Dear Speaker Kelliher:

Please be advised that I have received, signed and deposited in the Office of the Secretary of State Chapter 96, House File 2, the omnibus education bill.

At the beginning of session, I proposed to continue to invest in K-12 education by \$198 million despite the historic economic crisis Minnesota confronts. In addition, I also proposed to significantly reform how the K-12 education system operates through a series of reform proposals, such as statewide expansion of Q Comp, Pay for Progress, and the Teaching Transformation Act. Unfortunately, this bill fails to invest in or significantly reform the Minnesota's K-12 education system.

I am also very disappointed by the significant step backward this bill takes by allowing students to graduate from high school for the next five years without demonstrating they have the math skills necessary to succeed in college or work.

I signed this bill with reluctance. The state's K-12 education system is in need of significant reform. This bill, unfortunately, does not meaningfully address that need.
