- WHEREAS: Sid Hartman is a legendary broadcaster and sports columnist and has been keeping sports fans throughout Minnesota and the nation informed and entertained for the last six decades; and
- WHEREAS: Sid Hartman was born on March 15, 1920, and was raised in North Minneapolis; and
- WHEREAS: Sid Hartman began delivering newspapers for the Minneapolis Tribune in his teens, wrote his first column for the Minneapolis Daily Times in 1945, and continues to write for the Minneapolis Star Tribune; and
- WHEREAS: In 1947, Sid Hartman became the acting General Manager of the Minneapolis Lakers, winning five titles in six seasons, and helped build the team into what would become the first NBA dynasty; and
- WHEREAS: Sid Hartman joined the staff of WCCO Radio in 1955, and continues to be a popular personality on the Sunday morning radio program "Sports Huddle With Sid and Dave"; and
- WHEREAS: Today, we honor Sid Hartman as a Minnesota sports legend, and celebrate his contributions to sports, broadcasting, and print media in the Twin Cities, the State of Minnesota, and the nation.
