands of regional community members are benefitting from this ECAC ACH funding

This new East Central Arts Council Arts and Cultural Heritage Legacy Fund programming was made possible by the Minnesota arts and Cultural Heritage Fund as appropriated by the Minnesota State Legislature with money from the vote of the people of Minnesota on November 4, 2008.

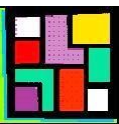

In FY 2010 the East Central Regional Development Commission (ECRDC) and the ECAC, as part an extensive planning process and consultant study, decided that in order to better serve its mission the Regional Arts Council will no longer be a program of the ECRDC. The new East Central Regional Arts Council (ECRAC) will establish itself as a non-profit and will become independent of the ECRDC as of July 1, 2011. While ECAC will miss the leadership and collaboration it has had as a program of the ECRDC, the members are also very excited about the new arts funding opportunities and arts programming this transformation will provide for Region 7E. ECRAC will have both a new location and website as of this date and will continue to provide grants and services to the arts community during the transition.

Other ECAC Activities -

The FY 2010 work program of the Regional Arts Council included the following: revision of the Biennial Plan, approved in December 2009; the East Central Arts Council Arts and Cultural Heritage Legacy Fund grants for organizations and individuals; Art Projects Assistance; Art in Our Schools; Small Grants Program; Image-the annual regional art show hosted this past year by the Pine Center for the Arts; McKnight/ECAC Individual Artist and Fellowship Grant Programs; the Scholarship Program for K - 12 kids; started development of a new website; and assistance was provided by hosting various grant workshops, providing technical assistance and arts resource information. ECAC's mission, vision and values are at the heart of the programs and grantees funded. ECAC's grantee partners are at the forefront of the work to enhance the arts environment in Region 7E. It is the artist's and arts organization's daily work and commitment that expands arts opportunities, increases the quality of life, and enhances the community/economic development in the region.

In FY 2010 ECAC sponsored a series of 5 skill-building workshops led by Springboard for the Arts. ECAC also sponsored 2 Forecast Public Art Workshops in the Region. In conjunction with the Minnesota State Arts Board ECAC hosted 2 art grant information sessions. ECAC also had 43 art grant information sessions throughout the region. Many potential applicants were in attendance at these sessions and

they learned more about ECAC arts funding sources and services. ECAC was featured on MPR after a USDA/Minnesota Rural Partners "Rural Urban Connections" videoconference highlighting the arts. Additionally, the Director of the East Central Arts Council also provided staffing services for the Forum of Regional Arts Councils of Minnesota (FRACM,) the statewide organization of Regional Arts Council Directors. This staffing was provided through October for both FRACM business meetings and best practices sessions.

Individual Artist Grants & Artist Fellowships - The McKnight/ECAC Individual Artist grants are for artists in the region wanting to expand their artistry with a specific arts project. The Fellowship Program is designed to recognize, reward, and encourage outstanding professional artists. Funding for these programs are provided by The McKnight Foundation. This year ECAC awarded over \$17,000 in artist grants/fellowships to artists in Region 7E.

Art Scholarships for K-12 Students - Region 7E has a lot of young, talented, and energetic artists deserving recognition. As a result, the ECAC, with funding through The McKnight Foundation, offered students in grades K - 12 a scholarship opportunity to further

their artistic skills. This year the Council recognized students with over \$1,800 in Scholarships. Due to funding priority changes at The McKnight Foundation this will be the last year of this current program. The Arts Council will be working toward re-establishing this popular program in the future.

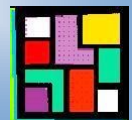
Art in Our Schools Grants - Schools may apply to the East Central Arts Council to help fund special art projects related to the curriculum. The funds can support artist residencies, art related field trips, or any special school arts-focused project. This year ten grants were funded in schools throughout Region 7E. The total amount of grants was almost \$10,000 for school projects.

Art Organization Project & Small Grants - These ECAC programs award grants for local or regional arts and cultural projects sponsored/coordinated by organizations, schools, units of government, or non-profits. Funds are available for a variety of arts projects that develop or enhance local arts organizations, artists, or art audiences. Small Grants of up to \$500 and Art Organization Project Grants up to \$5,000 are considered. The grants are awarded only with a one-to-one financial match. The grants this year amounted to over \$45,000. The total project costs were over \$130,000.

ECAC Mission -

The mission of ECAC is to improve the quantity and quality of arts experiences in Region 7E by facilitating the production, presentation, and dissemination of art development for arts organizations and by promoting the growth of individual artists. ECAC accomplishes its mission through programs and special initiatives for artists and arts organizations.

The East Central Senior Resource Center serves older adults, their families, the communities where they reside, and the providers of the services and programs they access. The mission —Fostering development of and access to resources for older adults in East Central Minnesota, sums up the work of the East Central Senior Resource Center (ECSRC).

The paid staff of the ECSRC includes director Penny Simonsen, and outreach coordinators Lynn Anderson and Lynda Hayek, and caregiver consultants Linda Berg and Anita Sparks. Volunteer staff are vital to the work of the agency. Volunteer staff assist with every aspect of the day-in-day-out work of the ECSRC. They are: Elva Anderson, Donna Bergin, , Diann Boser, Kayetta Calander, Frances Caron, Wally Hed, Harriet Johnson, Ella Martens, Joyce Rebischke, Sharon Toenies, and Rose Westmoreland.



Seniors are invited to a free session on learning to surf the internet. These classes are geared to seniors who have little or no experience with computers.

In 1965 the U.S. Congress enacted legislation known as the Older American's Act. The Act authorizes Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to fund local public and non-profit organizations to develop/expand services for persons over 60. Through a contract with the Central Minnesota Council on Aging, the ECSRC provides services through three broad program areas: development of senior programs; caregiver services; and information, referral and assistance services.

Development of Senior Programs

Senior service provider networks in each county offer an opportunity for providers of aging services from government, non-profit and for-profit sectors to come together. The networking events, while informal in nature, offer opportunities for new partnerships and more communication between service providers and development of new services. Over 250 persons participated in the monthly events.

The State of Minnesota through the Minnesota Department of Human Services has funding available to agencies, businesses and organizations through the Community Services/Service Development (CS/SD) funds—with the intent of the resources to be put toward assisting older adults to remain independently in their communities longer and thus reducing the rate of nursing home admissions by increasing the availability of community-based services. The ECSRC worked closely with agencies, businesses and organizations to submit applications for CS/SD and other appropriate funding to develop new senior community-based services in the five county region.

In 2009 the ECSRC began offering services tailored to older adults who may beginning to exhibit signs of being at risk for nursing home placement. ECSRC staff work closely with those individuals to help find services that best fit the individual's life style and budget. The service is called Live Well at Home.

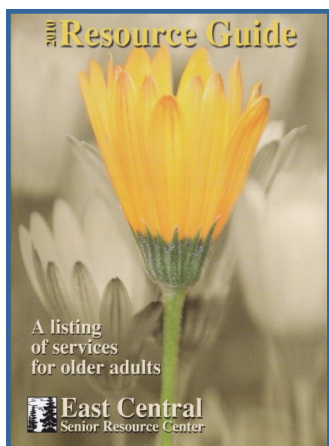

Resource Guide-

A Listing of Services for Older Adults

Each year the ECSRC publishes a resource guide chocked full of information about services available to seniors in the region. Copies of the resource guide are available through the Center and many locations throughout the region.



The guide, supported by paid advertisement offer local service providers an opportunity to financially support the well-recognized publication. Service provider listings remain free of charge as a public service of the Center. Over 5,000 copies were distributed last year to older adults and their families.

Senior Surf... Catch the Wave

During these half day events, older adults learn to "surf the web"...navigating the world wide web, specifically Social Security's internet website among others. Computer basics, e-mailing and opportunities for learners to explore areas of interest during the class times.

Caregiver Services

The ECSRC expanded the amount of caregiver counseling services available to caregivers throughout the region. Caregiver consultants offer help to caregivers to manage and live their life while caring for another person, offers caregivers expert advice, assists caregivers to develop their unique personal action plan, connects caregivers to community resources, helping them see all available options and helps caregivers identify strategies and solutions to remain as a caregiver longer. Over 120 caregivers were served, and more than 1000 hours of direct client contact reported.

Information, Referral and Assistance Services

The ECSRC is part of a statewide network known as the Senior LinkAge Line®--a telephone based information and assistance service. Trained staff assist clients in locating a variety of services. Staff provides one-on-one assistance with accessing prescription drug programs (including Medicare Part D), understanding medical bills, insurance claims and Medicare cover-age. The individualized help is objective and confidential. The information, referral and assistance services at the ECSRC responded to over 3,600 callers. Over forty presentations were offered teaching seniors the basics of computer use and navigating the internet to access information about Medicare, among other things. Published yearly the ECSRC resource guide contains information about many of the services available in the region.

Soup and Pie events are held monthly at the Isle Recreation & Education Center (IREC). During this activity older adults and caregivers get a chance to meet and discuss any concerns/issues they may be facing.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

VALUE ADDED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES: The ECRDC provided local assistance to various economic development groups and local government.

Economic Development Partnerships: The ECRDC partners regularly with the following organizations: Cambridge Development Alliance, East Central Minnesota Workforce Partnership, Central MN Workforce Investment Board, Central MN Housing Partnership, ECMN Business Services Board, GPS 45:93 - formerly the Northern Technology Initiative, Manufacturers Alliance, and City / County Administrators & Economic Development Professionals. Example of positive results gleaned from these meetings include: developing a regional brand, marketing initiatives, and a regional website.

Community Planning: Comprehensive land use planning and zoning ordinance developed for Windemere Township in northern Pine County, and Royalton Township in southern Pine County . Also assisted several local units of government with minor updates and participated in discussions on potential updating of planning tools.

Small Business Development Center (SBDC): Through the Central Lakes College of Brainerd branch of the MN SBDC, the ECRDC provides assistance in business planning, marketing, loan analysis and eligibility to those considering starting a new business or improve an existing one. The planning grant will work with providing the expense in being in the communities in Region 7E. With this SBDC office, the ECRDC is becoming a one stop shop for business / recruitment expansion; loan assessment and packaging; small business planning; and strategic planning.

GPS 45:93 Collaboration: The ECRDC continues its economic development partnership with the GPS 45:93, formerly the Northern Technology Initiative (NTI), in attracting high technology firms to Region 7E. Projects this past year include the implementation of a \$50,000 matching Framework for Integrated Regional Strategies (FIRST) grant from the MN Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) and work on creating an integrated "one stop shop" website for site selectors and entrepreneurs, as well as conducting a series of business expansion and retention visits across the region.

Job Opportunity Building Zones (JOBZ) Awards: The ECRDC is the JOBZ Administrator for Region 7E. To date, JOBZ awards have been completed for fifteen projects in Region 7E, thirteen of which remain JOBZ designees; Advanced Design & Systems of Pine City, Adventure Publications in Cambridge, Andersen Windows of North Branch, Kendall Howard, LLC of Chisago City, Lake Superior Laundry of Pine City, MAPE USA of Cambridge, NorthStor of Pine City, Polaris Inc. of Wyoming, Top Line Automotive of North Branch, Utility Chemical of Cambridge, Water Works Manufacturing of Cambridge, and Xcent in Wyoming.

Approximately half of the 1,486 acres zoned JOBZ has been awarded. According to State records, JOBZ will have created 414 jobs and retained 219 more in Region 7E. These thirteen businesses will have invested over \$56.4 million in these facilities, and have an annual payroll of over \$22.4 million dollars. For more information, see our website: www.ecrdc.org.

City / County Clerks, Administrators & Economic Development Professionals Meetings: The ECRDC organizes a City Administrator meeting quarterly to discuss mutual key issues occurring in the Region 7E communities. Past topics include the new MNProspector website, award program, grants and financing for infrastructure improvement, and regional marketing initiatives. The City Administrator meetings have evolved into a best practices approach to city economic development. Issues and speakers are selected that will provide insight that will assist local governments with solving key issues in zoning, planning, economic development, and housing.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY/ EDA PLANNING GRANT:

The ECRDC began work on the region's new five-year Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) governance system. This CEDS, due on January, 2011, catalogs the region's currently and historical demographics and economic conditions, identifies weaknesses and threats, and identifies strategies that have the potential to help mitigate these roadblocks to the region's prosperity.

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) process is designed to guide the economic growth of the region. The CEDS is required in order to qualify for Economic Development Administration (EDA) Planning Grant Assistance under its public works, economic adjustment, and most planning programs; and is a prerequisite for designation by EDA as an economic development district (EDD). Multiple surveys were conducted of local government and community leaders for completion on projects in process, and future infrastructure, housing, and economic development needs that may require EDA assistance.

CEDS Advisory Board

The ECRDC assisted the Cities of Isle, Mora, Cambridge, North Branch and Pine Technical College in Pine City in preparing applications to the EDA for a variety of projects. In May, 2010, the EDA granted Pine Technical College \$1.44 million for the remodeling and expansion of an existing building on their campus into an Entrepreneurship Center and Technology Business Incubator. Preparation for this expansion is currently underway, with completion expected in late 2011.

The ECRDC has also assisted the Cities of Mora & Cambridge with an EDA grant awarded last year for marketing their industrial parks. Grant applications are currently under consideration by EDA for industrial park infrastructure projects for the Cities of Isle and North Branch (ESSBY Industrial Park) as well.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND (RLF): The ECRDC RLF provides gap financing for businesses looking to open, expand or relocate to Mille Lacs, Pine, Isanti, Chisago & Kanabec Counties. The ECRDC employs the RLF as a tool in recruiting new businesses, maintaining and expanding existing ones, creating and retaining good paying jobs and strengthening the economic base of East Central Minnesota. The ECRDC recently applied to the federal EDA to make this program available Chisago County as well. The RLF currently has 7 loans outstanding, as well as fund on reserve to make new loans.

Toward Zero Death (TZD) Program

The ECRDC completed its 7th year of a traffic safety initiative in Isanti County. This initiative, funded through the Dept. of Public Safety's Safe Roads Program, is aimed at reducing fatal and serious motor vehicle crashes through a community effort. One of the major impacts was the development and implementation of a highly successful Safe Cab program which provides a safe ride home to persons who may be too impaired to drive. This program now has provided rides to more than 4000 persons and is funded through a shared cost program. A couple of other communities now have begun similar programs in their areas (Wright & Otter Tail Counties). A Safe Roads program was also begun through the RDC in Kanabec County.

Transportation Funding

The ECRDC, through the ATP processes, was successful in programming several regional projects with federal transportation funding. For Federal Fiscal Year 2014, seven projects were identified for funding including road, trail, and transit projects. These projects totaled approximately \$1.5 Million. Another major road project was also identified for FY 2015 for the City of Cambridge. In addition, the ECRDC participated in identifying projects for Chisago County in the Metro District. One major project in Chisago County will create a north-south reliever route for TH 8. A functional classification change request was submitted by the ECRDC. This will allow federal funds to be used on this route.

Transit

The ECRDC began a transit coordination study with funds through Mn/DOT. The focus of this study was to document transit needs in the region. This is part of a larger statewide effort to increase transit funding for more local service. The RDC also participates in meetings of the Heartland Express programs in the region. The RDC has advocated for the establishment of public transit in Pine County.

ECRDC has participated in the Northern Lights Express passenger rail alliance meeting to promote rail service between the Twin Cities and Duluth. The RDC coordinated a planning study for station development sites in Region 7E. This study will provide data for the larger environmental study required by the Federal Rail Administration.
