	SEIU LOCAL	INTERVENTION BY 284 KIDS FIRST MN, RN, TERRY BICKNELL,

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry

Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall seek to intervene in this matter as Petitioners/Intervenors pursuant to

Minn. R. Civ. P. 24.01 and 24.02.

Rule 24.01 authorizes SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and

Rebecca Hall to intervene as of right due to their interest in the temporary funding of core

functions - in particular, the provision of childcare for vulnerable families through the Child

Care Assistance Program (CCAP). Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, Rebecca Hall, and other

childcare providers members of SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN receive CCAP funds - which are

a combination of Federal and State monies - to provide essential childcare services to families

across Minnesota. Without funding from CCAP, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, Rebecca Hall,

and other members of SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN will likely have to close their childcare

facilities. Closure of those childcare facilities will mean that the parents of the children now

receiving care will probably either quit their jobs and risk becoming homeless or leave their children alone or in unsafe environments so the parents can work. In short, the disposition of the above-captioned matter – absent intervention – may impair the ability of SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall to protect their interests. <u>See, e.g.,</u> <u>Halverson ex rel. Halverson v. Taflin, 617 N.W.2d 448 (Minn. Ct. App. 2000) (permitting intervention under Rule 24.01).</u>

SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall should also be allowed to intervene, pursuant to Rule 24.02, because their claims present both questions of law and of fact common to the claims of Minnesota Attorney General Lori Swanson and Governor Mark Dayton. <u>See, e.g., Snyder's Drug St., Inc. v. Minnesota St. Bd. of Pharm.</u>, 221 N.W.2d 162 (Minn. 1974) (allowing intervention under Rule 24.02). In addition, the proposed intervention will not unduly delay or prejudice the adjudication of the existing parties' rights. Moreover, the Minnesota Attorney General does not object to the requested intervention and, indeed, her Petition in the above-captioned matter notes that the childcare services at issue here were designated as a core function in connection with the government shutdown in 2005.

Absent objection by an existing party within 30 days after service of this Notice of Intervention , the intervention by SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall will be deemed accomplished under Minn. R. Civ. P. 24.03. In the event of a timely objection, SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall will move the Court for leave to intervene in this action and to assert claims and arguments outlined in the Proposed Petition. Pursuant to Rule 24.03, SEIU Local 284 Kids First MN, Sharon Born, Terry Bicknell, and Rebecca Hall have filed and served their Proposed Petition with their Notice of Intervention.
