Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5, directs the Minnesota Department of Corrections to report to you by December 1 of each year whether any of its rules are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules.


The Minnesota Department of Corrections has previously declared its intention to amend Minnesota Rules, Chapter 2945 relating to inspection/operation of municipal jail facilities; that rule revision is now in its final stages.

Additionally, the following Minnesota Rules continue to be under review by the department's Inspection and Enforcement Unit:

- Chapter 2900, New Corrections Facilities
