

STATE of MINNESOTA

WHEREAS:	In 2010, the State of Minnesota set several statutory goals around broadband, including that every household and business in the state should have access to broadband service by the end of 2015, and that Minnesota become a national leader in broadband availability and use; and
WHEREAS:	Only 63 percent of Greater Minnesota households have access to high-quality, affordable broadband with cost barriers blocking further expansion; and
WHEREAS:	At least 221,000 rural Minnesota households lack access to broadband meeting the state's 10 Mbps download/5 Mbps upload speed goals; and
WHEREAS:	Broadband access is essential to business growth and unleashing the next generation of Minnesota entrepreneurs, ensuring all students get great educations, and that patients have access to quality care; and
WHEREAS:	A better understanding by policy-makers, community leaders, and broadband providers of how this basic service impacts rural life will lead to better and more informed decision-making about broadband-related issues; and
WHEREAS:	On August 4th, 2015, FarmFest has devoted the day to learning about how broadband affects the ability to operate a farm, run a business, receive an education, access healthcare, engage with government, and conduct family and personal business.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, August 4, 2015, as:

RURAL BROADBAND DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
