1999 Appropriation Language

ML 1999, Chapter 231, Section 16 Subd. 13 (f) Public Boat Access and Fishing Piers \$1,310,000

\$500,000 the first year and \$500,000 the second year are from the trust fund, and \$310,000 is from the future resources fund to the commissioner of natural resources for increased access to lakes and rivers statewide through the provision of public boat access, fishing piers, and shoreline access, with approximately equal allocations for the Twin Cities metropolitan area and the remainder of the state. These appropriations are available until June 30, 2002, at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless an earlier date is specified in the work program. \$212,000 of the appropriation from the future resources fund is available immediately upon enactment.

1998 Appropriation Language

ML 1998, Chapter 404, Section 7,

Subd. 21. Water Access Acquisition and Development

\$2,000,000

For public water access acquisition, development, and rehabilitation on lakes and rivers, including water access through the provision of fishing piers and shoreline access.

PROJECT SUMMARY & RESULTS II.

This program will provide the public with access to lakes and rivers statewide. Access includes fishing piers and boat and shoreline access, and will provide fishing opportunities with or without a boat. Cooperation with local units of government will be emphasized where possible. Local governments often provide land, funds, and/or maintenance and operation of the facilities.

The program includes land acquisition and development of boat access sites, fishing piers, shoreline access. LCMR 1999 funds will be balanced between out state and metro as proving legislation.

Specific projects completed for each appropriation (LCMR and Bonding) are listed in attachats 1 and 2, pages 4-7.

III. OUTLINE OF PROJECT RESULTS:

Result #1: Fishing Piers/Shore Fishing - See attachment 1 for expenditure details.

Attachment 1 on page 4 lists the piers installed, their cost and donations received for each The pier and shore fishing budget is completely expended.

Fishing pier and shore fishing proposals from local governments, angling clubs, and other pseudil be evaluated annually on a competitive basis to determine priorities. Criteria include pheal characteristics such as topography, water depth, and shoreline suitability; biological considerations such as fish type and aquatic vegetation; other considerations such as availed parking and cash match. All projects must be on public land and have a local government cooperator.

Acquisitions will be baad on willing sellers and availability of land suitable for boat access. Emphasis will be placed on the metropolitan area due to the high demand for boating and fishing.

IV. DISSEMINATION:

Local newspaper coverage will keep the public informed of the status and completion of projects. Each new pier and access site was added to statewide maps available free to the public.

V. CONTEXT:

A. Significance:

Fishing piers have unique significance in that they provide angling opportunities for people without a boat including special populations such as persons with disabilities, the elderly, and children. Providing fishing opportunities from fishing piers and shorelines in metropolitan areas will be emphasized because of the benefits offered to large and diverse populations. Shore fishing in the Twin Cities metro area alone provides one-half million hours of fishing during the open water season. Shore fishing has a high minority participation, about 25%, with large lakes accounting for 50% of the fishing by minorities.

Boat access to lakes and rivers continues to be in high demand as evidenced by the high number of boats registered and fishing licenses sold. Research done by the University of Minnesota in 1994 has indicated that two-thirds of the state's boat owners launch a boat at a free public access site at least once each year. In 1997, the state had over 780,000 boats registered and the highest per capita boat ownership in the nation.

B. Time:

All projects funded with LCMR will be completed by June 30, 2002. Projects with 98 Capital funds will be completed by June 30, 2003.

VI. COOPERATION:

Typical commitments from local government cooperators are the provision of land, performance of maintenance, site design assistance, and cash contributions. The fishing pier and shore fishing projects differ in the type and amount of local assistance, but all projects have an emphasis on local cooperation.

VII. LOCATION:

Fishing pier and shore access sites are statewide and priorities are determined annually based on submission by local cooperators and suitability of the site and the lake to sustain fishing. Boat access acquisition and development sites are statewide.

VIII. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

Periodic work program progress reports will be submitted not later than December 1, 1999, December 1, 2000, and December 1, 2001. A final work program report and associated products will be submitted by June 30, 2002, and by June 30, 2003, for Capital.
