Subject: Annual Report on Obsolete, Unnecessary or Duplicative Rules

Dear Governor Dayton, Senators, Representatives, and Revisor Timmons:

Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5, directs the Board of Psychology to report each year to the governor, the Legislative Coordinating Commission, the policy and funding committees, and the revisor of statutes, a list of rules or portions of rules that are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules.

The Board of Psychology recently executed rulemaking to comprehensively revise Minnesota Rules chapter 7200. These new rules went into effect on January 29, 2013. The Board of Psychology has reviewed its rules and found no others that have become obsolete, unnecessary or duplicative over the course of the last year.
