

Vision Statement Development Primary Takeaway's:

- Addressing racial equity has to be at the forefront.
 - Redesign the system with equity at the center. The current system is built primarily for white children and families. Simply working to improve the current system will not produce real equitable outcomes.
 - We need to stop using the language of 'all children'. There are specific children that desperately need our attention.
- We've been sitting in these meetings for so many years, and nothing has changed.
- The vision is already out there. We are here to make that vision a reality and see change.
- Hope. Communities are losing hope. Regaining it starts with economic stability and sustainability.
- Equal accessibility to programs and services for all families and children.
- Intergenerational wealth starts with investing in children.
- Strengths-based approach to multicultural integration into systems.
- The current systems penalize people for needing help. We make children and families do all the work. We need to go to families and keep the systems accountable.
- Minnesota needs to step out of its focus on policy and statutes. We need to work with communities for implementation of equitable, multicultural systems.
- We can't play the game of politics anymore. We need to stop making recommendations for policy, and start making demands, and we need to follow up on those demands.
- The leadership needs to be in the room, listening, for this to be worth our time.
- We are here and willing to work for reform. We take the word 'reform' seriously as a promise for change and hope.
