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Thank you for taking time to review the 2013 Annual Report of the East Central Regional Development Commission. Each year the Commission prepares a report that lists its accomplishments toward fulfill-

ing the ECRDC's mission. This report includes the programs, projects, and related financial information for the period starting on July 1, 2012 and ending on June 30, 2013.

This report shows the past fiscal year was filled with a number of exciting activities and accomplishments that collectively kept the region moving ahead. Highlights of the year included the April groundbreaking of the new federal EDA-funded Technology Business Incubator at Pine Technical College. Our Senior Resource Center embarked on a new partnership with the United Way to implement the USDA Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) for eligible seniors in the region; the Community Development Department assisted Mille Lacs County in developing a County Comprehensive Plan; and our Transportation Department worked extensively with the various local units of government and MnDOT to verify and update the state's database of roads in our region which will be quite useful when considering funding for future preservation and expansion projects. As always, the Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) program assisted a number of small businesses in financing their startup and/or expansion initiatives.

This year the Commission welcomed two new staff members - Frances Nelson of the East Central Senior Resource Center and Finance Officer Tammie Bremer. We also said farewell to outgoing Commission members Princeton Mayor Jeremy Riddle, Isanti County Commissioner George Larson, Mille Lacs County Commission Jack Edmonds, Rush City School Board Member Channa Tastides, and Pine County Public Interest Representative Fred Leher. The Commission is forever grateful for their commitment and support over the years.

New Commission members include Mille Lacs County Commissioner Genny Reynolds, Princeton City Councilmember Thom Walker, Isanti County Commissioner Greg Anderson, and Pine County Public Interest Representative Lynn Zeleny. A hearty welcome to our new members!

The success of the Commission would not be possible without the hard work and dedication of our Commission members, the various advisory committees, volunteers, program partners, and our hardworking staff. Many, many thanks to all of you!

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

VALUE ADDED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INITIA-**TIVES:** The ECRDC provided local assistance to various economic development groups and local government.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIPS: The ECRDC partners regularly with the following organizations: Cambridge Development Alliance, East Central Minnesota Workforce Partnership, Central MN Workforce Investment Board, Central MN Housing Partnership, ECMN Business Services Board, GPS 45:93 and City / County Administrators & Economic Development Professionals. Example of positive results gleaned from these meetings include: developing a regional brand, marketing initiatives, regional business assistance directory, and a regional website.



SCORE: The ECRDC continues to market their satellite office of the St. Cloud chap-

ter of SCORE. SCORE provides one-on-one counseling to entrepreneurs and those wanting to start a business on a variety of topics free-of-charge. SCORE also facilitates business related educational classes to assist entrepreneurs with sharpening their business skills.

COMMUNITY PLANNING: The ECRDC is assisting Mille Lacs Co. in creating their new Comprehensive Plan, as well as consulted with and assisted several local units of government with updates of their planning tools.

GPS 45:93 COLLABORATION: The ECRDC continues its



economic development partnership with the GPS 45:93 in attracting high technol-GPS:45:93 ogy firms to Region 7E. Projects this past year include the the marketing of their

"virtual business incubator" to assist entrepreneurs.

In partnership with GPS 45:93, the ECRDC facilitated a regional small business Financial Resource Summit on Tuesday, June 25th at Spring Brook Golf Course in Mora, MN. The focus of this Financial Resource Summit was to link business leaders and entrepreneurs with service providers and resources to assist them in growing their business. Presentations were given to 60+ attendees by representatives of the Initiative Foundation, the Minnesota Department of Employment & Economic Development (DEED), the US Small Business Administration, the MN Small Business Development Center (SBRC), Central MN Jobs and Training Services (CMJTS) and others.



After 4+ years after the initial grant application was submitted, ground was broken for the Pine Technical College Business Incubator on April 3, 2013.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

CITY / COUNTY CLERKS, ADMINISTRATORS & ECO-NOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROFESSIONALS MEETINGS:

The ECRDC organizes a City Administrator meeting quarterly to discuss mutual key issues occurring in the Region 7E communities. Past topics include financing opportunities for local units of government and business, grants and financing for infrastructure improvement, and regional marketing initiatives. The City Administrator meetings have evolved into a best practices approach to city economic development. Issues and speakers are selected that will provide insight that will assist local governments with solving key issues in zoning, planning, economic development, and housing.

MICRO LOAN FUND: The ECRDC has partnered with their sister Regional Development Commission, Region Five Development Commission based in Staples, MN, in creating and micro-lending program to serve the ten counties served by our two Regional Development Commissions. This micro-loan fund was created by the USDA Rural Development's Rural Microentrepreneur Assitance Program (RMAP). This micro-loan fund nicely complements our EDA Revolving Loan Fund, Currently, there have been two loans approved and closed on from this fund in Region 7E.

REGION 7E CEDS / EDA PROGRAM: In spring, 2011, the ECRDC was asked by the St. Cloud Area Economic Development Partnership (SCAEDP), manager of the Federal EDA / CEDS program for Region 7W (Benton, Sherburne, Stearns and Wright Counties), to take over management of this program and work towards EDA Economic Development District (EDD) status for two years upon the voluntary closure of the SCAEDP at the end of April, 2011, and work towards creating a permanent home for this program within Region 7W. The annual CEDS Update was submitted to EDA in December, 2012.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND (RLF): The ECRDC RLF provides gap financing for businesses looking to open, expand or relocate to Mille Lacs, Pine, Isanti, Chisago & Kanabec Counties. The ECRDC employs the RLF as a tool in recruiting new businesses, maintaining and expanding existing ones, creating and retaining good paying jobs and strengthening the economic base of East Central Minnesota. The Federal EDA recently approved the RLF lending to Chisago County Businesses. The RLF currently has 11 loans outstanding.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRAT-

EGY (CEDS) / EDA PLANNING GRANT: The ECRDC is implementing our five year CEDS. The CEDS catalogs the region's currently and historical demographics and economic conditions, identifies weaknesses and threats, and identifies strategies that have the potential to help mitigate these roadblocks to the region's prosperity.

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) process is designed to guide the economic growth of the region. The CEDS is required in order to qualify for Economic Development Administration (EDA) Planning Grant Assistance under its public works, economic adjustment, and most planning programs; and is a prerequisite for designation by EDA as an economic development district (EDD). Multiple surveys were conducted of local government and community leaders for completion on projects in process, and future infrastructure, housing, and economic development needs that may require EDA assistance.

The ECRDC assisted Pine Technical College in Pine City in preparing applications to the EDA, and in May, 2010, the EDA granted Pine Technical College \$1.44 million for the remodeling and expansion of an existing building on their campus into an Entrepreneurship Center and Tech

JOB OPPORTUNITY BUILDING ZONES (JOBZ) AWARDS:

The ECRDC is the JOBZ Administrator for Region 7E. There are currently 13 JOBZ projects in Region 7E. Approximately half of the 1,486 acres zoned JOBZ has been awarded. According to State records, JOBZ will have cre-

ated 414 jobs and retained 219 more in Region 7E. These thirteen businesses will have invested over \$56.4 million in these facilities, and have an annual payroll of over \$22.4 million dollars. For more information, see our website: www.ecrdc.org.



nology Business Incubator. This project has subsequently been awarded a supplemental EDA grant, bring the EDA's investment in the project to just under \$1.8 million. Ground was broken on the project on Thursday, April 3rd, 2013, with US Congressman Rick Nolan speaking. Construction is currently underway, and it is anticipated that the project will be completed and the incubator will begin operation in late 2013.

The East Central Senior Resource Center serves older adults, their families, the communities where they reside, and the providers of the services and programs they access. The mission —Fostering development of and access to resources for older adults in East Central Minnesotal, sums up the work of the East Central Senior Resource Center (ECSRC).

The paid staff of the ECSRC includes director Penny Simonsen, outreach coordinators Amy Tvedt and Frances Nelson, and caregiver consultants Jayne Mund, Anita Sparks, and Lynda Hayek. Volunteer staff remain vital to the work of the agency. Sixteen volunteer staff assist with every aspect of the day-in-day -out work of the ECSRC.

In 1965 the U.S. Congress enacted legislation known as the Older American's Act. The Act authorizes Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to fund local public and nonprofit organizations to develop/expand ser-vices for persons over 60. Through a contract with the Central Minnesota Council on Aging, the ECSRC provides services through three broad program areas: development of senior programs; caregiver services; and information, referral and assistance services.

Information, Referral and Assistance Services

The ECSRC is part of a statewide network known as the Senior LinkAge Line[®]--a telephone based information and assistance service. Trained staff assist clients in locating a variety of services. Staff provides one-on -one assistance with accessing prescription drug programs (including Medicare Part D), understanding medical bills, insurance claims and Medicare coverage. The individualized help is objective and confidential. The information, referral and assistance services at the ECSRC responded to over 3,600 callers.

In addition to the phone-based work, over forty presentations were offered on a variety of topics including teaching older adults the basics of computer use and navigating the internet to access information-including about Medicare. The "New to Medicare" classes provide planning assistance for people approaching their 65th birthday, and preparing to enroll in Medicare. Published yearly the ECSRC resource guide contains information about many of the ser-

vices available in the region. ECSRC staff also assisted over 200 individuals in the application for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).



Caregiver Services

The ECSRC expanded the amount of caregiver counseling services available to caregivers throughout the region. Caregiver consultants offer help to caregivers to manage and live their life while caring for another person, offers caregivers expert advice, assists caregivers to develop their unique personal action plan, connects caregivers to community resources, helping them see all available options and helps caregivers identify strategies and solutions to remain as a caregiver longer. Over 200 caregivers were served, and more than 1200 hours of direct client contact reported.

Resource Guide-



A Listing of Services for Older Adults Each year the ECSRC publishes a resource guide containing information about services available to seniors in the region. Copies of the resource guide are available through the Center and many locations throughout the region.

The guide, supported by paid advertisement offer local service providers an opportunity to financially support the well-recognized publication. Service provider listings remain free of charge as a public service of the Center. Over 6,000 copies were distributed last year to older adults and their families.



Development of Senior Programs

Senior service provider networks in each county offer an opportunity for providers of aging services from government, non-profit and for-profit sectors to come together. The networking events, while informal in nature, offer opportunities for new partnerships and more communication between service providers and development of new services. Over 250 persons participated in the monthly events.

The State of Minnesota through the MN Dept. of Human Services has funding available to agencies, businesses and organizations through the Community Services/ Service Development (CS/SD) funds—with the intent of the resources to be put toward assisting older adults to remain independently in their communities longer and thus reducing the rate of nursing home admissions by increasing the avail-ability of community-based services. The ECSRC worked closely with agencies, businesses and organizations to submit applications for CS/SD and other appropriate funding to develop new senior communitybased services in the five county region.

The ECSRC offers services tailored to older adults (and their families) who may beginning to exhibit signs of being at risk for nursing home placement. Staff work closely with individuals to help find services that best fit the individual's life style and budget. This type of work is conducted by the Senior LinkAge Line staff and the caregiver consultants.



TRANSPORTATION

Transportation Funding

The ECRDC assists Mn/DOT with implementation of the Federal Transportation Bill. In Region 7E the ECRDC solicits eligible federal projects in four of the five counties in the service area. The ECRDC has adopted a two- year solicitation process for federal projects. Last year the RDC programmed local projects totaling more than \$4 Million dollars. The projects included transit, road and bridge categories. Projects were review and approved by the Commission before being submitted to the ATPs in District 3 and Metro Division.

ECRDC participated in meetings relative to the improvement of Highway 70 in Pine County. One of the meetings included Congressman Nolan and the



Commissioner of Transportation, Charles Zelle.

Statewide Projects

The ECRDC assists MN/DOT in implementation of statewide activities. During this past year, RDC staff conducted a mileage verification project in the region. We verified many segments of roadways for the MN/DOT database. Most of the segments were on township roads. We reviewed roadway surface type, Jurisdiction and whether or not it was a public road (according to federal definition criteria). To date, four of the five counties have been completed and work has begun with the last county's project.

The RDC has also been participating in meetings relative to the implementation of the federal transportation bill. Staff has participated on a Local Program Team to provide input to Mn/DOT on several programs including the newly formed Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP).

Transportation Advisory Committee

The ECRDC coordinates a regional transportation advisory committee which provides recommendations to the Commission on transportation matters such as local projects for funding or functional classification changes. The Committee is comprised of members from all five counties.

Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) Program

The ECRDC is now in its tenth year of traffic safety initiatives in Isanti County. The Mission of the Isanti TZD Coalition is to reduce fatal and serious motor vehicle crashes. This initiative is supported with funds through the Office of Traffic Safety of the Minnesota Dept. of Public Safety. The coalition is involved with supporting the law enforcement mobilizations such as Click It or Ticket seat belt campaign and Impaired Driving enforcement wave. One significant accomplishment has been the successful implementation and continuation of the Isanti County Safe Cab program. Each year, approximately 1000 passengers are transported safely home from local bars in the program. This provides a number of benefits including safer roads, saving of law enforcement hours in processing DWI arrests, and less court and incarceration costs for the county.

The Safe Cab program is a unique collaboration between private business and local and regional government. Safe Cab has enabled Isanti County to achieve one of the highest reduction -of-DWIs in Minnesota over the past few years. With more than 8000 riders since the program began, the Isanti Safe Cab program is one model for other rural communities in Minnesota.

Northern Lights Express

Staff has participated in meetings advocating for the NLX passenger rail service through Region 7E.

Northern Lights Express (NLX) is a proposed passenger rail project between the Minneapolis Transportation Interchange station and the City of Duluth, along Highway 65 and Interstate 35.

The proposed passenger rail service will:

- Offer 2 1/4 hour service between Minneapolis and Duluth with top speeds of 110 mph;
- Spur approximately \$2 billion in development along the 155 mile corridor;
- Encourage about 13,800 jobs; and
- Provide an environmental sound alternative to auto mobiles that can be used for business and tourism.




