Status of the Fishery (as of 08/18/2003)

Walleye were fairly abundant in McFarland Lake in 2003, although their average size was small for a lake of this type. All the walleye taken in 2003 had been produced naturally, with good year classes in 2001, 2000, and 1998. Walleye growth rates had been slow for younger fish, probably because yellow perch abundance appeared to have been at a historic low in this lake in 2003.

Northern pike abundance and size appeared to have been about average for a lake of this type, and for this lake historically. Most of the northern pike catch consisted of two and three-year-old fish. Growth rates had been fast, probably due to the presence of some small lake whitefish and northern cisco.

Smallmouth bass were abundant and large, compared to similar lakes. McFarland Lake has consistently supported a high-quality smallmouth bass population. Their good average size in 2003 was due mostly to their fast growth; fish averaged 12.4 inches in length at the end of their fourth year, compared to an average length of 9.4 inches at that age in other lakes in this area.
