Overall Project Outcome and Results

The goal of this project was to protect, preserve and enhance native prairie and wetland ecosystems in Minnesota. Less than 1% of Minnesota's original 18 million acres of Tall Grass Prairie exists today. Nearly 1/3 of Minnesota's endangered and threatened plant and animal species inhabit the prairie ecosystem. Existing prairie relics are the repositories of the plant and animal communities that charted the course of anthropological history in Minnesota. The PHF has preserved and restored small prairie and wetland remnants for the citizens of Minnesota. Acquisition and enhancement of remnant tracts of the prairie ecosystem protect and enhance Minnesota's endangered and threatened natural communities and ensures Minnesota's prairie legacy.

PHF: Through this 1997 appropriation, Pheasants Forever acquired 2,197 acres of native remnant prairie and associated wetland and upland habitats throughout the prairie region of Minnesota. A total of 19 projects were completed in 11 counties. In addition, 80 acres of prairie habitat were restored. This appropriation was matched with \$742,647 of non-state monies and an additional \$383,600 in non-match dollars.

PHF - continuation: Through this 1999 appropriation, Pheasants Forever acquired 1,486 acres of native remnant prairie and associated wetland and upland habitats throughout the prairie region of Minnesota. A total of 11 projects were completed in 8 counties. In addition, 40 acres of prairie habitat were restored. This appropriation was matched with \$630,544 in non-state monies.

Pheasants Forever was able to leverage federal dollars from the North American Wetlands Conservation Act on tracts that qualified. PF was thus able to stretch trust fund dollars and add value to this project.

Project Results Use and Dissemination

Each tract acquired through the Prairie Heritage Fund has been enrolled into Minnesota's Wildlife Management Area System and is open to public hunting, trapping, bird watching, and other recreational pursuits consistent with the goals of the Wildlife Management Area System.

\$250,000 the first year and \$250,000 the second year are from the trust fund to the commissioner of natural resources for an agreement with Pheasants Forever, Inc. to acquire and develop land for prairie grasslands and wetlands to be donated to the public. The land must be open and accessible to the public. This appropriation must be matched by at least \$500,000 of money. In addition to the required work program, parcels may not be acquired until parcel lists have been submitted to the legislative commission on Minnesota resources and the commission has approved the parcel list or allowed 60 days to pass.

II. FINAL PROJECT SUMMARY

Overall Project Outcome and Results

VI. CONTEXT:

A. Significance: Less than 1% of Minnesota's original 18 million acres of Tall Grass Prairie exists today. Nearly 1/3 of the states endangered and threatened plant and animal species inhabit the prairie ecosystem. Preservation of this historic resource which shaped the destiny of our state has largely centered upon the acquisition of large tracts. Each year hundreds of acres of valuable prairie are lost to agricultural, commercial, and residential development. With the loss of each acre, Minnesota comes closer to losing the treat wealth of historic, biological, and educational values the prairie ecosystem provides. Existing prairie relics are the repositories of the plant and animal communities that charted the course of anthropological history in Minnesota. The PHF seeks to preserve and restore small prairie grassland and wetland remnants for public benefit as living classrooms of Minnesota's pioneer heritage. Acquisition of remnant small acreage tracts of the prairie ecosystem will protect and enhance Minnesota's endangered and threatened plant and animal communities. These unique and rare plant and animal communities are valuable environmental education resources. These relics of the Tall Grass Prairie Ecosystem are living

history books of Minnesota's economic, social and natural heritage. Acquisition and restoration of these areas will provide for the preservation and enhancement of native plant communities ensuring Minnesota's prairie legacy. The establishment and maintenance of living prairie classrooms will provide a focus for community fund raising and involvement in resource management, preservation and restoration.

B. Time: This project was completed within the biennium.

C. Budget Context: Despite the effort of governmental and private programs which have preserved large acreages of native grasslands hundreds of acres of Tall Grass Prairie remnants are lost annually in Minnesota. Many of these prairie relics have been overlooked by private and government preservation efforts in lieu of larger contiguous tracts. These prairie acreages will serve as living classrooms for communities throughout Minnesota serving as both an education resource and a biological reserve. Community involvement of conservation and other community organizations will ensure continued protection and benefits from these natural treasures. PHF II funds will be transferred to Pheasants Forever as in PHF so that acquisitions may take place in a timely and efficient manner. All interest earned on ETF dollars will be returned to the ETF at the end of the grant period.
