

## LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN MINNESOTA AND UNITED STATES

## Women's Labor Force Participation in Minnesota and the United States




The labor force participation rates of women have increased over the decades in Minnesota and the United States.

- From 1960 to 2000, the labor force participation rate of Minnesota women age 16 years and over almost doubled from just over one-third (34.4%) in 1960 to two-thirds (66.0%) in 2000.
- Minnesota labor force participation rates of women age 16 years and over have been higher than the national rates since 1970.
- In 2000, Minnesota had the highest state rate of labor force participation of women in the United States.

## Labor Force Participation of Minnesota Women by Age

Labor force participation rates of Minnesota women varied by age.

- More than three-fifths (63.9%) of young women age 16 to 19 years participated in the labor force in Minnesota in 2000.
- Labor force participation was highest for women age 20 to 54 years. More than four-fifths (82.9%) of women in this age range participated in the labor force in Minnesota in 2000.
- Labor force participation rates were lower for each age group beginning at age 55 years.
   Nearly 7 in 10 (69.5%) women age 55 to 59 years and just under one-half (47.5%) of women age 60 to 64 years participated in the labor force in Minnesota in 2000.
- Just under one-quarter (24.0%) of women age 65 to 69 years and just over 1 in 15 (6.8%) women age 70 years and over participated in the labor force in Minnesota in 2000.
