Subject: Revision #2 to Governor's 2016 Supplemental Budget – Clean Water Fund

The purpose of this memo is to officially transmit an update to the Governor's 2016 supplemental budget recommendations, originally released on March 15, 2016 and revised on March 30, 2016. The changes submitted today incorporate expenditure changes in the Clean Water fund.

The 2016 February *Budget and Economic Forecast* consolidated fund statement identified a projected deficit of \$960,000 in the Clean Water fund in fiscal year 2017. On April 1, 2016, under the authority in Minnesota Statutes 16A.152, subd. 4 (c), I took administrative action to cancel \$1,000,000 of unencumbered balances to resolve the projected deficit and leave a remaining balance of \$40,000 in fiscal year 2017.

The recommendations conveyed today will reallocate past clean water fund appropriations to support \$2,500,000 to the Department of Agriculture for the Minnesota agricultural water quality certification program and \$1,000,000 to the Pollution Control Agency for the development of watershed restoration and protection strategies and statewide monitoring and assessment.

Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program

The Governor recommends funding to maintain statewide implementation of the Minnesota Agricultural Water Quality Certification Program, which increases adoption of on-farm conservation practices to protect water quality through a voluntary approach. This program coordinates existing conservation programs and local partners to recognize and reward producers that manage their farms in a way that protects and enhances water quality. Funds will leverage additional federal dollars.

Watershed Restoration and Protection Strategies (WRAPS) and Statewide Monitoring

The Governor recommends funding to complete Watershed Restoration and Protection Strategies (WRAPS), including grants to local partners, and surface water monitoring and assessment activities. WRAPS are developed with local partners to set strategies for impaired-and unimpaired waters by setting reduction and protection goals, milestones and measures to guide state and local government implementation efforts.

Nonpoint Source Restoration and Protection Activities

The Governor recommends cancelling the remaining balance of the financial assistance grants, which are grants to local units of government for projects such as protection and restoration of surface water and drinking water and protection, enhancement, and restoration of water quality. Cancelled funds include \$251,000 from Laws 2011, First Special Session from returned grant awards and \$72,000 from Laws 2013 that is not needed in the current year.
