Message from the Director:

Fiscal year 2014 was the fifth year that the Lake Region Arts Council received Arts & Cultural Heritage funding. This additional source of funding has made a huge impact on the grants and services we offered our constituents. Please note that we have split our reporting into two separate focuses, one for the Base Legislative appropriate and one for the Arts & Cultural Heritage funding, to more easily report the differences between the two sources of funding.

We are excited and encouraged to have this opportunity to report on the growth that the Lake Region Arts Council has experienced this past year.

2014 Lake Region Arts Council activities:

- The LRAC partnered with VSA to offer a special Legacy grant to arts organizations for increasing their handicap accessibility.
- The LRAC awarded Arts Legacy City Grants to Battle Lake, bringing the number of cities in the LRAC region, receiving the designation of "Arts Legacy City" to eight. These cities have changed their city government structure to include an arts advisory committee.
- This year the LRAC Board approved a strategic, long range goal of broadening our concept of providing grants and services. The Board is supportive of the concept that LRAC is part of a statewide arts support system and more emphasis will be placed on connecting artists and arts organizations in our region with statewide resources, not just what is available through LRAC. The FY14 activities that support this goal are; planning for the Aug. 16, 2014 Arts Resource Fair, a leadership role in the "Stronger Together" statewide meetings, instituting a customer relationship management system, and exploration of how to work more effectively with our statewide partners such as Springboard for the Arts, MSAB and the McKnight Foundation.

This year 64% of the requests were funded, the same as in FY 13 and 56% of the dollars requested were funded, up from 49% in FY13.

These figures indicate that we are not able to sufficiently meet the need that exists. This inability to adequately fund the requests we receive has existed since these statistics have been tracked beginning in 1999.

OTHER SERVICES

In addition to the Grant Programs, the LRAC provided the following services and programs:

Website: The LRAC website has seen a significant increase in its usage this year. All grant applicants are now directed to our website to access our online grant application process. Visitors to the website may access any of your services such as the Arts Calendar, Artist Registry, Newsletter, Workshop registration and information on our Galleries. Constituents reported in the satisfaction survey that they highly value this resource.

Arts Calendar: An online, interactive, searchable listing of arts events and opportunities for artists and arts organizations. There have been 12,298 page views in FY14 down from 13,166 views in FY 13.

Monthly newsletter: Based on responses to our needs assessment survey and a significant drop in the number of "opens" for our monthly newsletter, we did a total redesign. We have received great feedback on the changes and our readership has increased tremendously. The monthly newsletter, Art Headlines was sent via email to a mailing list of 1,487 households compared to 1,124 households in FY 13. An issue of the Art Headlines is included with this report. (Attachment C).

Facebook: LRAC's Facebook page helps help promote our grants, services and arts activities. The Facebook Page also appears on our website and has a viewership of over 211,000 individuals, the same as in FY 13, plus the page now has 4,894 "likes" up from 3,421 in FY 13. We have been extremely pleased with the effectiveness of our Facebook campaign. Facebook has increase traffic to our website and our grants application online system.

Artist Registry: Through the LRAC website artists can now apply and upload work sample images online. The Artist Registry may now be accessed and searched by the public online. There have been 6,917 page views in FY 14, compared to 4,759 page views in FY13. At the end of FY 14 there were 156 individual artists listed.

Technical Assistance: The LRAC staff provided technical assistance and site visits to arts organizations in and beyond the region. This assistance was offered through consulting in the office, site visits, and by phone.

Workshops: The LRAC provided ten grant writing workshops, one prior to every grant round. The LRAC, provided the following workshops in FY14, Financial Assessment & Planning, Presenting 101, The Fringe Festival Info Session, MSAB Folk Art, and a Bus Trip to The Textile Center.

BIENNIAL PLAN FY 14-15 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The LRAC goals, as specified in the FY 14-15 Biennial Work Plan, regarding both the Base Legislative appropriation and the Arts and Cultural Heritage funding, are dealt with separately in this final report. Each of the two work plans has a corresponding outcome evaluation report. The base legislative appropriation work plan and outcome evaluation is presented first, pages 7-9, followed by the Arts and Cultural Heritage work plan and outcome evaluation on pages 10-12.

These goals are in addition to the ongoing provision of grant programs, technical assistance, and other services such as grant writing workshops, the monthly newsletter, resource information, and technical services.

Biennial Goals FY 2014-15, Base Legislative Appropriation:

Five goals with accompanying objectives were adopted to accomplish our mission and address the organizational and individual artist needs through our base legislative appropriation.

I. Goal: Provide financial and technical support to artists.

Objective A: Provide Career Development, Artist Quick Start, and Fellowship grants to individual artists.

Objective B: Offer artist registry, Art Headlines newsletter, resource library, LRAC Gallery, LRAC website, and workshops for artists.

Objective C: Increase regional awareness of LRAC grants and services.

II. Goal: Provide financial and technical support to organizations.

Objective A: Offer Project, Operating Support, and Organizational Small grants to organizations.

Objective B: Offer artist registry, Art Headlines newsletter, resource library, LRAC website, and workshops for organizations.

Objective C: Increase regional awareness of LRAC grants and services.

III. Goal: Maintain strong communication between LRAC and the MN Legislature.

Objective A: Keep region's Legislators informed about current activities and issues.

Objective B: Support Arts Advocacy Day.

Objective C: Maintain memberships in Minnesota Citizens for the Arts and Americans for the Arts.

IV. Goal: Respond pro-actively to increases in requests for grants and services

Objective A: Implement a multi-faceted funding plan that include earned income strategies.

Objective B: Investigate the best use of available technology and implement when appropriate.

V. Goal: Act as responsible stewards of public funds.

Objective A: In FY 14-15 work with our arts delivery partners to develop a strategic plan for best use of the amendment funding, based on feedback from the state's citizens.

Objective B: Develop methods to increase our system's level of accountability, including but not limited to peer review, checks and balances, and public involvement.

Objective C: Maintain a strong and highly functional Board of Directors.

Outcome Evaluation Base Legislative Appropriation:

- I. Goal: Provide financial and technical support to artists.
- II. Goal: Provide financial and technical support to organizations.

A. In FY14 and FY15, of those receiving grants and services from the LRAC, 75% will indicate that their project was artistically successful, reached the target constituency and had community impact. This will be measured by the final reports.

Results: 100% of the grantees indicated that their projects met or exceeded their project goals to be artistically successful, reach the target constituency and have community impact.

III. Goal: Maintain strong communication between LRAC and the MN Legislature.

A. In FY14 and FY15 their will be at least 5 staff and constituent interactions with each of the LRAC legislators. This will be measured by letters, emails and phone calls from staff and constituents, attendance at Arts Advocacy Day and responses to calls for action from Minnesota Citizens for the Arts.

Results: There were 22 direct contacts with legislators. Announcements of grants awarded in their districts after each grant round, monthly newsletters, invitation to April 2014 Big Check event, Arts Advocacy Day and a post Arts Advocacy Day thank you card.

IV. Goal: Respond pro-actively to increases in requests for grants and services

A. In FY14 and FY 15 LRAC will continue implementing new funding source strategies with a goal of adding a minimum of \$5,000 in extra revenue per biennium year.

Results: In FY 14, LRAC generated earned income of \$2,540 from its Six Word Short Story writing contest.

B. In FY14, the LRAC will achieve a 95% rate of online grant submissions vs. paper grant submissions. This will be measured by the LRAC data base.

Results: 100% online grant submissions vs. paper grants was achieved in FY14. In addition, final reports are now submitted online.

(cont.) Outcome Evaluation Base Legislative Appropriation:

V. Goal: Act as responsible stewards of public funds.

A. In FY14 and FY15, 75% of constituents will signify a satisfaction level of acceptable to superior when asked if the LRAC has acted as responsible stewards of the public funds they administer. This will be measured by a constituent survey.

Results: Based on FY13 Needs Survey, 95% reported they felt LRAC had either, achieved, exceeded, or highly exceeded accountability as responsible stewards of the public funds they administer.

Biennial Goals FY 2014-15, Arts and Cultural Heritage fund:

Five goals with accompanying objectives were adopted to accomplish our mission and address the organizational and individual artist needs through our Arts and Cultural Heritage fund.

I. Goal: <u>Increase Access to the Arts</u> by supporting Minnesota artists and arts organizations in creating, producing, and presenting high-quality arts activities; to overcome barriers to accessing high-quality arts activities; and to instill the arts into the community and public life in this state.

Objective A: Provide financial support to eligible individual artists and organizations for activities that support access to the arts.

II. Goal: <u>Increase Art Education</u> by supporting life long learning and appreciation of the arts, including but not exclusive to K-12 activities.

Objective A: Provide financial support to eligible individual artists and organizations for activities that support life long Arts Education.

III. Goal: <u>Increase Arts &Cultural Heritage activities</u> by supporting events and activities that represent the diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions, including folk and traditional artists and art organizations, represented in this state.

Objective A: Provide financial support to eligible individual artists and organizations for activities that support arts and cultural heritage.

IV. Goal: <u>Provide Services and Support</u> to individuals and organizations that provide arts activities in our region.

Objective A: Provide Publicity/Public Awareness services to support and increase the visibility and understanding of the arts.

Objective B: Provide networking opportunities to share best practices and build relationships.

Objective C: Provide workshops to increase knowledge and expertise of individual artists and organizations.

Objective D: Provide individualized support through one on one meetings with LRAC staff to explore how to best utilize Arts & Cultural Heritage funds.

Objective E: Offer an "Event Insurance" program to encourage the presentation of new/ experimental events and artists. Program insures that organizations/artist will not lose money on an event.

V. Goal: <u>Achieve Accountability of Arts and Culture Fund</u> by acting as responsible stewards of pubic funds.

Objective A: Work with our arts delivery partners to develop and refine a strategic plan for best use of the amendment funding, based on feedback from the state's citizens.

Objective B: Develop methods to increase our system's level of accountability, including but not limited to: peer review, checks and balances, and public involvement.

Objective C: Maintain a strong and highly functional Board of Directors

Outcome Evaluation Arts and Cultural Heritage fund:

- **I. Goal:** <u>Increase Access to the Arts</u> by supporting Minnesota artists and arts organizations in creating, producing, and presenting high-quality arts activities; to overcome barriers to accessing high-quality arts activities; and to instill the arts into the community and public life in this state.
- **II. Goal:** <u>Increase Art Education</u> by supporting life long learning and appreciation of the arts, including but not exclusive to K-12 activities.
- **III. Goal:** <u>Increase Arts &Cultural Heritage activities</u> by supporting events and activities that represent the diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions, including folk and traditional artists and art organizations, represented in this state.

For Goals I, II, III:

A. In FY14, of those receiving grants and services from the LRAC, 75% will indicate that their project was artistically successful, reached the target constituency, and had community impact. This will be measured by the final reports.

Results: Overall, of those who have completed final reports, 80-90% felt the project's goals were either met or exceeded.

IV. Goal: <u>Provide Services and Support</u> to individuals and organizations that provide arts activities in our region.

A. In FY14, the LRAC will provide publicity/public awareness services to minimum of 15 grant recipients. This will result in an increased awareness of the arts in the LRAC region. This will be measured by staff tracking of publicity releases.

Results: Through the LRAC newsletter, arts calendar, Face Book , publicity releases, and website, LRAC provided publicity for 36 grant recipients.

B. In FY 14-15 the LRAC will provide resources for arts organizations and artists to attend a minimum of 2 networking opportunities with 75% attendees responding that they were impacted favorable.

Results: LRAC helped convene a "Stronger Together" meeting for arts organizations to network, and hosted three networking meetings for area textile and fiber artists.

(cont.) Outcome Evaluation Arts and Cultural Heritage fund:

IV. Goal: Provide Services and Support to individuals and organizations that provide arts activities in our region.

C. In FY 14-15 LRAC will provide resources for arts organizations and artists to attend a minimum of 2 workshop opportunities, through scholarships or by holding workshops, with 75% attendees responding that they were impacted favorable. This will be measured by an exit survey.

Results: In FY14, LRAC offered a Financial Assets & Planning workshop, a Presenting 101 for presenting arts organizations and a field trip to The Textile Center. Of the 38 participants responding to post surveys, 80-100% responded either good or excellent to the following questions:

*My expectations of the workshop were met.

*My knowledge has increased as a result of this workshop.

*I feel I will be able to apply what I have learned.

D. In FY 14-15 there will be a minimum of 20 individual support meetings held with constituents interested in the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund, 75% of constituents will indicate that these meetings were beneficial. This will be measured by a constituent survey.

Results: In FY14, there were 181 individual support meetings by appointment and by phone with constituents interested in the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund compared to 170 in FY13. In FY14 90% felt that the support was highly beneficial.

E. In FY 14 and FY 15 at least 2 organizations will take advantage the Event Insurance program, resulting in two new or experimental productions. This will be measured by Event Insurance Final report.

Results: In FY 14 one artist took advantage of the Event Insurance program. Due to lack of interest in FY 15 the program will be discontinued.

V. Goal: Achieve Accountability of Arts and Culture Fund by acting as responsible stewards of public funds.

A. In FY14-15, 75% of constituents will signify a satisfaction level of acceptable to superior when asked if the LRAC has acted as responsible stewards of the public funds they administer. This will be measured by a constituent survey.

Results: Based on the FY13 Needs survey, of the constituents surveyed, 95% reported they felt LRAC had either achieved, exceeded, or highly exceeded as responsible stewards of the public funds they administer.
