The land must be open and accessible to the public. This appropriation must be matched by at least \$500,000 of non-state money. In addition to the required work program, parcels may not be acquired until parcel lists have been submitted to the legislative commission on Minnesota resources and the commission has approved the parcel list or allowed 60 days to pass.

B. Status of Match Requirement:

PHF: Pheasants Forever's match requirement has been met.

PHF II: Pheasants Forever's match commitment is \$500,000.00 in non-state match. <u>To date, Pheasants</u> Forever has spent \$312,589.66 of the match requirement.

II. PROJECT SUMMARY AND RESULTS:

III. PROGRESS SUMMARY:

Pheasants Forever has been a successful grantee of an additional \$785,000 in non-state funding for the Prairie Wetland Heritage Conservation Initiative. Funding provided through the North American Wetlands Conservation Council by the North American Wetlands Conservation Act will provide additional leverage for LCMR dollars. Pheasants Forever staff have conducted 4 regional meetings with PF Chapters and other conservation partners to inform interested parties about PHF. Exhibit A lists prairie remnant and related acquisitions that are completed, <u>active and proposed for</u> <u>approval by LCMR</u>. Funding requests exceed appropriated funding for PHF, funding will be provided to projects on a first come first serve basis as demand for funds becomes greater than funds available. Projects proposed in Exhibit A that do not receive funding under PHF would roll into PHF II.

IV. OUTLINE OF PROJECT RESULTS:

Result 1: Produce Promotional Materials and Application for Cost Share:

Development and dissemination of PHF brochure and information packet containing application for matching funds for acquisition & development, i.e. procedures, criteria, requirements, etc., in conjunction with the MN DNR and USFWS and other public governmental agencies whom will be the final recipients of deeded PHF acquisitions. If necessary these monies may be sent to accomplish Result 3 – Acquisition.

Goal: Contact directly through regional informational meetings as many interested parties as possible, inform and walk them through the procedures, selection criteria for eligibility, application procedures, etc.

Result 3: Acquisition: Acquisition of remnant prairie grasslands and wetlands. On-going review of PHF projects for acquisition and subsequent submission of parcel lists to LCMR for approval for funding. Consultation and final priority ranking will be conducted in cooperation with MNDNR departments – Natural Heritage Program, SNA, CBS and the Section of Wildlife. Parcels will be purchased by PF Chapters in cooperation with other conservation organizations, PF will hold the property deeds in the interim until donated to the MNDNR or other mutually agreed upon public agency. Permanent deed restrictions will be placed upon properties limiting resale or transfer by the public agency. Professional services incurred by property recipients in the acceptance of said parcels are included within LCMR budget and are exempt from matching requirements. The acquired parcels will not be used for the MN RIM Critical Habitat Match Program.

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VI. CONTEXT:

- A. Significance: Less than 1% of Minnesota's original 18 million acres of Tall Grass Prairie exists today. Nearly 1/3 of the states endangered and threatened plant and animal species inhabit the prairie ecosystem. Preservation of this historic resource which shaped the destiny of our state has largely centered upon the acquisition of large tracts. Each year hundreds of acres of valuable prairie are lost to agricultural, commercial, and residential development. With the loss of each acre, Minnesota comes closer to losing the treat wealth of historic, biological, and educational values the prairie ecosystem provides. Existing prairie relics are the repositories of the plant and animal communities that charted the course of anthropological history in Minnesota. The PHF seeks to preserve and restore small prairie grassland and wetland remnants for public benefit as living classrooms of Minnesota's pioneer heritage. Acquisition of remnant small acreage tracts of the prairie ecosystem will protect and enhance Minnesota's endangered and threatened plant and animal communities. These unique and rare plant and animal communities are valuable environmental education resources. These relics of the Tall Grass Prairie Ecosystem are living history books of Minnesota's economic, social and natural heritage. Acquisition and restoration of these areas will provide for the preservation and enhancement of native plant communities ensuring Minnesota's prairie legacy. The establishment and maintenance of living prairie classrooms will provide a focus for community fund raising and involvement in resource management, preservation and restoration.
- **B. Time:** This project will be completed within the biennium. Future funding for the continuance of the project will be sought from private and public foundations, corporations and individuals in addition to continued community support.
- C. Budget Context: Despite the effort of governmental and private programs which have preserved large acreages of native grasslands hundreds of acres of Tall Grass Prairie remnants are lost annually in Minnesota. Many of these prairie relics have been overlooked by private and government preservation efforts in lieu of larger contiguous tracts. These prairie acreages will serve as living classrooms for communities throughout Minnesota serving as both an education resource and a biological reserve. Community involvement of conservation and other community organizations will ensure continued protection and benefits from these natural treasures. PHF II funds will be transferred to Pheasants Forever as in PHF so that acquisitions may take place in a timely and efficient manner. All interest earned on ETF dollars will be returned to the ETF at the end of the grant period.
