Proclamation

WHEREAS: Minnesota is regarded as one of the healthiest states in the nation, yet has some of the largest health disparities

for people of color, people living in rural areas, low-income households, people who identify as lesbian, gay,

bisexual, transgender, or queer (LGBTQ), and members of other marginalized communities; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota physicians recognize that factors such as health care financing, non-diverse health care workforces,

living wages, housing, and public transportation impact health equity; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota physicians further recognize that racial and ethnic health disparities also are a consequence of the

structural and institutional racism that exists in our hospitals and health care systems; and

WHEREAS: Racism can impact health both directly and indirectly, leading to adverse effects in both mental and physical

health incomes; and

WHEREAS: African American and American Indian babies die in the first year of life at twice the rate of white babies;

African American and Hispanic/Latino women are more likely to be diagnosed with late-stage breast cancer; and students who identify as LGBTQ are more likely than their heterosexual peers to be bullied and commit suicide—statistics that represent a fraction of the health disparities faced by some of Minnesota's most

vulnerable communities; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota recognizes the need to address and close gaps in health disparities in order to lower long-term costs

and improve quality for all; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota physicians believe that everyone should have an equal opportunity to achieve optimal health and

will continue to advocate for health equity on behalf of all patients; and
