

# H.F. no. 1 Article 6 sec. 11 (165.16), 2015

Information Technology Certification Partnership:  
Final Report 2016-2017  
July 2017

In 2015, the Minnesota State Legislature passed H.F. no. 1 Article 6 sec. 11 (165.16) to address the growing skills gap within the State STEM and IT fields. Funds were allocated to the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) to provide IT Certification programs to schools throughout the state in order stimulate student interest in the STEM and IT fields. In January 2016 MDE contracted Mouse, Inc. “to deliver a technology curriculum and online learning platform for high school students in Minnesota.” The Contract was between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), 1500 Highway 36 West, Roseville, MN 55113-4266 (“State”) and Mouse, Inc., whose designated business address is 55 Broad Street, 16th Floor, New York, NY 10004 (“Contractor”). 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## Overview of Deliverables

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According to the contract, which spans from January 2016 to June 2017:

*The Contractor, who is not a State employee, will:*

- A. Provide Recruitment and Onboarding for eligible schools and school districts: January 2016 through October 2016
- B. Provide professional development and training to all teachers.
- C. Provide online access to curriculum and any instructional software needed for all enrolled schools.
- D. Online Certification: Contractor shall use its reasonable efforts to require site Coordinators to facilitate the Mouse Squad curriculum as required to complete the certification.
- E. Provide deployment and program support.
- F. Provide State through reasonable efforts with requested data as needed.
- G. Certify students have met informational technology skills and competencies that are recognized by industry.
- H. Build sustainability for programs to continue beyond terms of the contract.
- I. Enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with each school to formalize the membership of the program for each school district.
- J. Provide a final report on effectiveness of the contract no later than June 1, 2017 to allow for review and approval of MDE.

The following report highlights efforts made by Mouse, Inc. to recruit schools, provide Professional Development and training for educators, and implement its curriculum and online learning platform into Minnesota schools from January 2016 through June 2017.

## Program Description

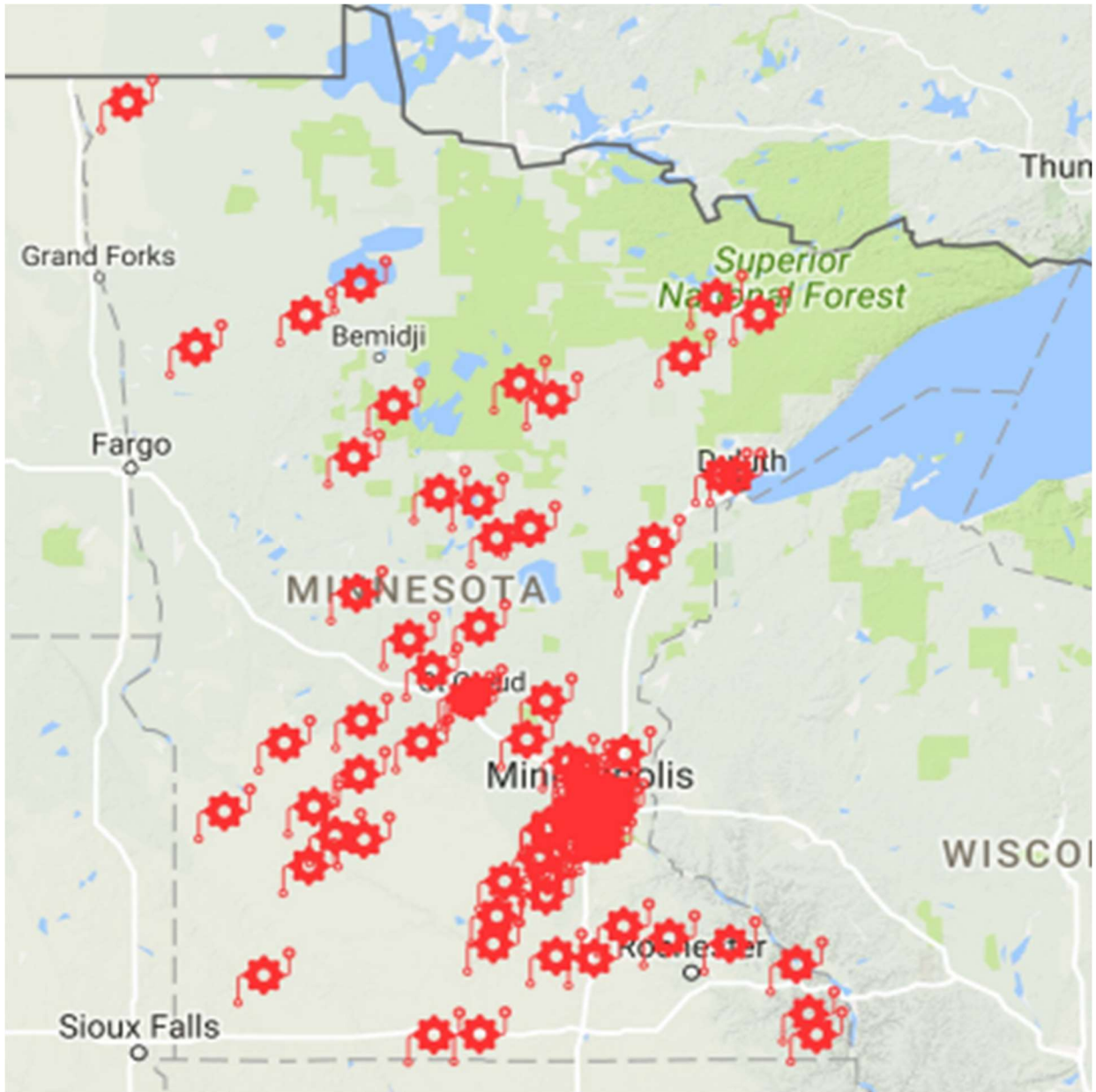
[Mouse](#) is a national educational nonprofit that offers a variety of project-based activities in the STEAM model (STEM + Art: emphasizing creativity within science and technology), all delivered via step-by-step instructions on an online learning platform. These activities are integrated into a badging certification system shareable on the Common App, LinkedIn, and several other websites. Member schools receive unlimited access to Mouse educational content, plus support and training from Mouse staff.

Mouse began recruiting schools through its contract with MDE in January 2016. Active recruitment was suspended in January 2017 due to the upcoming end of the contract on June 30, 2017. The uncertainty regarding sustainability of continued delivery of services. As of the end of this contract, 98 Minnesota schools had signed up for Mouse.

Contractual conditions stipulated that no more than half of the schools served be within the seven county Twin Cities metro area. As such, Mouse focused recruitment efforts on greater Minnesota. Of the 98 schools recruited, 38 are in the Twin Cities metro and 60 are in greater Minnesota (see below).

Minnesota high schools utilized Mouse's educational content in a variety of ways. Typically, educators integrated Mouse projects into existing classes, especially those covering business, computer science, engineering, and technology. However, some schools used Mouse as the basis for an after school, independent study, or club program. Some schools proceeded with broad implementation across multiple subject areas while others focused narrowly on one or two courses. "Coding," which teaches the fundamentals of programming languages, and "Tech Team," which facilitates the creation of a student-led school IT help desk, were especially popular.

In just over a year's time, Mouse has trained 166 educators and reached an estimated 1,000 students who collectively earned 130 certifications and submitted sufficient evidence of completion for 2,957 modules.



Mouse member schools spanned the length of the state, with 38 schools in the Twin Cities metro and 60 in greater Minnesota.

## **Outcomes and Recommendations**

Mouse has worked hard to bring engaging, project-driven IT training to students in Minnesota. The response from Minnesota educators using our online learning platform has been overwhelmingly positive. A Belgrade-Brooten-Elrosa Secondary wrote us to say: “We are excited to have this in place... I have been sharing with others and hoping to continue to grow with Mouse!” An AFSA High School teacher told us: “My students have been loving the activities. Thank you so much for providing this curriculum for them.” A Renville County West Senior High teacher stated: “The kids enjoy the projects which is great!” Mouse has seen growing local excitement in Minnesota and is proud of our efforts.

That said, the timeframe of Mouse’s contract with MDE presented significant challenges. Schools and educators plan curriculum well in advance of the school year, and it was difficult for many to implement Mouse’s educational content on short notice. Schools have expressed that they needed more time to fully integrate our projects into their classrooms. For example, a Fairmont Senior High teacher explained that he had difficulty implementing Mouse because he was “in need of catching up on training and certification.” A Red Lake Secondary teacher said that he didn’t have time to integrate Mouse into his computer design class for the 2016-2017 school year, but: “I intend to use (Mouse’s) program in that class next time I offer it.” Many schools signed up in the fall or even early spring and have just gotten started using Mouse’s educational content. A few, such as Anoka High School and Henry Sibley High School, have used access to our online learning platform to plan for implementation during the 2017-2018 school year. A handful of schools stated they would be interested in using Mouse at a later date but at the moment were either too overwhelmed or too understaffed. A Jordan Secondary school teacher reported in January 2017: “We have not used (Mouse) yet. Our tech teacher... is swamped and has not had a chance to dig into it.” A teacher at Hiawatha Collegiate High School similarly reported that “my science team just hasn’t had the capacity” to offer Mouse courses “this year.” Others cited concerns over the short length and uncertainty of our current contract, and were hesitant to devote time and effort to educational materials they weren’t sure would be available in future years. Beyond recruiting and implementation, one and a half years is not enough time to fully evaluate educational outcomes. For future educational initiatives, Mouse recommends a minimum five-year funding allocation: one to establish a program and four to carry out/evaluate said program.

Mouse and its member schools were disappointed to hear that IT certification funding would not continue beyond 2017. Despite this outcome, Mouse is committed to Minnesota educators and students. We have offered complimentary memberships to fifty Minnesota schools who have demonstrated high engagement and/or a pressing need for IT & STEM education. This model is not sustainable beyond the 2017-2018 school year, but Mouse hopes that complimentary memberships will bridge the gap between school funding cycles and allow administrators to

include a Mouse membership in future budget planning.

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## Mouse, Inc. IT Certification in Minnesota Schools for High School Students Overview and Accomplishments

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The following table highlights the efforts and accomplishments made by Mouse, Inc. to address the ten areas that were laid out in the contract between MDE and Mouse, Inc. as the expected deliverables of the contractor. The table details the progress made towards these deliverables from January 2016 through June 2017.

### Deliverable A

#### Actions/Activities:

1. As of June 2017, 98 Minnesota schools are active Mouse member schools under the MDE contract and have been granted access to the curriculum and online platform.
2. Mouse has offered in-person sessions or video chat sessions for training/onboarding to all member schools on multiple occasions, but only some have taken advantage of the opportunity. Training was provided to 49 sites and 166 educators. Mouse Create also offers 3 online courses for coordinators.

4. AEC, our formal evaluator that we partner with, conducted evaluative surveys in April and May of 2017. The results of this evaluation will be made available to MDE by August of 2017.

An email was sent out to all eligible schools in December of 2015 introducing the partnership between MDE and Mouse. The email explained Mouse's mission, the curriculum and online platform that schools would gain access to, the help desk, and what students would achieve through participating in the program. The emphasis was on helping students develop essential technology and professional skills that would better prepare them for a STEM career.

- i. Another email went out in March of 2016, which emphasized Mouse’s Green Tech content as a way to design a school Mouse Squad. Highlighted was the Mouse emphasis on projects for social change and student-led betterment of schools, communities, and the world.

## Deliverable B

### Contractor Duties

### Actions/Activities

2. Mouse offered in-person or video chat on-boarding sessions for training/onboarding to all member schools. The offer was made to all current member schools on multiple occasions, but only some took advantage of the opportunity. By the end of the contract, we trained/onboarded 49 sites within the MDE contract.

3. On average, a total of 15-20 emails are exchanged with Minnesota member schools per week, which provides an opportunity to continue training educators as they begin using the content and platform.
4. With the launch of a new online learning platform, Mouse Create, training was introduced in the Fall of 2016 to demo learning activities, provide pedagogical recommendations, and discusses possible methods of implementation for educators. To date Mouse has trained 166 educators within the MDE contract.

Mouse Create launched in early September 2016. All member schools were given their access codes to begin creating accounts and forming student groups to begin work on the curriculum and badges.

#### Deliverable D

##### *Contractor Duties:*

*D. Online Certification: Contractor shall use its reasonable efforts to require site Coordinators to facilitate the Mouse Squad curriculum as required to complete the Certification.*

##### *Actions/Activities:*

Under the launch of Mouse Create, students were able to complete courses in 24 STEM areas. Educators can select among the projects within each course to create custom playlists that meet their learning goals or choose from pre-created courses.

Within each course, students could earn digital certification badges recognized by employers, K-12 stakeholders, and universities. Mouse educators review student project submissions and determine demonstrable skills for students to earn each badge.

Deliverable E

*Contractor Duties:*

- E. Provide deployment and program support including, but not limited to:*
- 1. All accessibility requirements shall comply with Section 508 and WCAG (Web Content Accessibility Guidelines) 2.0 - Level AA with a check in on October 31, 2016, December 15, 2016 and January 30, 2017.*
  - 2. Minimum of 20 monthly communications with enrolled schools.*
  - 3. Develop a calendar for following up with enrolled schools.*
  - 4. Call/email each school through regularly scheduled check-in times.*
  - 5. Handle 100% of issues, complaints and inquiries within a business day of receiving the response.*

Actions/Activities:

1. Throughout this contract, Mouse has worked to update its content to align with the 508 and WCAG standards.
2. On average 60-80 check-in emails are sent to member schools per month. Most are focused on guiding schools through program implementation and the use of Mouse Create. Other subjects include educator feedback on projects, updates on student learning, and learning event coordination. Not all schools are communicative, but Mouse has made consistent efforts to ensure open lines of communication.
3. Following recruitment outreach, once a school expressed interest, Mouse proceeded as follows to enroll schools, onboard, and continue communication and support:
  - a. School participated in-person or remote info-session (ideally), or at least an exchange of information via e-mail.
  - b. School signs-up.
  - c. "Welcome to Mouse" e-mail is sent with basic sign-up and navigation instructions: a basic "how-to guide;" Resource kit is sent to school.
  - d. Personal offer to train educators at the school to use Mouse Create, either remotely or in-person. Note: some in-person training events have occurred in locations away from the metro area. All member schools in the region received personal invitations to attend in-person events.
  - e. Continual e-mail support is provided. Some schools take advantage of this more than others, and for most schools support requests come in waves (i.e. a dozen e-mails from a school may be responded to in a two-day period, and then nothing for months).

6. The Mouse Learning Design Team has worked to align Mouse content with Minnesota state educational standards. When training Minnesota member schools, our Learning Network Manager informed educators about available resources that mapped out adherence to these standards.

2. 166 educators have been trained through Mouse training/onboarding sessions
3. Roughly 857 students have been enrolled so far. However, some schools have elected to use Mouse Create without formally enrolling students. We estimate the actual number of students involved in Mouse in Minnesota to be closer to 1,000.
4. Total number of certifications earned 130. Students submitted 2,957 pieces of evidence of module completion, making them eligible to earn badges. Teachers need to verify evidence submitted and award the badges to students.

Locally, Mouse has met with (among others) 3M, Advance IT Minnesota, Best Buy, the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry, the Minnesota High Tech Association, Thompson Reuters, and the University of Minnesota in an effort to increase awareness of the value of Mouse badging certifications. Best Buy has been especially supportive and recognizes Mouse badges when evaluating potential employees.

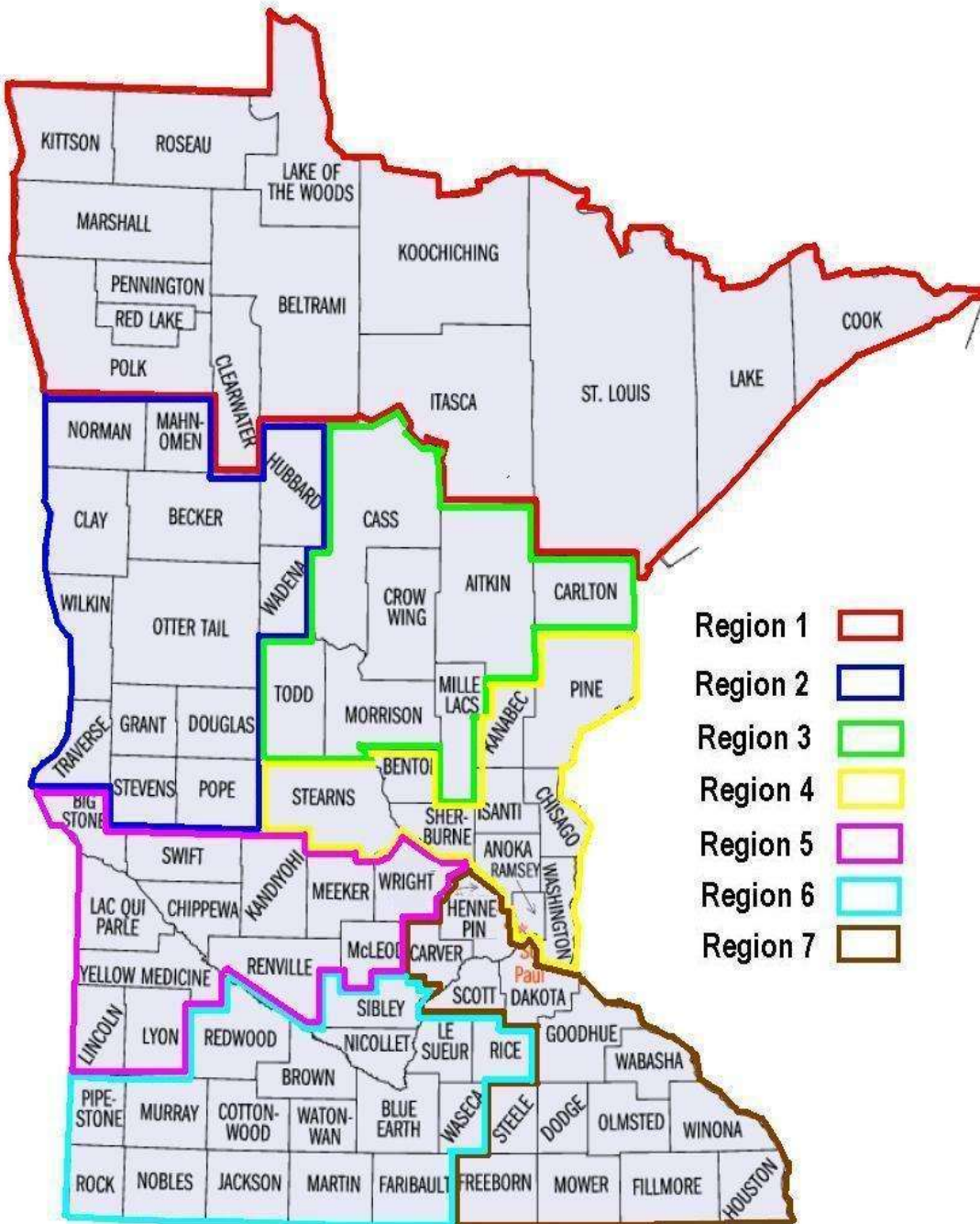
All schools received general email outreach providing information about the partnership between MDE and Mouse, what Mouse was and what it would provide to schools, and invitations to Info Sessions through the summer of 2016.

A new round of recruitment, beyond initial emails to all schools, began individual school outreach. During the Spring of 2016, all schools received personal emails to appropriate representatives, in which the Mouse Minnesota Learning Network Manager offered to come out to all schools throughout Greater Minnesota. Beginning in the fall of 2016, phone calls to school administrators were made, inviting schools in the Metro region to in-person informational meetings with our Minnesota-based Learning Network Manager, or Info Sessions for those in Greater Minnesota.

In addition, once schools became member schools each was offered in-person training/onboarding sessions. All member schools were given multiple offers for onboarding/training sessions.
