

## Introduction

The Minnesota State Grant program is a need-based financial aid program created to assist Minnesota resident undergraduates attending public and private postsecondary institutions in Minnesota. The program was first established in 1969 and in Fiscal Year 2015 awarded approximately \$177 million in grants to approximately 95,324 students. The program is designed to complement the Federal Pell Grant program and provide choice and access to undergraduate students to attend the postsecondary institutions that best meet their needs.

Since 1983, Minnesota State Grant policy has been based on the Design for Shared Responsibility model. This model was initially built on the work of the Carnegie Commission on Policy Studies in Higher Education. The goal of the program is established in Minnesota Statute 136A.095:


The legislature finds and declares that the identification of men and women of the state who are economically disadvantaged and the encouragement of their educational development in eligible institutions of their choosing are in the best interests of the state and of the students.

This policy statement guides Minnesota policymakers in responding to changes in tuition and fees and living expenses faced by students. State Grant policy distributes the price of postsecondary education based on family income and attendance choices among students, families and taxpayers.

This report contains data on the number and dollar amounts of Minnesota State Grants received by Minnesota undergraduate students for Fiscal Year 2015 (July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015). Minnesota State Grants are coordinated with federal Pell Grants, therefore the tables and graphs include combined federal Pell and State Grant awards received by State Grant recipients. Data are reported by the adjusted gross income of the student's family. The report also includes information on three categories of student characteristics that affect State Grant awards: dependency status/family circumstances, institution choice and registration load. All tables and charts in this report show family adjusted gross income of Minnesota State Grant recipients as reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) from the federal income tax return. For dependent students, the parents' adjusted gross income was used; for independent students, the student's (and spouse's if married) adjusted gross incomes were used.

The data in this report are based on State Grant research data as of January 4, 2016. The totals may differ slightly from other documents published by the Minnesota Office of Higher Education as a result of adjustments made before or after this date.


**Family Adjusted Gross Income** 

Students applying for financial aid complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA asks students and their parents to supply information regarding wages, income, assets and household composition. This information is used as part of a federal need analysis formula called Federal Methodology that determines the student's and parents' financial resources expected to be contributed toward college costs. The formula calculates an expected Parent Contribution (PC), an expected Student Contribution (SC) and an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) which are used to determine the student's eligibility for federal student aid and, in Minnesota, the student's eligibility for the Minnesota State Grant program.

For Fiscal Year 2015 (academic year 2014-2015), 160,257 students completed the FAFSA and met eligibility requirements for a Minnesota State Grant. As compared to the prior year, total applications declined by 8.6 percent. Sixty-four percent of applicants were dependent students with family adjusted gross incomes ranging from \$0 to \$200,000 or more as shown in Figure 1. The remaining 36 percent of applicants were independent students. Independent students display a smaller range of family adjusted gross incomes with 75 percent of independent students reporting incomes less than \$35,000.

FY2015 State Grant Applicants




Independent students had lower median family incomes (\$22,000) across all types of institutions as compared to dependent students. Independent students enrolled at the University of Minnesota had the lowest median family income of \$15,600 (Table 1, Figure 2). Dependent students enrolled in private forprofit institutions had lower median family incomes (\$41,900) than of those enrolled in private non-profit institutions (\$88,500) or the University of Minnesota (\$88,700) (Figure 2, Table 1).

As family income increases, the percent of students enrolled in public or private two-year institutions declines. In contrast, as income increases more students enrolled in private four-year institutions and the University of Minnesota. The University of Minnesota had the highest median family adjusted gross income (\$83,000) among Minnesota postsecondary sectors (Table 2).

Among 2015 applicants from families with incomes below \$20,000, 62 percent enrolled in a MnSCU state college and 11 percent enrolled at a private for-profit institution (Figure 3). Among students from families with incomes above \$100,000, 28 percent enrolled in the University of Minnesota and 29 percent enrolled at a private non-profit institution.


This comparison highlights the potential economic stratification in enrollment among Minnesota students if state policy is intentionally or unintentionally directing lower income students to primarily low-cost public community and technical colleges regardless of the student's academic aspirations or abilities. Given that the State Grant program provides funds to lower- and middle-income students to attend the institution of their choosing, one could conclude that economic stratification in enrollment would have been worse had the program not existed.

Among all state grant applicants, students from families with incomes below \$20,000 comprised 30 percent of applicants enrolled in MnSCU state colleges, a higher percentage than MnSCU four-year universities (16 percent), the University of Minnesota (13 percent) and private non-profit institutions (12 percent). Only private for-profit institutions had a comparable percentage of lower income students enrolled (38 percent) (Figure 4).

The Minnesota State Grant is based solely on financial need. However, students must continue to make satisfactory academic progress in their degree or certificate programs in order to continue to receive the award. During Fiscal Year 2015, \$177 million in State Grants were awarded to 95,324 students.

Received by State Grant Recipients, Fiscal Year 2015




Family Adjusted Gross Income

Minnesota State Grant awards are targeted to students and families with lower incomes. Figure 5 illustrates the income distribution of the Fiscal Year 2015 grant recipients. Fifty-one percent of students reported annual family adjusted gross incomes of less than \$30,000. Of the \$177 million in Minnesota State Grants awarded in Fiscal Year 2015, \$24 million was awarded to students from families earning less than \$10,000, as shown in Figure 6.

Received by State Grant Recipients, Fiscal Year 2015






Calculations for the Minnesota State Grant take into account the student's Federal Pell Grant award. Figure 7 shows the average combined award for the Federal Pell Grant and the Minnesota State Grant by income. Students from families earning less than \$10,000 annually received the highest combined average award (\$5,380). Figure 8 displays the average combined award for the Federal Pell Grant and the Minnesota State Grant by income and full-time/part-time enrollment status. Full-time enrollment is defined as enrolled for 30 credits or more for the academic year.



For the 2013-2014 academic year, Minnesota's State Grant program was the 17th largest in the nation for total grant aid awarded according to the annual survey of National Association of State Student Grant & Aid Programs (2015); 9<sup>th</sup> when only need-based grant aid is considered.


The state grant spending per full-time equivalent (FTE) undergraduate also places Minnesota 16<sup>th</sup> among states. Minnesota spends an average of \$712 per FTE undergraduate as compared to South Carolina (\$1,888) according to the annual survey of National Association of State Student Grant & Aid Programs (2015) as shown in Figure 10.



## **Postsecondary Institution Choice**

The institutions students choose to attend determine the price of attendance used in calculating each student's Minnesota State Grant award. Institutions are grouped into five categories for this report:

- Minnesota State Colleges two-year colleges
- Minnesota State Universities four-year universities
- University of Minnesota
- Minnesota private non-profit institutions
- Minnesota private for-profit institutions

Tribal colleges operated by entities other than Minnesota State Colleges and Universities are included in the "private non-profit" category for reporting purposes.



Under the current model, the percent of recipients receiving a Minnesota State Grant will rarely equal the percent of State Grant dollars by type of institution attended. State Grant awards are based on the average tuition and fees charged to a student or the tuition and fee maximums established in law. Students receive a State Grant in proportion to the tuition and fees charged. Students with lower average tuition and fee charges will receive a smaller percentage of total State Grant funds (e.g. MnSCU two-year colleges). Students with higher average tuition and fee charges will receive a greater percentage of total State Grant funds (e.g. University of Minnesota). The maximum tuition and fees allowed for two-year programs is significantly lower (\$5,808) than the maximum tuition and fees allowed for four-year programs (\$13,000). Students enrolled at institutions with a higher percentage of full-time students tend to receive a higher percentage of total State Grant funds as compared to other institutions.

The profile of students enrolling by institution type varies. The majority of grant recipients enrolling at MnSCU four-year institutions, the University of Minnesota and private not-for-profit institutions are dependent students as shown in figure 13.

## **Dependency Status/Family Circumstances**

Recipients are classified by family circumstances. The ability to pay is assessed differently for each family category in the State Grant award formula. Family categories are:

- Dependent students (usually students less than 24 years old who were not married and not supporting their own children; not veterans/military service members)
- Married independent students with dependents (usually children)
- Unmarried independent students with dependents
- Married independent students with no dependents other than a spouse
- Unmarried independent students with no dependents

## **Registration Load**

The registration load or number of course credits chosen by the student affects the price of attendance used in calculating Minnesota State Grant awards. The Minnesota State Grant program defines full-time attendance as a registration load of 15 credits per term or the equivalent. Average registration load varies by income and family status for State Grant recipients. Dependent students register for more credits annually on average (24.90) than independent students (18.57-20.04). Recipients from families with an adjusted gross income of \$100,000 or more register for more credits annually on average (27.16) than lower income recipients as shown in Table 6. When family circumstances are analyzed, dependent students register for more credits annually on average (24.90) than independent students as shown in Table 7.

For the Minnesota State Grant program, the state Fiscal Year begins on July 1 and ends on June 30. Summer I terms are the first term of the Fiscal Year. Summer II terms are the last term of the Fiscal Year.

Table 9 displays the number of recipients by the number of credits enrolled per term as follows:

- Full-Time, Full-Year: Recipients who registered for 15 or more credits during both fall and spring terms if semester-based calendar is used; 15 or more credits during fall, winter and spring terms if quarter-based calendar is used.
- Full-Time, Part-Year: Recipients who registered for 15 or more credits during either fall and spring terms if semester-based calendar is used; 15 or more credits during either fall, winter or spring terms if quarter-based calendar is used AND the student did not register or registered for fewer than 15 credits for the other terms.
- Part-Time, Full-Year: Recipients who registered for fewer than 15 credits during both fall and spring terms if semester-based calendar is used; fewer than 15 credits during fall, winter and spring terms if quarter-based calendar is used.
- Part-Time, Part-Year: Recipients who registered for fewer than 15 credits during either fall and spring terms if semester-based calendar is used; fewer than 15 credits during either fall, winter or spring terms if quarter-based calendar is used AND the student did not register for at least one of the other terms.
- Summer only: Recipients who registered at any level for either summer term and did not register in fall, winter or spring terms.

Approximately 24 percent of all State Grant recipients are enrolled full-time for fall and spring semesters (or the equivalent quarter terms). An additional twenty-three percent of recipients registered for 15 or more credits in either fall or spring term. Fifty-one percent of recipients were enrolled for less than 15 credits. An additional two percent of recipients enrolled in summer term only.

## Minnesota Dream Act

In May 2013, the Minnesota Dream Act (officially titled in Minnesota law as the Prosperity Act) was passed by the state legislature and signed into law by Governor Dayton. Undocumented students meeting the criteria in the Minnesota Dream Act are now eligible for in-state tuition rates, privately funded financial aid administered by Minnesota public colleges and universities and can apply for state financial aid. Minnesota students granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) may also be eligible for these benefits.

The Minnesota Dream Act provides certain benefits to undocumented students who meet the following criteria:

- Attended a Minnesota high school for at least 3 years; and
- Graduated from a Minnesota high school or earned a GED in Minnesota; and
- Registered with the U.S. Selective Service (applies only to males 18 to 25 years old); and
- Provide documentation to show they have applied for lawful immigration status but only if a federal process exists for a student to do so (does not include applying for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). Currently, no federal process exists, so this documentation is not currently required.

Students who meet this criteria in the Minnesota Dream Act are eligible for the following postsecondary education benefits:

- In-state resident tuition rates at public colleges and universities.
- State financial aid available to students who meet state residency requirements.
- Privately funded financial aid through public colleges and universities.

During the Fiscal Year 2015, a total of 370 students received State Grants pursuant to the Minnesota Dream Act, as shown in Table 13.
