The data source for this report is the Statewide Integrated Financial Tools (SWIFT) system. Purchases in SWIFT are categorized by the purchasers into one of more than 50,000 possible commodity codes (UNSPSC codes). A review of the SWIFT data has revealed issues with incorrectly coded purchases.

The Office of State Procurement (OSP) analyzed over 11,000 line items with relevant commodity codes in an attempt to improve the accuracy of this report. Items which were clearly miscoded or inapplicable were removed, as were items showing government entities as the vendor. The numbers in this report should be considered the Department of Administration's best estimate.

\*This data excludes services performed for MnDOT by Greenview Inc., a company which provides "employment of needy, elderly persons" pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 160.282. A decrease in spending on janitorial services compared to recent years was due in large part to a lack of federal funding for services in the Department of Military Affairs.

<sup>\*\*</sup> The unknown expenditure on mailing, collating, and sorting services is a result of the UNSPSC code being broad and including many functions that are not related to the services provided by DEED/DHS certified providers. The code fails to distinguish between mail services, shipping, postage, etc. and the tasks that DEED/DHS certified providers perform. As a result, the spending is hidden within the other tasks under the UNSPSC code.
