Minnesota Jobs and Economy

► *Minnesota* ranks 1st in the region and 12th in the nation in annual per capita income.

► *Minnesota* ranks 1st in the region and 9th in the country for median household income.

► *Minnesota* ranks 1st in the country in Fortune 500 companies per capita.

► *Minnesota* is 1st in the region and 13th in the nation in Inc. 500 Companies per capita. The Inc. 500 is made up of the fastest growing private firms in the country.

► *Minnesota* ranks 2nd in the region and 13th among states in the nation for annual pay.

► *Minnesota* is one of 7 states on the 2007 Development Report Card for the States Honor Roll, earning A's in economic performance and development capacity, and a B in business vitality.

► *Minnesota* ranks 3rd in the region and 9th in the nation for the number of patents issued to state residents and companies.

► *Minnesota* ranks 1st in the region and 3rd in the nation for the number of international patent applications.

► MarketWatch ranks Minneapolis-St. Paul 1st among metro centers for businesses.

Minnesota Quality of Life

- ► *Minnesota* ranks 4th as America's most livable state for 2008. *Minnesota* has ranked in the top four every year since 1996.
- ▶ *Minnesota* has the 9th lowest rate of poverty in the nation for 2007.
- ► *Minnesota* is ranked 2nd in the nation in child wellbeing for 2007.
- ► *Minnesota* ranked 1st in the nation in 2007 for volunteerism as measured as the percentage of people who volunteered during a three-year period.
- ► Minneapolis-Saint Paul are rated the 3rd best metropolitan area in the country for fishing. (Population over 200,000 people.)
- Minnesota's transportation technology such as highway sensors and electronic surveillance of intersections – earned the state 1st place in innovative transportation solutions, according to *Popular Science*. Minnesota also ranked fourth in energy technology.
- ▶ The Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport ranked 16th in passenger traffic and 12th in number of aircraft operations for United States airports in 2008. The airport served more than 34 million passengers and accommodated 450,044 landings and takeoffs.
- ▶ Minneapolis-St. Paul International has been recognized as the 3rd best airport in the world among airports serving 25 to 40 million passengers a year. MSP also ranks as the Best Airport in North America in that size category.
- ► *Minnesota* ranks 8th in the nation in the number of people per capita covered by long term care insurance.

Minnesota Public Safety

▶ *Minnesota's* crime rate has decreased 4.1 percent from 2002 to 2006, ranking the state at 31st nationally; Minnesota's population rate rank is 21. The crime rate is based on the seven index offenses of murder, robbery, assault, rape, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft reported to law enforcement.

► *Minnesota* ranks 37th in per capita spending on state and local corrections at \$140, compared to \$200 nationally.
