Proclamation

WHEREAS: The health and safety of all Minnesotans is important to the happiness, prosperity, and

well-being of families and communities across the state; and

WHEREAS: In 2017, almost 12,820 people were diagnosed with cervical cancer nationwide, and 4,210

died from the disease; and

WHEREAS: Regular cervical cancer screening tests are an effective way to detect the disease early,

when it can still be successfully treated; and

WHEREAS: Cervical cancer vaccines are now widely available, and combined with regular

screenings, provide an effective means of preventing the disease; and

WHEREAS: The number of cases and deaths from cervical cancer decreased significantly in the past

40 years; and

WHEREAS: Increasing awareness of prevention and detection techniques among patients and health

care providers is a key component in safeguarding cervical health; and

WHEREAS Throughout the month of January, organizations and healthcare practitioners are

encouraged to promote awareness about cervical cancer and to support patients who are currently battling cervical cancer and those who have lost loved ones to the disease.
