#### **Appropriation Language**

\$5,873,000 the first year and \$5,872,000 the second year are from the the trust fund to the Commissioner of Minnesota Natural resources for acceleration of agency programs and cooperative agreements with Minnesota Waterfowl Association, Minnesota Deer Hunters Association, Ducks Unlimited, Inc., National Wild Turkey Federation, Pheasants Forever, The Nature Conservancy, Minnesota Land Trust, Trust for Public Land, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Natural Resources Conservation Service, and the U.S. Forest Service to restore and acquire fragmented landscape corridors that connect areas of quality habitat to sustain fish, wildlife, and plants. Three hundred fifty-two thousand dollars is obligated for program coordination, corridor identification, and mapping. \$3,343,000 is for restoration and management activities in

wildlife management areas, wetland habitats, lakes, wild rice beds, grasslands, and fisheries habitats. \$2,650,000 is for conservation easement programs for riparian, big woods forest, native prairie, and wetland habitats. \$5,400,000 is for acquiring prairie, riparian, other fish and wildlife habitat corridors.

As part of the required work program, criteria and priorities for planned acquisition and restoration activities must be submitted to the Legislative Commission of Minnesota Resources for review and approval. Land acquired with this appropriation must be sufficiently improved to meet at least minimum management standards as determined by the Commissioner of Minnesota Natural Resources. Any land acquired in fee title with funding provided by this appropriation must be designated: (1) as an outdoor recreation unit under Minnesota Statutes, Section 86A.07; or (2) as provided in Minnesota Statutes, Sections 89.018, subdivision 2, paragraph (a): 97A.101; 97A.125; 97C.001; and 97C.001. The Commissioner may so designate any lands acquired in less than fee title. The appropriation is available until June 30, 2004, at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless and earlier date is specified in the work program.

#### II and III Project Summary and Results

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Northern Tallgrass Prairie National Wildlife Refuge promotes preservation and management of a portion of the remaining northern tallgrass prairie and associated habitats occurring throughout 48 counties in western Minnesota. Minnesota's original native prairie is our most endangered ecosystem with less than 1% of it remaining. By linking the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's efforts to those of our partners, we can more successfully protect prairie and also contribute to habitat corridors in Minnesota. The Fish and Wildlife Service received \$500,000 from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund to help acquire land for the Northern Tallgrass Prairie National Wildlife Refuge.

The Fish and Wildlife Service acquired a total of 2,626 acres in fee title and easement in corridor areas 3 (Border Prairie), 6 (Upper Minnesota River), 7 (Alexandria Moraine), and 10 (Southern Lakes) using both matching money and the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund. The total cost was \$1,705,450. Of that, \$1,205,450 was matching money and \$500,000 was from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund. The Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund was specifically used to permanently

protect 336 acres of high quality remnant native prairie.

In area 3 (Border Prairie), we acquired 949 acres (fee and easement) using \$740,875 of matching money and 242 acres (fee-title) using \$270,000 from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund. In area 6 (Upper Minnesota River), we acquired 1,164 acres (fee and easement) using \$349,050 of matching money. Area 7 (Alexandria-Moraine) purchases totaled 168 acres (fee and easement) acquired using \$93,525 of matching money. In area 10 (Southern Lakes), we acquired 9 acres of easement using \$22,000 of matching money and 94 acres of easement using \$230,000 from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund.

Matching funds included both federal Land and Water Conservation Fund money and federal Migratory Bird Conservation Fund (duck stamp) money.

A 242 acre fee title native prairie tract was purchased by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service on November 18, 2002 in Ottertail County for \$270,000. We received a \$270,000 reimbursement from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund to pay for this tract. Matching funds were used to acquire 695.63 acres of easement and 253.58 acres of fee-title property throughout the corridor area. Matching money was provided by the Migratory Bird Conservation Fund (money derived from the sale of duck stamps).

Result 2: Area 6, Upper Minnesota River

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service acquired 1,164 acres of land (fee and easement) within corridor area 6. The total cost for these purchases was \$344,817 from the Migratory Bird Conservation Fund and \$4,233.46 from the Land and Water Conservation Fund.

A 40 acre perpetual prairie easement was purchased by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Kandiyohi County using \$33,200 from the Land and Water Conservation Fund (matching funds) on July 15, 2003. The Fish and Wildlife Service also acquired 128 acres of land within corridor area 7 using \$60,325 from the Migratory Bird Conservation Fund (matching funds).

#### VI Past, Present and Future Spending

#### **Past Spending** Α.

During 2000, prior to the establishment of the LCMR Corridors Project, approximately \$171,787 of Land and Water Conservation Funds were spent for the purchase of four northern tallgrass prairie easements in Minnesota totaling 279 acres. Three of these tracts are located within designated LCMR corridor areas (i.e., Areas 6 (Upper Minnesota River) and 7 (Alexandria-Moraine)).

#### D. **Current and Future Spending**

During 2002 through October 31, 2003, approximately \$1,171,353 of Land and Water Conservation Act funds were spent by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for the purchase of 1,464 acres of remnant northern tallgrass prairie habitat for inclusion in its Northern Tallgrass Prairie National Wildlife Refuge. One thousand three hundred four acres of this prairie habitat is located in Minnesota (Kandiyohi, Rock, Lac Qui Parle, Ottertail, and Lincoln Counties). The remaining 160 acres of this habitat is located in Kossuth County, Iowa.

Appraisals have been requested for the potential acquisition of an additional 2,375 acres of prairie habitat from willing sellers in Minnesota and Iowa. The approximate value of all these purchases is \$2,109,744. One thousand nine hundred sixty four of these acres are located in Minnesota and 1,551 acres of this land is located in LCMR Corridor Areas 3 (Border Prairie), 6 (Upper Minnesota River), or 7 (Alexandria Moraine). The estimated of value of the prairie tracts occurring within these LCMR Corridor Areas is \$897,350.
